All students at The University of Akron receive individual academic advising from the Academic Advisement Center. Your adviser can provide information about all areas of study and aid you in selection of courses that will meet your needs and interests.

Counseling, Testing, & Career Center: (330) 972-7082 Simmons Hall 306

Career counseling, as well as interest and aptitude testing, is available through our Counseling, Testing & Career Center. Career Planning can be arranged on an individual or group basis by appointment. The department also offers career exploration tools such as SIGI and OCIS.

Career Planning Course - 1100:117 - 2 elective credits

For those students wishing an in-depth, systematic approach to career planning, this course is recommended. Topics presented include blockages to the career planning process, self information assessment (interests, skills, personality, values, etc.), exploration of careers consistent with your self information, decision making, and job search skills.

Visit the Center early in your college career to discuss current trends in employment. By becoming familiar with their services early in your college career you will enjoy a smooth transition from college to career after graduating.
