EASTON, Pa. A 73-year-old woman accused of killing her 84-year-old neighbor with a hammer went on trial for homicide yesterday after a judge refused to accept her guilty plea. Kathy MacClellan, a gaunt-looking woman with a shock of white hair, was charged with attacking Marguerite "Tuddy" Eyer with the claw end of a hammer on Feb. 7, 2005, in Hickory Hills, a mobile home community north of Bethlehem that is popular with retirees. Ms. Eyer died 13 minutes after being rushed to the emergency room; the coroner said she had been struck in the head 37 times.

Ms. MacClellan had earlier waived her right to a jury trial when prosecutors dropped their plan to seek the death penalty. She would have been one of the oldest defendants in modern times to stand trial on a capital murder charge.

Police investigators said they found Ms. Eyer's wallet, checkbook and other items in Ms. MacClellan's house and that Ms. MacClellan's face, hair and clothing were covered in Ms. Eyer's blood.

James Bicking, a neighbor who went to check on Ms. Eyer after she pushed her medical alert button, said that he saw Ms. MacClellan, covered in blood, coming out of Ms. Eyer's house. He went inside and found Ms. Eyer lying in a pool of blood. He said Ms. Eyer told him, "Kathy hit me with a hammer." Another neighbor, Dale Hartzell, got to Ms. Eyer's house a few minutes later. He said Ms. MacClellan told him, "I didn't do nothing."

Ms. MacClellan allegedly told police that she went to Ms. Eyer's house with cookies and a photo album and found her on the floor in a pool of blood. She said she got on top of Ms. Eyer and moved her arm around because she thought that would comfort her, and got Ms. Eyer's blood on her, according to police testimony. Prosecutors did not discuss a motive for the slaying.

Questions:

1. What type of direct evidence is there? Circumstantial evidence?
2. What is the likely testimonial evidence? Physical Evidence?
3. Who are the likely witnesses? What evidence will prosecution introduce through which witness?
4. Assume there are gruesome pictures of the decedent. Should they be admissible?
5. Are there problems admitting any of the statements? (based only on the readings)
6. Should the rules governing evidence be different for fact witnesses than specialized witnesses, such as the coroner or a police officer? If so, how?
7. Should the defense request a limiting instruction?
8. Should the prosecution be able to call defendant MacClellan as a witness?
