Earn the Master of Applied Politics With a Schedule That Fits Your Busy Life

The University of Akron's Masters of Applied Politics program is a unique 25-month professional master's program that allows students to earn the degree from locations in Northeast Ohio and other selected areas. The student completes the required 39 credits of course work using four types of courses: traditional classroom courses offered through video distance learning, courses offered 100% online, two one-week courses offered in residency at UA, and experiential courses. The delivery mode of the MAP offers quality courses on applied politics and education, and support of professionals from geographic regions around the county.

The curriculum begins in summer at UA with an intensive five-day introduction to the program and the "Campaign Management I" course. For the next five semesters students will take one 100% online and one video distance learning course. The distance learning courses will be delivered in locations that allow students to come together to encourage professional interaction. The final course of the program will again be in Akron where students will develop and present their Capstone projects during the second five-day residency.



The Bliss Institute of Applied Politics

The University of Akron's Ray C. Bliss Institute of Applied Politics is a bipartisan research and teaching institute dedicated to increasing understanding of the political process with special emphasis on political parties, grassroots activity and ethical behavior. Students can pursue a Master of Applied Politics, Juris Doctor/Master of Applied Politics or Certificate in Applied Politics. The Bliss Institute offers a nationally recognized internship program and sponsors public programs, conferences and research on topics such as campaign finance, campaign advertising and political organizations. Established in 1986, the institute has a distinguished list of graduates at all levels of politics and government.

Admission

Admission is open to students who have:

- Have a 3.0 overall GPA or
- GPA of 3.0 in their major and for the last 64 semester credits of undergraduate study (Provisional admission may be possible with a 2.7 overall GPA)
- No specific undergraduate major is required

Applications should include:

- University graduate admissions form
- Three letters of recommendation
- Statement of personal goals

Financial Aid

There are a number of resources through which students can fund their graduate education. Information can be obtained from the Office of Financial Aid.

The department awards assistantships that include tuition and a stipend to Akron-based students. Graduate assistants spend 20 hours each week teaching and/or working as research assistants.

Since assistantships are competitive, early application for these positions is encouraged. A separate application is required.
