Internship Information

The Department of Economics encourages students who have completed at least their sophomore year to consider internships as a way to complement their coursework at UA. Internships offer students a bridge to professional employment upon graduation and provide the Department with feedback on the relevancy of the curriculum in the workplace.

Students can receive one to three academic credits (3250: 495 –Internship in Economics) for the semester. Normally, a minimum of 45 hours of relevant internship work is expected for each academic credit. Total internship credit over all semesters may not exceed 3 credits and can count towards the economics course requirement for both the BA and BSLE degrees as well as the 300-400 level 47-hour credit requirement of the College of Arts and Sciences.

The internship will be coordinated through the Arts and Sciences Careers Program and must be approved by the Department of Economics Undergraduate Program Director prior to registering for the course. The internship must involve career applications of the student's graduate coursework in economics.

The Washington Center will offer an exciting program with the **Federal Aviation Administration** once again this summer. Selected students from a variety of majors will have the opportunity to intern for Department of Transportation Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) offices and participate in an experiential training program. Participants will gain relevant skills and knowledge, explore career options within the Department of Transportation and learn more about the role of the federal government. **Students with diverse backgrounds and those with disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply.**

Applicants must:

- be U.S. citizens.
- have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above.
- be enrolled in a degree-granting program with 60 or more credit hours completed.
- get approval from their campus liaison (if they come from an affiliated institution) or sponsor (if they come from an unaffiliated institution and will complete the full, for-credit program); contact The Washington Center for details.

Dates & Deadlines:

- All applications must be received by February 2, 2009 to be considered for the FAA.
- Interns will need to commit to 10-weeks at the agency, beginning in early June.

Compensation:

Graduate and undergraduate interns not seeking credit will receive fully-furnished housing while in DC as well as a substantial monthly stipend to offset personal costs. Students seeking credit are encouraged to contact The Washington Center for more information. Those who do not request Washington Center housing will have their

Application Procedures:

To apply for the FAA internship program, students should complete The Washington Center's application, available online at <https://secure.twc.edu/twc/default.jsp>. When prompted, students should select internship, then Option 2 for Government Scholarship Programs and choose Department of Transportation from the drop-down menu. The internship is targeted to rising seniors in economics and other social sciences who have interest in graduate studies. While at GSU, the interns work on a research project with a faculty mentor, they participate in seminars and roundtable discussions, and visit policy institutions in Atlanta. The goal is to familiarize them with a graduate studies environment, to help them decide on their future study plans, and to enhance their graduate school applications. The research projects are in a wide range of areas including international, fiscal, health, education, regional, urban, and environmental economics. Many of our past interns have gone to leading graduate programs such as the ones at the University of Chicago, Harvard, Minnesota, and Yale. The interns receive a \$3,300 stipend for the seven weeks of the program. The program is funded by the National Science Foundation and we've run it for ten years.
