*Procedures for Obtaining a Master of  
Science in Technical Education  
(Teaching Option)*

- I. Obtain application and bulletin from Graduate School (Polsky Building 469) or [apply online](#) using the ApplyYourself Webcenter.
- II. Meet with assigned advisor:
  - Complete [Program Plan](#) with advisor
  - All field of specialization coursework must be approved by your advisor
  - Complete [Advancement to Candidacy](#) (Zook 207 or online) and apply for graduation (SAS 107) Deadlines are: September 15 for May graduation; February 15 for August graduation; May 15 for December graduation.
  - Take Master's Comprehensive Exam (Application in Zook 301 M or email [viv@uakron.edu](mailto:viv@uakron.edu)). Offered in October, March, or July or email [Master's Comprehensive study guide](#) available in Zook 301M or online.
- III. Complete Internship application.
- IV. Complete all remaining requirements as specified by your approved program plan and advisor.
- V. Graduate and receive degree.

NOTE: Limit of 6 hours of approved workshops.  
Limit of 10 hours of approved transfer credit.  
Transient credit must be approved in advance.
