



Tenure-Track Assistant Professor Position in Economics at The University of Akron

The University of Akron seeks a tenure-track Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics. The Department of Economics offers both a Bachelor's Degree and a Masters' Degree and is comprised of ten full-time and a number of part-time faculty. Candidates who will have completed their PhD degree in economics by August 24, 2009, will be eligible to be considered for the position. Preference will be given to applicants with a strong background in applied microeconomics and whose primary fields of expertise lie in one or more of the following areas: math modeling; urban, rural, and regional economics; game theory; health economics; industrial organization (regulation); and energy economics.

Applicants must show a record of excellence in teaching, evidence of high potential for significant research publishable in quality journals, and potential for success in achieving external funding. Teaching responsibilities will include introductory courses in economics, undergraduate and graduate courses in the candidate's area of expertise, and graduate courses in math models and microeconomic theory. Additional responsibilities include advising students, assisting in curriculum development, and participating in other departmental activities as assigned by the department chair.
