CURRENT STATUS

As a professor of management at The University of Akron my primary teaching responsibilities are in graduate education: Strategic Management as well as Leadership and Organizational Behavior. I also teach Business Policy, Behavior and Leadership and Management Principles at the undergraduate level and am involved in web-based graduate teaching.

While long active in college and departmental committees, I elected in the 1990s to become extensively involved in the University's "shared governance" process. As a past member of the Faculty Senate, the Budget Planning and Control Committee and the Shared Governance Council, I regularly participated in major policy and budgeting issues and was the most active faculty member on campus in major University committees. I chaired a highly active University Athletic Committee as well as the Salary-Equity Committee and Chaired the University Distinguished Professor Recommendation Committee which for the first time supported and approved three highly accomplished faculty members for DP status. It is rare at the University for more than one Distinguished Professorship to be granted in a single year.

More recently in the new millennium, I have chosen to refocus my energies on research; I have a number of promising manuscripts in progress and one that is targeted to a top journal later in the fall term. Also, I have been very active in corporate training in the areas of leadership, ethics and strategic thinking. Most of my current research efforts focus on frame breaking research in both Strategic Management and Corporate Social Responsibility/Business Ethics and leadership. Among CBA faculty, I remain the second most cited CBA scholar and possess more than **300 citations**. My CSR research has resulted in follow-up work in the form of more than two dozen dissertations throughout the USA and abroad. In the new millennium, I have had eleven refereed journal articles accepted, including a premier journal, **The Journal of Management Studies**. I am frequently involved with dissertations at both The University of Akron and Kent State University and have just finished working on a successfully defended dissertation at George Washington University in December 2005.

Teaching Ratings

Over the past several years, my teaching ratings consistently place me at or above both Department and College averages for overall effectiveness. The University administered student ratings for overall effectiveness have me average out at a **4.2** on a five point scale where 5.0 is high (versus 4.1 for Dept.). My scores for rigor are **4.3** (versus 4.1) while my scores for presentation and communication skills have me at a **4.5** (versus 4.3). My unofficial, on-line ratings for overall effectiveness (Rate My Professor) also evaluate me at a **4.2** (on a five point scale where 5 is high) which leaves me well ahead of CBA faculty.
