#### NOTES:

- a. 3230:150 and 3240:100 are departmental requirements and complete the General Education Social Science Requirement.
- b. Completion of the second year of a foreign language or sign language is required. See your adviser for placement.
- c. 3230:151 is a departmental requirement and completes part of the General Natural Science Requirement for 4 credit hours with a lab.
- d. 3230:251 is an elective in the cultural concentration area. It is also an option for the General Education Area Studies & Cultural Diversity requirement. (See back of guide.)
- e. Interdisciplinary Anthropology requires that a student select courses from three areas at the Concentration level. A student is urged to plan the course of study to concentrate in two of the four major fields in Anthropology: Archaeological, Biological, Cultural and Classical Studies. See back of guide for further details.
- f. 3200:361 is a requirement for the Classical Studies concentration area and is an option for General Education Humanities requirement.

**ANTHROPOLOGY:** The course of study is multi-disciplined and prepares majors for diverse types of employment and/or graduate school. This degree facilitates a student who wants a double major, and provides exceptional background and tools for use in the modern global world.

**FURTHER INFORMATION:** A more detailed curriculum guide, one explaining the four-year programs in total, is available in the Department of Classical Studies, Anthropology, & Archaeology.

**TRANSFER TO COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCES:** A student should apply to this program upon completion of 30 credits with a 2.0 or better overall GPA (including transfer coursework). In addition, the student must have achieved a 2.0 in all coursework in the major field (including transfer work). The 30 credits must include the completion of both required English Composition courses and 3 credits of mathematics or statistics which meets the General Education requirements. This transfer process is completed through an appointment with an academic adviser, the Academic Advisement Center, Simmons 205, 972-7430, or Summit College, Polsky 301, (330) 972-7220, depending upon the college in which you reside.

**COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCES:** Degree requirements in Arts & Sciences include the first and second year of a foreign language and 47 credits of 300/400 level courses, not including workshops, Humanities in the Western Tradition or Area Studies and Cultural Diversity (World Civ) requirements.

**COOPERATIVE EDUCATION:** Co-op is available on an optional basis in this academic program.
