## Surprising Originalism Prof. Lawrence Solum

Georgetown Law School



Many judges, lawyers, legal scholars, and law students assume that they already know everything that is about important "originalism." But they may be in for some surprises. The nature of originalism itself has changed. Even law professors may not know that the doctrine of "original intent" was abandoned by almost all originalists more than thirty years ago. Another common assumption about originalism is that it inevitably leads to "conservative" results, perhaps because it is part of a right-wing ideology. Surprisingly, originalism frequently produces results that are progressive on topics where the dominant living-constitutionalist approach has produced outcomes that are frequently associated with conservatism. "Surprising Originalism" is about the ways in which contemporary originalist constitutional theory diverges from widely held preconceptions.
