REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Mr Pogue called the meeting to order at 8:06 a.m., and the Board adjourned into executive session on a 7-0 vote for the stated purposes of—considering employment matters pursuant to ORC 121.22(G)(1), considering real estate matters pursuant to ORC 121.22(G)(2), meeting with legal counsel pursuant to 121.22(G)(3) and reviewing for collective bargaining pursuant to 121.22(G)(4) of the Revised Code. On a vote of 7-0, the meeting returned to public session at 10:16 a.m.

OATH OF OFFICE

Mr. Pogue noted that, since the last Board meeting, two new Trustees were appointed, Olivia P. Demas and Ryan J. Thompson. Prior to Ted Mallo administering the oath to the new Trustees, Mr. Pogue read the following highlights of their backgrounds:

Olivia Demas was appointed to the Board for a term beginning September 13 and expiring on July 1 of 2021. She holds degrees in chemistry and in law from The University of Akron and

currently serves on The University of Akron Foundation's College-Centered Committee. Her community involvement is extensive and includes being a volunteer board member for the Summit County Developmental Disabilities Board and a member of the Akron Community Foundation board and the executive leadership team for the Go Red for Women initiative of the American Heart Association. Her many past board affiliations include Stan Hywet Hall and Gardens, the Ohio Ballet and the Old Trail School. She also is a member of the Akron Canton Barristers Association and the Ohio State and Akron Bar Associations.

Ryan Thompson was appointed as a Student Trustee on August 8. Ryan is a junior majoring in political science, and he is a resident of Canton. His campus involvement includes being executive chair for the Zips Programming Network and a member of the Ohio Student Educational Policy Institute, the Ohio College Access Network Akron Team, College Republicans and Pi Sigma Alpha. His Board term will expire in summer 2014.

SPECIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS (Resolutions 6-3-12 and 6-4-12, passed June 13, 2012)

At its June 13, 2012, meeting, the Board passed four resolutions acknowledging special accomplishments by Zips student-athletes during the spring season. Framed, printed copies of two of the resolutions could not be presented at that time due to scheduling difficulties. After reading highlights from each of those resolutions (see Appendix B, page 4), Mr. Pogue called Brandon Padgett, head coach of the Zips women's tennis team, and golf team member Charlie Bull forward in turn. Each received a framed resolution and made brief remarks.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR

After offering best wishes to Mr. Woolford and Mr. Thompson on their recent birthdays, Mr. Pogue discussed the Ohio Board of Regents' meeting at The University of Akron the previous week. He noted that the meeting day was Jim Tuschman's last as chairman of the Board of Regents, a position he had held for several years. Mr. Pogue said Mr. Tuschman, a lawyer from the Toledo area who chaired the board of The University of Toledo before he went on to the Board of Regents, has made a real contribution to public higher education in our state. It was during his administration that the nature of the board changed from being decision-making to advisory, Mr. Pogue said, and Mr. Tuschman handled that transition very well.

Mr. Pogue said that, through an administrative lapse in the prior governor's administration, Judge Jane Bond was not confirmed when she was originally appointed four years ago as a Trustee of the University, and as a result, she submitted her resignation. Mr. Pogue said that, during her four years, Judge Bond contributed greatly to the discussions of the Board and chaired the Academic Issues & Student Success Committee very effectively. She should be recognized as a real contributor, he said, and the Board is sorry to see her leave.

Mr. Pogue reported that he had attended his first meeting of The University of Akron Foundation Executive Committee and found it very encouraging. He said he was particularly struck by hearing that the endowment value had crossed the \$120-million mark for the first time since the recession hit in 2008-09.

Mr. Pogue applauded an arrangement that The University of Akron has with Cleveland State University and Mount Union University to measure civility in politics. He said it is a wonderful example of three universities getting together and designing and carrying out a program to benefit the public. He said the program is named after Ralph Regula, a great advocate of our part of the country in the Congress for many, many years. Mr. Pogue reminded everyone that the Board uses a consent agenda, hearing summaries of agenda items by committee but holding the vote. He said that every Trustee could ask that any item be removed from the consent agenda and considered separately, and any items that were not on the consent agenda would be voted on immediately after those items were discussed.

REPORT OF THE STUDENT TRUSTEES

After welcoming Mrs. Demas and Mr. Thompson to the Board, Mr. Bowdler said that the beginning of fall semester has created an exciting and vibrant atmosphere on campus, which includes co-curricular activities that are helping to improve life for students. He also mentioned the recent UA on Display event, which he attended and felt was very enjoyable and worthwhile for prospective students.

Mr. Thompson said he agreed that the fall semester was off to a good start. He said all of the organizations on campus have brought people in to engage the students outside of the classroom, resulting in an uptick in student participation. He then recognized the new Graduate Student Government president, Chris Opoku-Agyeman.

Mr. Bowdler introduced student Katelyn Mertz (see Appendix D), who offered some remarks to the Board regarding her Akron Experience. Mr. Thompson then introduced student Eric Copenhaver (see Appendix D), who did likewise. Each received a commemorative clock from Trustees.

• Personnel Actions recommended by Dr. Proenza as amended (Tab 1)

Prior to asking for a motion to approve the personnel actions, Mr. Pogue said that a 5-percent increase for Dr. Proenza was included in the non-bargaining faculty group salary recommendations. "I think we all feel he's continued to do an absolutely fantastic job heading this University," Mr. Pogue said.

RESOLUTION 9-2-12 (See Appendix B.) **ACTION: Palmisano motion, Mohan second, passed 7-0**

Mr. Palmisano asked Mr. LaGuardia to summarize action item 2 and Mr. Cummins to summarize action items 3-5.

• Cumulative Gift and Grant Income Report (Tab 2)

For July 2012, total giving of \$3,245,167, 131 percent more than the \$1,404,332 received for July 2011 and 68 percent more than the five-year average of \$1,934,437. The number of gifts increased from 1,071 for July 2011 to 1,455 for Fiscal Year 2012.

RESOLUTION 9-3-12 (See Appendix B.)

• Quarterly Financial Report, April-June 2012 (Tab 3)

The overall FY2012 budget trailed estimates by \$11.2 million. That variance is the result of total revenues falling short of the budget estimate by \$7.8 million (2.0 percent); and total year-to-date expenditures ending slightly below the budget estimate by \$10.5 million (3.1 percent). In addition, there was an unfavorable net variance in transfers of \$14 million.

The shortfall in tuition and fees was \$10.3 million (3.8 percent) relative to the original budget. That shortfall was offset partly by State Share of Instruction and other revenue sources that exceeded estimates by \$2.5 million combined.

Underspending offset the revenue shortfall. Total compensation was slightly below estimates. Fringe-benefit expenses were \$5.3 million (8.9 percent) below original budget, though payroll exceeded the budget by nearly \$4.6 million (2.8 percent). Supplies and Services were below budget by \$13.6 million (2.5 percent); concerns about enrollment and revenue likely impacted spending in that category. Utilities were \$2.4 million (19.8 percent) below budget, reflecting favorable rates for energy and the mild winter. Student Aid was above original budget by \$5.4 million (13.9 percent); some of this was planned to spend down a carry-over balance of \$2.5 million. The variance also resulted from graduate assistant fee remissions exceeding budget by \$1.2 million and other aid increases.

With the inclusion of transfers in and transfers out, the net change in the current-fund balance was a reduction of \$11.2 million. That takes into account \$8.4 million of carry-over provided to partially offset the reduction in state support and \$5.1 million in reductions to departmental carry-overs toward resolving the \$26-million early retirement liability.

• Quarterly Investment Report, April-June 2012 (Tab 4)

The Quarterly Investment Report for June 30 reflects a fourth-quarter rate of return of 0.6 percent and an annual return of 2.15 percent for operating funds. Those investments generated \$2.5 million in income for FY2012. The market value of endowments declined \$2.7 million in FY2012. The portfolio composite of the pooled endowments posted a -3.9 percent rate of return for the fourth quarter and a -2.75 percent return for FY2012.

• Purchases for More Than \$350,000 (Tab 5)

The Office of Risk Management proposed awarding contracts to—(1) the Evans Insurance Agency to act as the University's agent of record for incidental insurance matters and (2) Leonard Insurance Services to act as the University's agent of record for student health and accident insurance. The initial contract period would be five years with an option to renew thereafter in one-year increments upon mutual agreement. The total annual premium for the incidental insurance policies is approximately \$190,000, which is paid by the University. For student health and accident insurance, a total of approximately \$690,000 is paid annually by students who elect to purchase coverage, which is required for international students.

Mr. Pogue asked what the University had done previously in regard to insurance contracts. Mr. Cummins said the current proposal is essentially a renewal, following an RFP process that is repeated about every 10 years.

Mr. Palmisano asked for comments from Mr. Cummins on item 6, Mr. LaGuardia on item 7, and Mr. Curtis on item 8, all of which were informational.

The report reflected the status of state-funded projects, University-funded projects and planning-related projects and issues. In response to a question from Mr. Pogue, Mr. Curtis said there are 535 beds in South Hall. Mr. Woolford said that he would like to see the "green roof" when it is completed. Mr. Curtis suggested a ribbon-cutting ceremony.

REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC ISSUES & STUDENT SUCCESS COMMITTEE presented by Committee Vice Chair Woolford

- Presentation: Strategic Investment to Achieve Distinction INFORMATION ONLY

The Board heard from the recipients of the Achieving Distinction Awards. Dr. Peter H. Niewiarowski called the competitive process a "valuable bottom-up process" that was important to the faculty, encouraging collaboration and building on university strengths in research and teaching. Dr. Monte Turner called the Board "forward-thinking" in investing in the awards, which will allow the University to meet the goals of Vision 2020. Jeffrey M. Samuels and Elizabeth Reilly said the awards help to build a culture of innovation and contribute to a thriving regional economy.

• Naming of Engineering Building (Tab 1)

The Office of Academic Affairs proposed naming the building located at 264 Wolf Ledges Parkway as The University of Akron Engineering Research Center. The Center was developed to bring together industry and faculty to engage in both fundamental and applied research. Research conducted in the Center is aligned with the interests of our industrial partners and draws upon specific faculty expertise. The Center provides world- class laboratories, custom finished to satisfy particular requirements of the industrial research programs to be conducted. Funds for the building shell construction were provided by The University of Akron, the Timken Family Foundation, the Fred A. Lennon Trust and the Goodrich Foundation. The finishing and customizing of laboratories has been provided by corporate partners including the Timken Company and BP, as well as the Conquer Chiari Patient Education Foundation, the Department of Defense, Ohio's Third Frontier Program and the University.

RESOLUTION 9-7-12 (See Appendix B.)

• Research Services and Sponsored Programs Summary of Activity for June 2012 (Tab 2)

For July 2011-June 2012, funding for externally funded research and other sponsored programs totaled \$58,009,197 for 479 awards. For July 2010-June 2011, funding was

\$50,902,802 for 491 awards. For July 2011-June 2012, 15 new patents were issued, 37 patent applications were filed, and 63 disclosures were submitted—compared to 10, 48 and 82, respectively, for July 2010-June 2011.

In response to a question from Mr. Pogue, Dr. Newkome confirmed that research funding for Fiscal Year 2012 set a new record high.

• O.A.C. 3359-2-01 The Office of Academic Affairs

The proposed revisions to this Rule would consist of adding language that allows the Provost to establish implementation procedures and oversee the collection and reporting of studentand academic-program-related data, including mandatory graduation surveys.

• O.A.C. 3359-10-02 The University of Akron Bylaws of the Faculty Senate

The proposed revisions to this Rule were approved unanimously by the body of the Faculty Senate at its meeting on May 3, 2012.

• O.A.C. 3359-22-01 Contract Professional Information

The proposed revisions to this Rule would allow for an appropriate level of notice to coaches/coaching-related positions, while also providing sufficient flexibility for Athletics to meet its goals. NEW BUSINESS

• Procurement of Solar Energy Resources

The University's administration requested authorization to explore the procurement of solar panels to provide electricity, reduce usage of fossil fuels, and contribute to energy savings and efficiencies. The solar panels, about the size of an acre, would be installed on the southfacing roof of the Stile Athletics Field House and would be the largest solar array on a rooftop in the state. A company called Carbon Vision, which has a proven track record of providing "green" systems at other universities in Ohio, had offered to provide the system. The system would help the University to comply with state mandates to reduce fuel consumption by 20 percent by July 2014.

There was considerable discussion about the proposal and, in particular, the University's cost for the system and related language in the resolution. As a result, language was added to the resolution to expressly limit the University's total cost "for the purchase, installation and operation of the system" to \$1 million over the term of the proposed agreement.

WHEREAS following its selection for the project, CV Youngstown and YSU jointly applied for, and received from the United States government, a financial grant to apply towards the total cost to purchase and install a second System at YSU; and

WHEREAS YSU has decided not to install the second System on its campus and CV Youngstown has approached The University of Akron ("University") with an opportunity to install the System on its campus and to have the proceeds of the grant assigned to the University project to defray the cost; and

WHEREAS the Office of Capital Planning and Facilities Management believes that the System would afford the University with an effective, alternative fuel source that would reduce the University's future electrical costs;

WHEREAS the Office of Capital Planning and Facilities Management wishes to enter into an agreement with CV Youngstown II (or its successor corporations) to purchase and install the System, subject to: assignment of the grant from YSU; satisfaction of due diligence by the University and successful negotiation of an agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS University Rule 3359-3-01(F)(2)(h) requires the purchase of goods or services in excess of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) to be submitted to the Board of Trustees for prior approval; and

WHEREAS the Office of Facilities Management and Capital Planning and the Department of Purchasing have confirmed that the cost for the purchase and installation of the System will exceed \$350,000 over the term of the proposed Agreement; and

WHEREAS the University wishes to realize the potential cost savings for electric energy through the purchase, installation and use of the System; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that notwithstanding the requirements of University Rule 3359-3-01(F)(2)(h), the Vice President for Capital Planning and Facilities Management, with the approval of the President and the Chair of the Board of Trustees, is authorized to act as

necessary to procure the solar panel electrical system, subject to review and approval by the Vice President for Finance and Administration and the Office of General Counsel; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost for the purchase, installation and operation of the System shall not exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) over the term of the proposed Agreement; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of The University of Akron congratulates Head Coach Brandon Padgett, Assistant Coach Brian Peters and the student-athletes of the 2012 Zips Women's Tennis Team and thanks them for the success and respect they have brought to The University of Akron.

<u>RESOLUTION 6-4-12</u>: Acknowledgement of Zips Men's Golfer Charlie Bull

WHEREAS, student-athlete Charlie Bull, a sophomore member of the 2011-12 Zips Men's Golf Team, became the first golfer in University of Akron history to compete in the Division I NCAA Regional Tournament; and

WHEREAS, the First-Team All-Mid-American Conference honoree also is the first UA golfer to earn a spot on the Division I PING All-Region Team, as announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Bull's three-day score of even-par 213 placed him in a tie for 19th place in the 75-player NCAA Regional Tournament, and his final round score of five-under-par 66 was tied for second lowest in the tournament; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Bull finished his sophomore golf campaign with eight top-25 finishes in 12 events and a team-best scoring average of 73.00; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of The University of Akron is honored to acknowledge and congratulate Charlie Bull for his history-making achievements and to wish him and his teammates continued success.

APPENDIX C: REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Dr. Proenza welcomed and congratulated the two new Trustees, Olivia Demas and Ryan Thompson, and said he was delighted with Governor Kasich's choice of them. He noted that Mrs. Demas has been actively engaged with the University for many years in a variety of ways, not just as a student, but as an alumna and as a participant in many important committees.

Dr. Proenza reported that, on September 11, the governor asked for state-wide collaboration among public university and college presidents to create a new formula for allocating the state's investment in higher education. He said this is an opportunity for the state universities to provide input and not simply react to whatever is churned out at the end of a formula that few understood. Earlier in 2012, the governor had asked for a similar commission to come up with new ways to allocate capital funds, and it worked very well, Dr. Proenza said. Now, the governor is interested in focusing some outcome measures, particularly course and degree completion. Dr. Proenza said Gordon Gee, president of The Ohio State University, is leading the effort. Other members of the commission are Jerry Sue Thornton, the president of Cuyahoga Community College, and two four-year university presidents in addition to Dr. Gee, Roderick Davis from Ohio University and David Hopkins from Wright State. Dr. Proenza said that the commission's goal is to have at least a draft recommendation by Thanksgiving. He reported that he provided input to commission members and hopes that they will come up with a new and improved manner to go forward.

Dr. Proenza reported that, during these past several days, the University had hosted three meetings of the Ohio Board of Regents. Adding to Mr. Pogue's earlier report on the Regents' full board meeting on September 13, Dr. Proenza said Regent Tuschman had much praise to lavish upon The University of Akron. Dr. Proenza said the meeting was very fine and, at the end of it, the Regents bade adieu to Regent Tuschman and two of his immediate colleagues.

On September 14, the Ohio Higher Education Technology Transfer and Commercialization Task Force met at Quaker Square for its fifth report around the state, with about 100 people from industry, government and higher education in attendance, he reported. Dr. Proenza thanked Provost Sherman for serving as a member of that task force and doing a great job in representing the University and adding dimensions and details. He also thanked George Haritos and Ajay Mahajan, who have led some of the very key aspects of collaboration with industry, and the University's Research Foundation, which was one of the primary examples that the commission used in considering the recommendations that it might make. Dr. Proenza said that one of the things that Ohio seems to forget is that we have to be committed to attracting even more talent that can contribute in these areas. He noted that Mr. Pogue and Mr. Pavloff attended the September 14 meeting and asked if either of them had any observations to offer. After Mr. Pogue said that interest the topic has been building for years, which is terrific, Dr. Proenza showed video clips from the meeting that he said provided a sense of the comments that reflect well upon what the University has done.

On September 18, the Regents' Complete College Task Force held an informal meeting at the University, Dr. Proenza said. He reported that he and Dr. Sherman were asked to give some remarks, and the University's Pathways to Success strategy was highlighted and reflected upon by the chancellor.

Dr. Proenza said that, in the preceding week, the three winning proposals for the University's first Achieving Distinction investments were announced. Dr. Proenza emphasized that those programs very much represent the University's continuing progress toward interdisciplinary collaboration and production of innovative solutions to regional and global problems.

Dr. Proenza said that there were a number of upcoming meetings in which he would be participating on behalf of the University, including–

- Government-University-Industry Roundtable, October 9-10;
- National Academies Global Best Practice in Supporting Manufacturing, October 11-12;
- Science, Technology and Economic Policy Board meeting, October 25-26; and
- Council on Competitiveness, November 15-16.

Noting that Trustees had joined him at past annual meetings of the Council on Competitiveness, Dr. Proenza invited them to do likewise this year and asked that interested Board members contact him.

He reported that the GAR Foundation had awarded a \$50,000 grant for the second-consecutive year for the University's Rising to the Occasion program, which provides a supportive environment to assist more African-American males in succeeding academically. The Office of Multicultural Development launched the initiative in 2010 with a \$425,000 grant from Knight Foundation, he said.

Dr. Proenza also noted the great success of the UA on Display event, which would be discussed later, and thanked Jim Tressel for leading that effort.

Dr. Proenza reported that, for the fourth-consecutive year, the University received two significant honors. First, the Employers Resource Council is naming the University one of the 99 best places to work in Northeast Ohio. Second, G.I. Jobs magazine ranks Akron as a Military Friendly School, a designation placing it among the top 15 percent in the nation.

In conclusion, Dr. Proenza mentioned several significant upcoming events and encouraged Trustees to attend.

- China Week, October 8-15, would feature many lectures and demonstrations, including a UA Forum at E. J. Thomas Hall on October 15 featuring former U.S. Ambassador and former presidential candidate John Huntsman speaking on U.S.-Sino relations.
- On September 28, the grand opening of the Austen BioInnovation Institute, the partnership of the University with area hospitals and a medical school, will be attended by Dr. Austen and CEO of the Knight Foundation Alberto Ibargüen.
- The ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Timken Engineered Surfaces Laboratories in the new Engineering Research Center on October 19.

ERIC COPENHAVER

Eric has been involved in National Science Foundation-sponsored research projects during the summer. He performed research at Vanderbilt University in fluorescence microscopy, at the University of Michigan in ultrafast spectroscopy, and here in computational condensed-matter physics.

He also has been very active on campus. He is president of the University Ambassadors, and he has been secretary of the Philosophy Club, a physics tutor, a resident assistant and a member of the National Residence Hall Honorary, among many other activities. Eric plans to attend graduate school to pursue a Ph.D. in physics.

Katelyn Mertz is currently a graduate assistant in the Northeast Ohio Master of Fine Arts Program in Creative Writing, but she has not always been a writer. Since then, her writing has been featured in the campus newspaper and has earned her numerous distinctions. A few of those include—the Akron Undergraduate Excellence in Fiction Award, Carl H. and Dorothy S. Bauer Endowed Scholarship, Shakespeare in the Spring Essay Contest, and Sam Ella Dukes Prize in Poetry.

APPENDIX E: REPORT OF THE PROVOST

Dr. Sherman began his report by recounting a conversation with Interim Dean of Libraries Phyllis O'Connor about the start of fall semester. The provost said she had remarked, "The students in the library, the family room of this University, are smiling. The lines are short, and they're studying hard. I think the happiness index is high, and they must be really satisfied." Dr. Sherman said that the semester started well because, in addition to the numerous staff and contract professionals serving our students every day, there are 877 full-time faculty serving 28,771 students, where they are changing their lives one class at a time through offering 7,933 class sections, labs and study-abroad opportunities around the world.

He said the University did experience a slight dip in enrollment, which was not uncommon across the state and was expected in the first year of our steps to change the entire student body through the Pathways to Student Academic Success. That strategy, he said, has been discussed many times over the last several months and so, while enrollment is down about 3 percent, the University has enrolled better-prepared, first-time, full-time bachelor's-degree-seeking students. Their enrollment is up two percent, which impacts the colleges where better-prepared students are increasingly attracted, like the Honors College, College of Engineering and College of Business Administration, he said, providing the following examples of enrollment growth:

- College of Engineering, up 10 percent;
- The College of Business Administration, up 3 percent;
- College of Polymer Science and Polymer Engineering, up 10 percent; and
- College of Education, up 1 percent.

The bottom line, he said, is that the Pathways decision to focus on enrolling better-prepared students will lead eventually to an increase in enrollment and higher graduation rates, an objective of Vision 2020. Thus, the University will have increased retention and persistence that will contribute in a positive way to its bottom line.

The provost then introduced Vice President for Strategic Engagement Jim Tressel to make a few comments about UA on Display.

After Mr. Tressel's report, Dr. Sherman welcomed the 2012 Achieving Distinction recipients. He said that making the decision about what to fund out of 27 proposals in this inaugural year of the initiative was not easy, as Dr. Proenza and Dr. Newkome likely would agree. It really demonstrated the depth of innovative minds that push the envelope every day at The University of Akron, he said.

Dr. Sherman said the Achieving Distinction Program is one of two parts of implementing Vision 2020. The Ensuring Academic Excellence strategy is an academic program review process, he said. It is a reallocation of resources within the institution strategy, the results of which the administration will bring to the Board by the end of this academic year, he said. The Achieving Academic Distinction strategy is a 10-year strategic investment strategy to spawn innovation from an interdisciplinary perspective, he said. Dr. Sherman reminded Trustees that the Board endorsed Vision 2020 with the request that, during the next 10 years, the administration propose annual budgets that include \$2 million for strategic investment in the areas of Regional Solutions, the Human Condition, Innovative Technologies, and Healthcare and Medicine.

The provost said that an innovative component of this approach is one where each of the areas connects in unique ways with partners with the intent of leveraging resources to the greater good. At the highest level, he said, this is an investment strategy that, over 10 years, has the potential to add about 120 faculty and 40 staff and potentially redistribute from a strategic perspective up to about 5 percent of general-fund dollars.

The review process was rigorous and long, Dr. Sherman said, but it was helped by many people putting matrixes together for review by Dr. Newkome and the provost. He said that every proposal was reviewed according to the following criteria:

- Contributions to programs across disciplines;
- Enhancing the diversity of people, thoughts and perspectives;
- Sharing of institutional resources;
- Lending to teaching and research priorities that span multiple units;
- Having an impact on student success and academic excellence;
- Linking to potential external-funding streams; and
- Created from the perspective of transparency and accountability of those centrally allocated funds.

He said 27 proposals were submitted from 1 school, 5 colleges, 45 faculty members and 18 partners—a trans-institutional outcome as a result of this initiative. Dr. Sherman said that Dr. Proenza, Dr. Newkome and he were pleased last week to call these faculty together to be alerted to the fact that they were the recipients of the inaugural Achieving Distinction Awards. The provost said they were pleased to indicate that \$4.25 million will be invested over two years to the area of biomimicry research and innovation, where ideas will come to life as solutions of today's problems based upon the models of nature. He said \$2.25 million will be invested over two years to an intersection of proposals that were presented, combining a proof-of-concept framework with a Center for Intellectual Property and Entrepreneurship.

The biomimicry proposal, he said, clearly links to the University's Ph.D. in Integrated Bioscience, and the other proposal clearly links to the Certificates of Intellectual Property in the School of Law. Both proposals have the potential to secure significant funding from external sources and, once implemented, the latter will have the ability to successfully contribute to the commercialization and licensing of every other Achieving Distinction Award recipient. Dr. Sherman then introduced representatives of the winning proposals and asked them to comment.

Representing the biomimicry proposal team are Dr. Monte Turner, professor and chair of the Department of Biology, and Dr. Peter Niewiarowski, professor of biology and one of the principal investigators for the Biomimicry Research and Innovation Center. Dr. Turner has a strong presence in the Department of Biology for a number of years. He first joined the University as an assistant professor in 1982 and recently served as interim chair and chair of the department. With his guidance and support, the department's research program continues to grow larger than ever. Dr. Niewiarowski joined the University in 1985 as an assistant professor and, over the years, he has focused a great deal on interdisciplinary research and introducing undergraduate students to research. In addition to his research on geckos, he played an integral role in launching the Integrated Bioscience Ph.D. program.

Representing the Intellectual Property Proof-of-Concept research team is Interim Dean of the School of Law Elizabeth Reilly and the Director of the Center for Intellectual Property Law and Technology Jeffrey Samuels. Dean Reilly began her career at the University in 1980 as an adjunct professor of law and most recently served in the Office of Academic Affairs as vice provost for Academic Planning. Professor Samuels joined the University in 1998 and, prior to his career as an educator, served as the assistant commissioner of patents and trademarks of the United States Patent and Trademark Office.

The University of Akron recorded total giving of \$5,611,433 for August 2012. That total compares to \$4,583,409 for August 2011 (an increase of 22 percent) and a year-to-date average of \$3,943,691 for the previous five years (an increase of 42 percent). During August 2012, 2,431 gifts were received, as compared with 1,930 for the same period in the last fiscal year (an increase of 26 percent).

SUBJECT: Quarterly Financial Report for July through September 2012

ACTION SUMMARY

The FY13 budget trailed estimates by \$3.7 million for the first quarter, excluding transfers. This variance is the result of total revenues falling short of the budget estimate by \$5.3 million (2.9%); and total year-to-date expenditures slightly below the budget estimate by \$1.7 million (1.8%). In addition, there was a favorable net variance in transfers of \$2.9 million.

The year-to-date shortfall in tuition and fees is 5.1 million (3.3%) relative to original budget. Other sources are 0.3 million below estimate (4.6%).

Overall, total expenditures are less than the first quarter budget projections. As the details of the budget reductions are finalized, the original budget will reflect departmental reductions and position reallocations. As of the close of September, a large portion of these adjustments had not been entered into the financial accounting system making it very difficult at this point to explain some of the larger variances within the detailed expenditure pools. The next financial report to the Board will reflect all of the changes as well as a plan to address the anticipated revenue shortfall.

With the inclusion of transfers-in and transfers-out, the net change in the current fund balance is \$0.7 million less than the year-to-date budget projection.

Year-to-date combined Auxiliary revenues were \$23.2 million; combined expenditures were \$27.1 million. The actual negative variance of \$3.9 million differs from the projected negative variance of \$5.0 million. There are significant variances in Residence Life and Housing, Dining Services and Athletics.

SUBJECT: Purchases for More Than \$350,000

ACTION SUMMARY

The Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO is proposing the award of a contract to Ampco System Parking, Cleveland, OH for the operation of the Roo Express Shuttle system. The initial contract will be a three year contract effective January 15, 2013 renewable for up to two additional one year periods. The hourly rate will be \$31.98 per hour per bus in year one. The University provides all maintenance, fuel, etc. for the buses. Based upon the currently scheduled routes, the total estimated amount for year one will be \$1,141,078. The new rate reflects a significant savings to the University because our current rate is \$37.27 per hour per bus for the same service. This represents an anticipated cost reduction of \$188,753 in year one.

The Office of Talent Development and Human Resources, in consultation with Towers Watson, is proposing the award of a contract to Life Insurance of North America (Cigna) as the University's LTD insurance program for a three year period ending December 31, 2015 at an annual gross cost of approximately \$327,000, which is approximately \$77,000 less than our current contract annually.

The Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO is proposing the award of a contract to Workforce Software, Inc. for the licensed use of their Time & Attendance and Absence Management software for a period of five years and the consulting services necessary for the implementation of their software. The total estimated award for the five-year use of their software and implementation services is \$1,075,287. Of this total, \$423,495 will be utilized for the first year's use of the software and all implementation services. For years two through five of this agreement, the cost for use of the software (which is offered as Software as a Service (SaaS)) will be \$162,948 per year.





The University of Akron **Cumulative Gifts Income Report** Comparison July 1 - August 31 -- FY2011-2012, FY2012-2013





Program Centered Private Support Fiscal Year 2012 - 2013 July 1, 2012 - August 31, 2012





RESOURCES

Tuition & Fees – First quarter Tuition and General Fee revenues were less than budgeted as growth in credit hour production fell short of the anticipated levels by 4% in summer and 3.4% in the fall. Overall, year-to-date student revenues fell short of budget by \$5.1 million, or 3.3%, reflecting final summer and preliminary fall activity.

State Appropriations – The FY13 State Share of Instruction (SSI) budget of \$91.1 million is preliminary and will be finalized later in the fiscal year. To date, receipts of \$22.8 million are in line with the budget.

Departmental Sales and Workforce Development – Revenues in the sales and service areas and Workforce Development are generated by offering goods and services to the campus community and the public while providing an instructional or research experience to students. Year-to-date revenues in these operations fell \$0.4 million short of projections. Related favorable expense variances partially offset this shortfall.

Indirect Cost Recovery – These revenues were 23% greater than budgeted and about 10% greater than in the prior year. The receipts, which relate to externally funded grant activity, are based on the related spending and vary greatly from period to period. A portion of these funds is distributed to offset indirect costs resulting from research activity and the related overhead.

Earnings from Investments and Endowments – Through September, the accumulated earnings from investments and endowments slightly exceeded the budget by \$11,200, or about 2%.

Miscellaneous Income – The annual budget of \$1,050,000 relates to any income source that is not included in the above-referenced categories. The first quarter miscellaneous revenue of (\$13,800) fell short of the \$114,500 budget. The shortfall is largely due to the \$82,000 unanticipated write-off of receivables.

Transfers-in – Transfers-in of \$4.0 million covered open purchase orders from FY12. A carryover balance of \$52.9 million was also transferred in. The FY13 budget includes a \$5 million transfer in from reserves. To date, this amount has not been transferred into the current fund. Future months will reflect the transfer as intended in the base budget.

Total Resources – In total, the FY13 first quarter net available resources fell short of the budget by \$5.1 million.

Introduction: The expenses in each of the functional categories are compared to the three-month projection of the original budget. Through the end of September, total functional expenditures were about \$1.7 million less than budgeted.

Instruction – All expenses in this category reflect the direct cost of providing instruction to the students. These expenses are primarily compensation at 90% of the total. Expenses within this function were less than budgeted by \$4.7 million, or 15.5%. This variance is largely due to the fact that various reserves are budgeted within this function and then distributed to other functions throughout the fiscal year. Examples are the course fee budget, technology fee budget, start-up funds, merit pool, etc. It should also be noted that part time and summer faculty expenses are trending at lower levels than last September. This is most likely a function of the lower enrollment as well as the planned migration from part time to full time faculty.

Separately Budgeted Research – This category includes expenses for activities specifically organized to produce research outcomes (i.e. indirect cost redistributions, faculty research grants, etc.). Through September, the Separately Budgeted Research activity reflects an unfavorable spending variance of \$1.5 million, or nearly 80%. This is partially offset by favorable indirect cost recovery variance. Resources are also allocated to this function from the start-up fund reserve within the Instruction function. This is apparent in the \$6.1 million carryover from FY12 primarily in start-ups and cost share.

Public Service – Activity in this function relates to providing non-credit sources and services to the community. At the close of the first quarter, expenses are about \$0.2 million less than budget.

Academic Support – Expenses within this function are for the support services that assist those operations directly focused on instruction research and public service (i.e., libraries, deans' offices, technology fee, etc.) Spending in the Academic Support areas was greater than budget by 18.8%, or \$1.5 million. While library-related expenses exceeded the base budget by about \$1.0 million, the remaining academic support operations were greater than the period-to-date original budget by \$0.5 million.

Student Services – Year-to-date spending was 26.5% or \$1.0 million less than the original budget. Activity within this function supports the administration and operation of services that comprise and enhance the student experience (i.e., admission, registration, financial aid).

Institutional Support - Expenses for operations that provide support services to the total University (i.e., information technology services, legal, financial overhead) were in line with the September budget

with a favorable variance of \$0.2 million, or 1%. This category also includes a \$1.4 million annual reserve for bad debt against which uncollectible student accounts are written.

Plant Operation & Maintenance – This function represents the current fund cost of operation and maintenance of the physical plant. This does not include capital expenditures for new construction. As of the end of September, expenses were about \$0.3 million, or 5% less than budgeted.

Scholarships – This category includes internally-funded scholarships and graduate assistant fee remissions. To date, the scholarship expenses are \$1.6 million, or 6.5% greater than planned.

RESOURCES:

Tuition & Fees – The FY12-13 tuition & general fees is budgeted to remain relatively flat and actual Summer and Fall came in at 16% and 2.6% less than planned. Summer and Fall 2012 course fees will be allocated in the fourth month. Therefore, other student fees came in below the third month budget level by 5.0%.

State Appropriations - FY13 State Appropriations came in on target at the third month budget level.

Departmental Sales and Workforce Development – Revenue in sales and service is below the third month budget level with an unfavorable variance of 44%.

Transfers-in – In addition to the revenue categories listed above, the FY13 annual budget also includes a transfers-in of \$50,000 from the contingency reserve. Transfers-in of \$2,768,058 and \$5,625 are related to departmental carryover and encumbrances.

Total Resources – In total, net available resources are below the third month budget level by \$446,800 (6.6%).

Introduction: The expenses in each of the functional categories are compared to the budget in an effort to reflect the year-to-date spending against the approved budget. Overall, functional expenditures are less than the third month expenditure guideline.

Instruction – All expenses in this category reflect the direct cost of providing instruction to the students. The largest expense component is faculty compensation. Budget surpluses in this area are primarily related to the fact that all vacant positions for the college fall in this category.

Research - No activity to date.

Public Service – The activity in this area is related to Workforce Development & Continuing Education programs. The expenditures for Public Service came in below the third month expenditure guideline by 44.2%.

Academic Support – Spending in the Academic Support areas came in below the expenditure guideline by \$144,700.

Student Services – Expenditures in this function is below the third month expenditure guideline by 25.1%.

Institutional Support – Expenditures in this function is above third month expenditure guideline by 1.0%.

Plant Operation & Maintenance – Expenditures in this function came in slightly above the third month expenditure guideline by 0.5%.

Scholarships – Wayne College received 60.4% reimbursement from The Ohio Department of Education for the Fall 2011 and Spring 2012 Post Secondary Enrollment. The remaining 39.6% or \$470,200 was charged back to Wayne College coming in above the third month expenditure guideline by 15.1%.

Total E & G – Overall, the total Educational & General expenditures are below the third month expenditure guideline with a favorable variance of 26% or \$1.1 million. When compared to September 2011 Wayne College reduced total Educational & General expenditures by \$556,097. Also, the third month revenue surpassed expenditures by \$3.1 million excluding the \$2.7 million carryover from FY12.





liquidity and maximizing returns. The strategy includes structuring a well-diversified, high-quality portfolio by capitalizing on opportunities offered by the market. In September 2012, \$10 million was reallocated from the Cash and Cash Equivalents portfolio to the Intermediate-Term Fixed Income portfolio to further capitalize

on the higher yields. It is estimated that investments in the Intermediate-Term Fixed Income portfolio are at their maximum capacity as not to exceed the upper policy range of 45% during the low periods of Cash and Cash Equivalents due to the normal cash flow cycle.

A critical component to meet daily liquidity needs, Cash and Cash Equivalents ebb and flow across the four quarters: \$89.4 million-September 30, 2011; \$43.6 million-December 31, 2011; \$79.3 million-March 31, 2012; and \$43.7 million (all cash)-June 30, 2012. A new series of short-term (less than 6 months) CDs and commercial paper was purchased during the first quarter to increase yield within the Cash and Cash Equivalent portfolio. In order to maintain liquidity, these cash equivalents will mature before the next low period in the cash flow cycle.






Total Distributions

In the scholarship projection calculations for FY13, 28 University endowments were identified as being "underwater", that is, its 12/31/2011 market value was less than its original gift value. Of the 28, only six endowments did not have enough reserve funds in their respective spending accounts to "self fund" FY13 scholarships at the same level as FY12 awards. These six endowments will receive supplemental distributions with funds provided by the UA Foundation.

Market Advance/Decline FY13 opened with a market advance (realized and unrealized loss) of \$2.66 million for the University endowments contributing to the positive net change for the overall portfolio.



During the 20 years presented above, the University's and the UA Foundation's combined portfolios have grown from \$58.1 million to \$183.5 million through the end of FY12. In the first three months of FY13, the combined portfolios experienced a 3.27% increase.

On an individual basis, the University's market value as of September 30, 2012, was 3.99% higher than its FY12 ending market value; whereas the UA Foundation's preliminary FY13 YTD market value was 2.97% higher.

The Portfolio Composite was calculated to be higher than the Policy Balanced Index for all periods ended September 30, 2012: by 165 basis points for the quarter; by 314 basis points for the one-year period; by 11 basis points for the three-year period; and by 15 basis points since inception, that is, since March 2008 which represents the first full quarter with assets under management by Legacy.

All the investment fund managers performed well during the first quarter of FY13 with positive, single -digit returns either better than their respective benchmark or slightly below. One-year returns were mostly positive, double-digit returns even for the managers that were more than 100 basis points below their respective benchmark.

The PIMCO All Asset All Authority Fund and the majority of fixed income managers consistently beat their respective benchmark.

The only negative returns were posted by the separately invested Seiberling Chair in Constitutional Law. However, the permitted investments for this grant-funded endowment are very limited by the original award guidelines.

During the quarterly review meeting, Legacy will recommend that Essex Investments and Neuberger Berman remain on "watch" given their respective three-year returns continue to be more than 200 basis point below benchmark.

SUBJECT: Board Item for Approval

The following purchases for more than \$350,000 are recommended for approval by the Board of Trustees at its meeting on October 31, 2012.

1. <u>Shuttle Bus Operator</u>: The Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO is proposing the award of a contract to Ampco System Parking, Cleveland, OH for the operation of the Roo Express Shuttle system. The initial contract will be a three year contract effective January 15, 2013 renewable for up to two additional one year periods.

Requests for Proposal were solicited by the Department of Purchasing from known shuttle bus service operators. The proposals were due in the Department of Purchasing on September 14, 2012. All proposals were reviewed by the appropriate University personnel. The proposal submitted by Ampco System Parking was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible proposal. The hourly rate will be \$31.98 per hour per bus in year one. The University provides all maintenance, fuel, etc. for the buses. Based upon the currently scheduled routes, the total estimated amount for year one will be \$1,141,078. The new rate reflects a significant savings to the University because our current rate is \$37.27 per hour per bus for the same service. This represents an anticipated cost reduction of \$188,753 in year one. The hourly rate may be adjusted after year one in accordance with the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U).

This proposed award is acceptable to the Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO, the Department of Auxiliary Enterprises, the Department of Purchasing, and the Office of General Counsel.

I recommend that an award be made to Ampco System Parking and request your approval and that of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on October 31, 2012.

2. <u>2013 Employee Long-Term Disability Program</u>: In July, Towers Watson, the University's benefit's consultant, prepared specifications for Long Term Disability (LTD)

insurance that were approved by the Office of Talent Development and Human Resources. A Request for Proposal notification was released to prospective bidders and publicly posted by the Department of Purchasing via our online bidding software "Public Purchase." The RFP process consisted of two parts. Part I required each vendor to submit answers to our questionnaire and disclose any deviations to the specifications. Vendors that successfully responded to the questionnaire and did not submit any unacceptable deviations were invited to participate in Part II; the financial proposals submitted during a multiple day reverse auction.

At the conclusion of the RFP process, Towers Watson reviewed the proposals in their entirety and prepared an analysis for the University. Following review of the analysis, three vendors were brought on-site for interviews. In consultation with Towers Watson and Purchasing, Talent Development and Human Resources selected Cigna as the recommended vendor, based on pricing and their claims management process.

I recommend that the University award Life Insurance of North America (Cigna) as the University's LTD insurance program for a duration of a three year guaranteed rate ending December 31, 2015. The gross cost of the annual contract is approximately \$327,000, which is approximately \$77,000 less than our current contract annually. The financial exhibits below outline Cigna's financial proposal.

3. <u>Software Purchase and Consulting Services for the Implementation of a Time &</u> <u>Attendance and Absence Management System</u>: The Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO is proposing the award of a contract to Workforce Software, Inc. for the licensed use of their Time & Attendance and Absence Management software for a period of five years and the consulting services necessary for the implementation of their software. The total estimated award for the five-year use of their software and implementation services is \$1,075,287. Of this total, \$423,495 will be utilized for the first year's use of the software and all implementation services. For years two through five of this agreement, the cost for use of the software, which is offered as Software as a Service (SaaS), will be \$162,948 a year.

The Time & Attendance system will eliminate the manual time card process and uniformly apply attendance rule across the University. It will provide significant savings by eliminating the cost of printing, distributing, scanning, and storing time cards. The current scanning process runs on unsupported software and leaves the University vulnerable to the risk of failure, which would require approximately six FTE's to key the time card data. This system provides complete audit trails, attendance records, and leave of absence records thereby increasing internal control and reducing vulnerability to litigation, audits and employee grievances. Lastly, it provides complex pay rule evaluation required by union contracts decreasing the amount of manual review required.

The Absence Management system is a robust application for automating the processes for planning, tracking, and compensating time off. It combines employee and manager capabilities and tracks all types of absences in a single, web-deployed application. The primary advantages of the Absence Management module would include the elimination of multiple manual record keeping systems allowing employees and administrators to use an online system to request and approve leave requests. It reduces the potential for fraud and promotes compliance with the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA).

Funding for this contract will come from account number 2-01012, IT Operating Projects Funding.

Request for Proposals were solicited from four vendors thought capable of providing this type of software and consulting services. In addition, the Request for Proposal was posted on the Public Purchase website. Four proposals were received with Workforce Software receiving the highest rating and having the lowest overall pricing for the software and the implementations services to implement the software. For this project, Workforce Software will provide expertise unique to the University.

This software and the consulting services offered, as provided by Workforce Software, are acceptable to the Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration/CFO, the Department of Information Technology Services, the Department of Purchasing, and the Office of General Counsel.

University of Akron 650 kW Solar Value Projections: 20 Year Buyout



STUDENT SUCCESS	Commitment to Excellence
 Data Warehouse/Business Intelligence 	Phase one of the data warehouse project, the proof of concept, and laying the groundwork for success was completed in September and the project team is currently working on Phase two of the project. The second phase will expand the scope to include research reporting. This reporting will enable the University to quickly and accurately determine the total dollars committed to research, both sponsored and non- sponsored. The project is on track for the NSF report deliverable at the end of the year. The University will benefit from this project because it will have a single source of information which will reduce conflicting interpretations of data.
Panopto Focus	Panopto Focus is a simple solution for capturing lectures and offering them to students for later viewing or review. Focus has the ability to capture audio, PowerPoint lectures with narration, and screen captures with narration. It also offers integrated note taking, enabling the viewer to take notes at any point in the presentation and revisit them later.

• Successful U



The development of the Successful U application was competitively bid and a contract has been awarded to EYEMG.com, LLC. Following the initial discovery phase, it was determined that the application would be accessible via mobile devices and, additionally, via a website to provide access to a broader student audience.

Planning and production of the application has begun and delivery of the application to the student body is set for Spring semester 2013.

The application will provide awareness of activities and engagement in communities that are related to six critical student life skills:

- Personal Growth & Wellness
- Leadership & Volunteerism
- Personal Relationships
- Academics & Career
- Health & Fitness
- Financial Awareness

GLOBAL RELEVANCE	Develop Dynamic and Globally Relevant Programs
• Online Learning (eLearning)	Work continues to identify courses, programs and certificates that can be offered to our traditional, on ground students as well as off-campus students. Providing more convenient online offerings to traditional students is expected to positively impact retention and student success, protecting existing revenue. Delivery of our high quality online content to new students off campus will generate important incremental revenue.
	We are working closely with the Colleges and Faculty to select the courses, programs, and certificates that will be offered online. A national search is underway to hire a person to coordinate and facilitate the expansion of our online offerings.

UA continues to host and support PeopleSoft for LCCC (Lorain County Community College) application environments of Campus Solutions, Financials, Human Capital Management, and application development tools.
Work was completed on creating a service portfolio, common schedule, and organization. In progress is a new licensing agreement for software and development of the business case.
Institutional Effectiveness & Planning: LCCC needs assistance with institutional reporting. LCCC is moving forward with the search for a technical support staff and UA has agreed to train that individual at Akron.
LCCC Staffing: LCCC continues to struggle with the recruitment and retention of technical staffing. UA is working with LCCC to determine whether there are alternatives available to meet the needs of LCCC while taking advantage of UA experience and expertise.
Disaster Recovery: LCCC will participate with UA in its Disaster Recovery plan to take advantage of discounting that will be available due to the volume of the UA agreement.
CFOs from Northeast Ohio called a meeting of all universities and colleges in the region to find ways to collaborate with other institutions. The initial meeting was held in July at Youngstown State University. At the meeting it was decided the CFOs would study the feasibility and benefit of sharing Purchasing and the CIOs would work to identify technologies that could be consolidated into Centers of Excellence in NE Ohio. Creating Centers of Excellence will eliminate the need for each school to maintain all the required technology competencies on their respective campuses.
CIOs Centers of Excellence. Subsequently, a meeting was held in early October that included all CIOs from Northeastern Ohio, private and public, two-year and four-year schools. Ten schools participated with the objective to find two centers of excellence to build collaboration. The two chosen were network management and IT support service desk . A subcommittee was formed and each of the schools will participate on one of the selected initiatives. The goal is to determine the scope, objectives and potential benefits for each of the initiatives, so an update can be provided to the CFOs by early November.

DISTINCTION	Facilitate Faculty Development and Success by Expanding Clusters of Interdisciplinary Teaching and Research
Quality Matters	Quality Matters (QM) provides on-site, online, and web-based professional development opportunities for instructional designers and faculty to ensure our online courses are of the highest standards.
QM	The 15th cohort of the Quality Matters in Online Course Design is in progress with 16 UA faculty members participating. To date, three UA faculty members have achieved QM recognition.
	UA has developed and implemented a database that will be used by Ohio institutions to barter for Quality Matters reviewers. This approach will save money for Ohio institutions. To date, four Ohio institutions have used the bartering system for a total of 12 courses.
ENGAGEMENT	Build and Sustain Vital Relationships and Partnerships
Research Security	The Sequris group, the company engaged to work with IT and the research areas to provide security awareness and best practices, will be onsite this month to interview staff and researchers so they can complete a Risk Maturity Index Analysis (RMI). The next steps will be a review of the SANS 20 controls to provide recommendations to strengthen our IT security framework.
Disaster Recovery	We are gathering requirements, service level agreements, network bandwidth needs, and roles and responsibilities to be included in the request for proposal. Aspen group will be assisting us to gather these requirements and ensure our proposal includes all aspects of the disaster recovery process.

COMMUNITY	Promote Vibrant and Engaging Environments and Facilities
 Police Dispatch – 911 Merger 	The University of Akron Police Department continues to partner with the City of Akron Police Department to share the City's Computer-Aided Dispatch and Records Management System to track and document public safety incidents.
POLICE *	Initial setup of information within the system has begun which will help define the specific locations to dispatch officers. Additionally, the completion of the primary network line to access the City of Akron's system has been completed. A master agreement defining all ongoing responsibilities for each party after implementation is now being completed. The initial timeframe for the master agreement is for a three-year timeframe with the go-live date for use of the system scheduled for June 2013.
<text></text>	A key enabler for the Akron Experience will be a common repository for all student data. This common repository will enable us to personalize and inform each student's experience on campus, making the experience much more satisfying. In addition, by automating the entire student lifecycle (e.g. prospect, admitted, enrolled, graduate, alumni, donor) on a common system, we will eliminate the poor usability that results when you use fragmented / different systems along the student lifecycle. This lifecycle automation is called Constituent Relationship Management (CRM).
	Information Technology Services invited four CRM providers to visit our campus in October and November to demo their systems. The purpose of these visits is to educate us about the capabilities CRM systems offer.
	After the vendor meetings, we will select the features and functions that we believe will be most useful at The University of Akron. The desired features and functions could become the basis for a formal Request for Proposal (RFP) if the University decides to do a much more in-depth review of the available CRMs.

• Grants Management Post-Award	The Grants Post-Award application will better track awards, facilities and administration processing, and automate and improve grants financial reporting.
	A consultant was hired to help with the configuration and implementation of the application. The consultant reviewed the configuration already setup for the billing module and helped to complete putting data into the module. The receivables module was then configured and made ready for data loading. Since all configurations are now complete, a review was performed of the entire application to verify setup and continuity between modules. Next steps include completing the data load to receivables and begin testing.

Rules Committee

O.A.C. 3359-46-02 Parking Permit Fees

The proposed revisions to this Rule consist of adding language pertaining to a special transportation fee applicable to all students and employees who desire a 24/7 parking privilege.

3359-46-02 Parking permit fees.

- (A) Upon recommendation of the administration, the board of trustees approved, at its April 1999 meeting, the implementation of fees to be charged to all employed university faculty, contract professional and staff (full and part-time), and graduate assistants, in accordance with schedules adopted by the board from time to time. This fee shall now be collected from each such individual along with the parking fees assessed to students who for purposes of this policy shall not be deemed to be employees, pursuant to the schedule approved by the board of trustees.
- (B) Parking and transportation services, upon such schedule as is adopted and in effect, shall assess the proper fee at such time. The cashier's office shall collect the amount, certified by parking and transportation services, from each student and all university faculty, contract professional and staff (full and part-time), and graduate assistants, either in cash or approved credit cards, as a prerequisite to issuing any permit for parking. Faculty, contract professionals and staff (full or part-time) may pay this as a lump sum which is non-refundable, or in installments through a pre-tax payroll deduction.
- (C) Students and employees who desire a twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week parking privilege may apply for a permit and be assessed a special transportation fee for such privilege. The university may limit the locations that such permits shall be valid, and may limit the number of such permits that will be issued per year, per academic term, or other period. Qualified residence hall students will receive this parking privilege pursuant to the terms of their residence hall contract, without the necessity of paying an additional special transportation fee.


