Professor Paul Goldstein will visit The University of Akron School of Law on Thursday, April 12, 2007, to present a lecture on “The Silent Revolution in Copyright Law.” He will speak in the C. Blake McDowell Law Center at 5 p.m. in Room 151.

Professor Goldstein holds the Stella W. and Ira S. Lillick Professor of Law Chair at Stanford University School of Law. He is a globally recognized expert on intellectual property law and the author of an influential four-volume treatise on copyright law and a one-volume treatise on international copyright law. Goldstein is also the author of the leading casebooks on the subject. He has written a widely acclaimed book on the history and future of copyright, titled *COPYRIGHT HIGHWAY: FROM GUTENBERG TO THE CELESTIAL JUKEBOK*, and has recently published *ERRORS AND OMISSIONS*, the first in a series of novels devoted to intellectual property themes. He has served as chair of the U.S. Office of Technology Assessment Advisory Panel on Intellectual Property Rights in an Age of Electronics and Information, has been a visiting scholar in Munich, Germany, and teaches regularly on the masters faculty of the Munich Intellectual Property Law Center. Professor Goldstein currently serves as of counsel at Morrison & Foerster in its intellectual property group. Before joining the Stanford Law School faculty in 1975, he was a professor of law at the State University of New York at Buffalo School of Law.
