PSLawNet

This is undoubtedly the best source for graduates seeking public interest work. It consists of three databases: "Opportunities," "U.S. Organizations," and "Non U.S. Organizations." The website is located at www.pslawnet.org.

NALP Directory.com

The new online NALP Directory of Legal Employers is fully searchable, free to all users, and available for student use 24/7 from any computer. This gives graduates a fully searchable look at salaries for summer clerks.

Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory

A trip to martindale.com is essential simply because it is the largest database of private employers. In addition, their lawyer Locator system allows searches by geographic area, practice area, law school, lawyer name, and firm size.
