The Dr. Harry J. Carroll Memorial Scholarship

The Dr. Harry J. Carroll Memorial Scholarship was established in 1994 by Mrs. Olive Carroll in loving memory of her husband, Dr. Harry J. Carroll. Dr. Carroll received his undergraduate degree in 1941 at The University of Akron. Continuing his study of classics, he later received a master's and doctorate at Harvard University. A professor of classics for more than 30 years at Pomona College in California, Dr. Carroll led two groups of Fulbright Scholars, assisted in the creation of the study abroad program "College Year in Athens," and was a member of the American School of Classical Studies in Athens, Greece. Pomona College honored Dr. Carroll's academic achievements four times by awarding him the title of distinguished professor. In consultation with the UA's Development Office, the Department of Anthropology is pleased to announce the renewal of the Dr. Harry J. Carroll Memorial Scholarship competition made possible by the Carroll family endowment.

The Dr. Harry J. Carroll Scholarship will be awarded annually to a student through a competitive application process. **The award amount for the Summer or Fall semester is \$300.** These funds will be directly applied to a student's UA account to help cover the cost of tuition and fees at the University. No cash awards will be made. Student travel is not covered under this award.

Eligibility. Funds are available to students who have either declared a classical studies minor at the time of application, or are enrolling in archaeology field schools or credit-based field experiences pertaining to the classical world.

Deadline. Applications must be received by **March 1st** for funds to be awarded to cover tuition costs for the upcoming Summer or Fall semesters.

Application Procedure. Students who wish to apply must fill out a **Scholarship/Internship Application Cover Sheet** available on the website or from the department undergraduate advisor, Dr. P. Vinyard. Students must also write a formal **Application Letter**. This is a competitive process, so the purpose of the application letter is to inform the awards committee of your academic career paths so far, to explain how the classical studies or field-based archaeology courses you will be taking fit into your broader intellectual interests, and what value you see in studying classical studies or field archaeology for your professional interests after you graduate.

Criteria. The winner of the Dr. Harry J. Carroll Memorial Scholarship will be selected on the following criteria: (1) the strength of their academic record to date, especially as demonstrated through excellence in classical studies and archaeology coursework; (2) the quality of their application letter.
