### FOREIGN INFLUENCE DISCLOSURES

## Required disclosures

You should already disclose any of the following received from a foreign entity (or University):

- •In-kind support
- Research funding
- Money to you
- Travel funding

"Principled international collaboration is critical to success, but improper foreign influence is a threat to international collaboration in the science and technology enterprise. It is important to distinguish the difference." NSF

#### Federal Rules

<u>Congress</u> prohibits participation in MFTRPs by federally funded researchers. Federal agencies are implementing this policy: <u>DOD & NIH policies</u>.

Effective May 20, 2024, NSF Biographical sketch requires: 1) disclosure of involvement with a foreign talent recruitment program and 2) certification by key personnel that they are NOT associated with an MFTRP.

Q: What is an MFTRP?

A: Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program

#### Q: How do I know a foreign program is "malign?"

A: The program is sponsored by a foreign country of concern, or University or program on the "Entity" list and provides you, or promises to provide you in the future, any of the above-left items in exchange for any of the following:

- Providing it material, data, or nonpublic information
- Being required to recruit trainees/enroll researchers in a program
- Undertaking employment or research in the foreign country
- Being unable to terminate the agreement
- Being required to apply for funding from the foreign government
- Omitting acknowledgement of affiliation with the foreign entity on publications
- Being required to not disclose the association to U.S. Federal agencies

#### Not an MFTRP activity:

- Presenting and publishing non-controlled scientific information
- Participating in conferences/exchanges in an open and reciprocal environment
- Advising a foreign student enrolled at a university, or writing a recommendation if requested by the student
