ALONG WITH THE DEGREE AUDIT MODULE, UA INCORPORATED THE TRANSFER APPLICATION MODULE IN 1996. THE TRANSFER TABLES CONTAIN OVER 85,000 RULES FROM OVER 1800 INSTITUTIONS.

"RG" COURSE WORK

Please note that **DARS** looks at **RG** courses (currently registered courses) and treats them like they have fulfilled a requirement.

If a student did not pass a **RG** course or dropped the course, the audit will look different the next time it is run.

The requirement will revert back to a .

It is important to stress to students that as long as they are registered for a course DARS treats that course as fulfilling a requirement but the student must complete and pass the course.
