REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Mr. Pogue called the meeting to order at 8:01 a.m., and the Board adjourned into executive session on a 6-0 vote for the stated purposes of—considering employment matters pursuant to 121.22(G)(1), considering real estate matters pursuant to 121.22(G)(2), meeting with legal counsel pursuant to 121.22(G)(3) and reviewing for collective bargaining pursuant to 121.22(G)(4). Ms. Demas arrived during the executive session. On a vote of 7-0, the meeting returned to public session at 9:37 a.m.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR

Mr. Pogue first noted that the University was ranked third (behind only Lubrizol and University Hospitals) among best places to work in Northeast Ohio, according to a Glassdoor.com survey published in Crain's Cleveland Business. Second, he noted that Advisory Trustee Sandra Pianalto attended committee meetings on January 22 but, as previously announced, cannot attend the scheduled Board meetings because of the schedule that had already been established for the Open Market Committee meetings in Washington, D.C. Third, he read a proclamation from Governor John R. Kasich that recognized Dr. Proenza for his service in support of the Ohio Higher Education Funding Commission and urged all Ohioans to join in thanking him for being

a national leader in promoting completion and encouraging student success.

Mr. Pogue then reminded everyone that the Board uses a consent agenda procedure, hearing summaries of agenda items by committee but holding the vote until the end of the meeting. He said any items that were not on the consent agenda would be voted on immediately after those items were discussed.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT (See Appendix C.)

REPORT OF THE STUDENT TRUSTEES

Mr. Thompson said that classes had begun smoothly and everybody seemed to be talking about the upcoming men's basketball game, which could continue a winning streak. He said the annual Hearts for Humanity fundraising event to support the alternative spring break effort would be held on February 15. He said he would be participating in alternative spring break, doing community service in underprivileged or disenfranchised communities.

Mr. Bowdler discussed the Rethinking Race series that was beginning later in the week. He said the two-week event has been held annually on campus since 1997. He listed some of the excellent speakers who would be on campus as part of the event and encouraged participation. He also said that, from his perspective as a student, that students of diverse thought and backgrounds can be heard and listened to at the University, which has enriched his learning. He encouraged continuing efforts in that regard, including the recruitment and support of international students.

Mr. Thompson introduced international student Gladys Montenegro-Galindo (see Appendix D), who offered some remarks to the Board regarding her Akron Experience. She received a commemorative clock from the Trustees.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

presented by Committee Chair Palmisano

• Personnel Actions recommended by Dr. Proenza as amended (Tab 1)

Mr. Palmisano recused himself from consideration of the Personnel Actions, as he had done during the Finance & Administration Committee meeting on January 22. Mr. York presented that item.

RESOLUTION 1-2-13 (See Appendix B.)

ACTION: York motion, Woolford second, passed 6-0, Palmisano abstained

Mr. Palmisano called on Mr. LaGuardia to summarize items under tabs 2 and 9; Mr. Cummins to summarize items under tabs 3, 4 and 8; Mr. Curtis to summarize items under tabs 5, 7 and 10; and Mr. Mallo to summarize the item under tab 6.

• Cumulative Gift and Grant Income Report, July-November 2012 (Tab 2)

The University of Akron recorded total giving of \$25,178,773 for July-November 2012. That total compares to \$26,688,789 for July-November 2011 (a decrease of 6 percent) and a year-

to-date average of \$19,290,464 for the previous five years (an increase of 31 percent). During July-November 2012, 9,235 gifts were received, as compared with 10,401 for the same period of the last fiscal year (a decrease of 11 percent).

RESOLUTION 1-3-13 (See Appendix B.)

Following Mr. LaGuardia's reports, Dr. Proenza called on lobbyist Sean Dunn to report on the state budget outlook and other relevant activities on the state level. Mr. Dunn spoke briefly.

• Quarterly Financial Report, October-December 2012 (Tab 3)

The FY2013 year-to-date actual results trailed estimates by \$2.9 million, excluding transfers. The variance is the result of total revenues falling short of the budget estimate by \$5 million (2.4 percent) and total year-to-date expenditures being below the budget estimate by \$2.1 million (1.2 percent). In addition, there was a favorable net variance in transfers of \$5.3 million. With the inclusion of transfers-in and transfers-out, the net change in the current fund balance is \$2.4 million above the year-to-date budget projection.

The year-to-date shortfall in tuition and fees is \$4.4 million (2.8 percent) relative to the original budget. Because first-day enrollment for spring 2013 was 4.5 percent below spring 2012, tuition revenue is estimated to be \$10 million below budget for FY2013. Other revenue sources are \$600,000 below estimate (5.7 percent) and likely will fall short of budget by roughly \$1 million for the fiscal year.

Overall, total expenditures are less than the year-to-date budget projections. Payroll is \$1.9 million above estimate, but that variance is more than offset by Fringe Benefits being \$2.9 million below estimate. Therefore, total Compensation is \$1 million (0.9 percent) below the year-to-date estimate. Compensation is anticipated to be roughly \$2 million below budget for the fiscal year. It is important to note that the Payroll budget assumes a significant increase in vacant positions; however, much of the savings of vacant positions is offset by roughly \$4 million in temporary and visiting positions that will be funded by a carry-over balance allocated for payroll.

Supplies and Services is \$4.4 million (15.9 percent) below estimate, due to significant underspending in areas such as Computers and Peripherals, Maintenance Contracts and Instructional Supplies. It is partially offset by over-spending in the "Other" category. When combined, anticipated under-spending is at least \$3 million for the fiscal year in those two categories. Utilities expense is \$1.1 million (21.8 percent) below estimate, due to lower utilization of energy resulting from mild weather conditions and conservative budgeting. Under-spending of at least \$1 million is expected in utilities for the year. Student Aid is \$3 million (12.7 percent) above the year-to-date estimate. Although enrollment declined from the prior year, the academic preparation of students in the incoming class was relatively stronger than prior years, driving up scholarship awards. Student Aid is expected to exceed the original budget by \$3 million for the year.

Based on those variances and current enrollment trends, revenue projections are \$11 million lower than budget for FY2013; however, the significant variance in transfers-in and identified under-spending reduce the projected variance to \$5 million. That shortfall will be funded from available balances identified below:

Efforts will be ongoing to reduce expenditures throughout the fiscal year. The need to restrict discretionary expenditures will continue to be emphasized to all units. However, the focus will shift to developing a balanced budget for FY2014, which will build off any spending reductions achieved in FY2013.

Year-to-date combined Auxiliary revenues were \$49.3 million; combined expenditures were \$51.3 million. The actual negative variance of \$2 million differs from the projected negative variance of \$4 million. There is one significant variance from budget in Residence Life and Housing, which is impacted negatively by the enrollment decline.

RESOLUTION 1-4-13 (See Appendix B.)

Mr. Pogue asked if proceeds from the sale of assets would help correct the budget situation. Mr. Cummins said the answer depends on the asset being sold. As an example, the sale of a capital asset would not result in additional operating funds, though it would help overall, in the plant fund for instance, he said.

• Quarterly Investment Report, October-December 2012 (Tab 4)

The Quarterly Investment Report for December 31 reflected a second-quarter rate of return of 0.07 percent and an annual return of 1.6 percent for operating funds. Those investments generated \$1,104,500 in income year-to-date. The market value of endowments increased \$3.4 million in the first half of FY2013. The portfolio composite of the pooled endowments posted a 2.3-percent rate of return for the second quarter and a 14.7-percent return for the past 12 months.

RESOLUTION 1-5-13 (See Appendix B.)

• Wayne Campus North Entrance Drive (Tab 5)

Bids for the above referenced project were solicited in November 2012. The bids for construction were received and opened by the Purchasing Department on December 19, 2012. The successful bidders were Miller Bros. Construction, Inc., for \$1,138,000 and Emery

Electric, Inc., for \$289,100. The project is locally funded and consists of a new entry road into the University's Wayne College campus from North Crown Hill Road. There will be additional ADA parking, a new entry sign with an electronic message board and modifications to the existing sign on Smucker Road to accept a new electronic message board

RESOLUTION 1-6-13 (See Appendix B.)

Mr. Woolford asked if the new entrance would include a wall. Mr. Curtis said it would not include a wall but would feature message signs, landscaping and lighting.

• Real Estate-Rubber Bowl Sale (Tab 6)

Team 1 Properties, LLC, offered to buy the University's vacated Rubber Bowl stadium, the conveyance of which was authorized by Amended Substitute Senate Bill No. 275 of the 129th General Assembly. The Board was asked to approve the sale of the premises to Team 1 for \$38,000, subject to, and in accord with, the terms and conditions of a contract approved by the Vice President and General Counsel and executed by the Vice President for Finance and Administration. The Board also was asked to authorize the Vice President and General Counsel to proceed immediately to seek and obtain necessary approval by the Governor and final execution by the Department of Administrative Services.

RESOLUTION 1-7-13 (See Appendix B.)

• Title V Boiler Compliance HTHW Generator Stack Emission NOx Reductions Low NOx Burners (Tab 7)

Proposals were submitted on January 14, 2013 via Public Purchase, an electronic bidding tool. The low bidder for the construction contract was John Zink Company, LLC, for \$494,800. The project is state funded and administered by the Department of Capital Planning and Facilities Management. The project will bring the University back into compliance with the EPA's mandate for emissions and will upgrade the burners and controls to make the boilers more efficient and back within specifications.

• Report of the Provost: Video Presentation on 2012 University of Akron Teaching, Research, and Service Awards (See Appendix E.)

Mr. Woolford said that the Board wants to recognize the award winners formally. He then asked Dr. Sherman and Dr. Newkome to present the research report under tab 1.

• Research Services and Sponsored Programs Summary of Activity (Tab 1)

For July-December 2012, funding for externally funded research and other sponsored programs totaled \$21,477,506 for 308 awards, as compared with \$42,412,655 for 265 awards for the previous year. For July-December 2012, 10 new patents were issued, 13 patent applications were filed, and 32 disclosures were submitted—compared to 5, 10 and 26, respectively, for July-December 2011.

Mr. Woolford asked if there were any questions from Trustees or any highlights from Mr. Sage or Ms. Campbell-Jackson regarding the information-only items under tabs 2-3. There were none. REPORT OF THE STRATEGIC ISSUES COMMITTEE

presented by Committee Co-chair York

Mr. York reported on two presentations that were given to the committee on January 22.

He said Eileen Korey and Wayne Hill provided an overview of marketing and communications activities to enhance the University's reputation and attract students. They presented a packet of the coverage the University had gotten during the past year and discussed their strategy for aligning their efforts with the Vision 2020 strategic plan, he said. Mr. York commended them on an outstanding job.

For the second presentation, Mr. York said, Dean Chand Midha talked about the University's online, evening and weekend offerings. Noting that the University has been at the forefront of distance learning in a lot of ways, Mr. York referred to Dr. Proenza's earlier remarks about massive open online courses and some of the other changes that are happening in terms of online and distance learning. He said the good news is that the University is starting to engage in that process, and Dean Midha talked about a number of the things already being done. Mr. York also said that Dr. Proenza has been a thought leader on some of these things, which bodes well for the University. He cited Thom Friedman's article (Revolution Hits the Universities) on January 27, 2013, in the New York Times and said that the rise of MOOCs is a phenomenon that will continue to grow. He said the Strategic Issues Committee is trying to establish a platform for addressing these issues and taking advantage of the opportunities presented.

REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE

presented by Committee Chair Bauer

• Revisions to Rule 3359-1-10, Advisory Trustees

In November 2011, The University of Akron Board of Trustees created by rule the position of "advisory trustee." Unlike regular trustees of the Board of Trustees who are appointed by

the Governor with the advice and consent of the senate, "advisory trustees" are selected by the Board of Trustees, have no voting privileges, and are not counted for purposes of quorum.

Since the adoption of the rule, and through the process of the appointment of the initial "advisory trustee" pursuant to the rule, the General Counsel is now suggesting some clarifying language and changes to the rule that places stronger focus on its primary purpose, which is to permit the University to take advantage of the talents, resources and experiences of those who may be appointed "advisory trustees."

RESOLUTION 1-10-13 (See Appendix B.)

• Revisions to Rule 3359-3-01, Officers of Finance and Administration

The purpose of this proposed modification to Rule 3359-3-01 is to increase the pre-approval purchase limits of goods and services from \$350,000 to \$500,000.

In April 2011, the Board of Trustees approved increased bid limits (from \$25,000 to \$50,000 for construction and services) and an increased pre-approval limit from \$150,000 to \$350,000. At that time, the Board indicated that further review of the pre-approval limit should be conducted after at least one year. In response to a recent policy review by the Board's Finance & Administration Committee, the Department of Purchasing again queried the pre-approval limits among the University System of Ohio institutions and found Akron's limit to be considerably more restrictive than most. A majority of the other institutions have a higher pre-approval limit, thereby enabling them to respond more quickly to market conditions, opportunities and immediate needs. To align Akron's pre-approval limit more closely with those of the other state institutions and to enable a more agile response to market conditions and opportunities, we request that the Board approve increasing its pre-approval limit from \$350,000 to \$500,000.

RESOLUTION 1-11-13 (See Appendix B.)

Mr. Bauer said that the intent of the rule changes for items 3-8, below, is primarily to remove references to University College (which no longer exists). In the past, main campus students were admitted and enrolled generally through three different pathways: University College, Summit College and direct admission to degree-granting colleges. The new structure and accompanying rules envision all students being admitted and enrolled via one portal to The University of Akron. When the students gain eligibility for internal transfer to a degree-granting college, they are placed in that college. (This could be directly upon enrollment if they meet the college requirements.) A secondary reason for some of the proposed changes in the following six rules is to eliminate unnecessary language and remove the names of specific offices, replacing those references with phrases such as, "the office responsible for..."

He said that, due to Dr. Proenza's outstanding performance in each of his goals areas, it was recommended that the full contractual annual performance bonus amount of \$25,000 be awarded.

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed documentation of the accomplishment of those 2012 goals, as provided by the president to Chairman Pogue, Vice Chairman Palmisano, and Vice Chairman Pavloff on January 28, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to acknowledge and reward the achievement of those important goals in fulfillment of the President's Employment Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees expresses its appreciation to President Proenza for the achievement of 2012 one-year goals and hereby awards President Proenza a performance payment of \$25,000, as required by contract.

APPENDIX C: REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Good morning, Ladies and Gentlemen. Let me welcome Mrs. Blickle to our board meeting, and thank all of you for all that you continue to do.

As you know, we have begun the second semester of our academic year and, of course, the year 2013. We do so with the clear understanding that the months ahead are likely to prove a challenging period for higher education as a whole, and for public universities across the country in particular.

Over the past several years and, in particular over the last few weeks, I have shared with you several items, all of which point to a convergence of factors that compel us to act swiftly and with strategic intent to ensure our continued success.

This morning, I want to briefly summarize the key points on some of those messages, and the steps that we are taking, and shall take, to act upon them.

Exactly two weeks ago, Moody's Investors Service released a report that casts a negative outlook for the financial structure of higher education. That's about the same time that they approved our outlook, so that's helpful. Nevertheless, it has to do with findings of external pressures that are affecting all of us in higher education, particularly our traditional revenue streams. Furthermore, these pressures are affecting all sectors of higher education – from the most elite to the most unknown of colleges and universities, public or private.

Moody's cited a number of specific examples, including the following:

- Significantly weakened pricing power for tuition
- State contributions are unlikely to rise "meaningfully in the near term." i
- Federal spending has only "limited possibility for stable or increased funding," and it's already a minor component anyway.
- Endowments will suffer from volatility in the capital markets, and philanthropic giving is expected to show little or no growth.

The report goes on to say that these pressures on the revenue streams are the results of macrolevel economic, technological and public opinion shifts, and that these changes "are largely beyond the control of institutions," much as we have pointed out to you.

As one industry publication noted, "Moody's analysts caution that revenue streams will never flow as robustly as they did before 2008. The change will require a fundamental shift in how colleges and universities operate." iv

If we tighten the focus from the national level to that of the state, I regret to say the picture does not become any brighter, although we are doing better than some other states, and there are a few states, about 12 or 15, that are increasing their support of higher education.

As I pointed out in a message to the campus community last week:

- after two years of state funding cuts, there is certainly no relief or reversal in sight;
- proposed funding formulas that reward institutions with higher retention and graduation rates are likely to place at a disadvantage those institutions like ours that serve broader and more diverse constituencies;
- currently Ohio's pool of high school graduates is shrinking at least for a period of time, while enrollment of older adults is expected to expand, and we obviously need to pay attention to that; and
- the tremendous opportunities afforded by new technologies in online education will also usher in increased competition from national as well as state institutions.

Last week, I also shared with you the very eloquent and well-reasoned open letter that Mitch Daniels, the new president of Purdue University, sent to his campus recently.

In that letter you surely found many parallels to what we have been saying here for quite some time. In addition, President Daniels writes:

"I've been party to the overreading of trends and the overreactions it can cause; these mistakes have taught me never to be dismissive of criticisms or warnings, but also to move cautiously in response." He adds, "We would fail our duty of stewardship either to ignore the danger signs all around us, or to indulge in denial and the hubris that says we are somehow uniquely superb and immune."

So, what is the prudent path forward?

Surely, by now, only the most obstinate thinkers cling to fading hope that the economic changes of recent years are temporary, or that the technology genies may yet be crammed back into their magic lamps.

So I will briefly review some of the steps we are taking to enable us to leverage the opportunities hidden within the economic challenges that lie ahead.

In Fiscal 2013, we will:

- conduct an analysis of staffing and costs;
- study faculty roles as part of academic program review so as to enhance student recruitment, retention and the Akron Experience, and expand the role that our faculty play in all aspects of the university's culture and work;
- more closely examine the impact of pension reform for our immediate future;

- continue to refine our new framework for recruitment, persistence and graduation, not just though the Akron Experience, but also through other important ways;
- institute policies to further contain travel and catering costs, and other items that we will need to more aggressively monitor for appropriate and effective cost containment; and
- move more aggressively into distinctive online course offerings, including integration of offerings and assessment of learning.

Now, of course, we also are working on a number of other, longer-term initiatives that we will bring to your attention in future meetings, such as monetization of assets that presently form part of our auxiliaries.

As for the technological shifts in our environment, we must move more strategically, more effectively and more quickly to stay abreast of fast-moving developments.

As an example of something that is happening, we currently are negotiating with Coursera to offer a "flipped" or as perhaps more appropriately termed, a blended learning course. The teaching of a renowned Princeton University scholar in sociology will be paired with that of one of our own faculty members. This material could be available as early as next month for some of our students in an honors colloquium. Dean Dale Mugler might wish to comment on that later.

I consider this is a good step, one that builds in a legacy of distance learning initiatives here at The University of Akron, but we must continue to press our development in other areas of online access, assessment and utilization.

As I said in my message to campus last week, the ground beneath our feet is shifting at the fault line intersection of growing economic pressures and new technologies. Moody's referred to these changes as "macro-level" economic changes. Stanford's president John Hennessy described the situation in terms of an approaching tsunami. And nearly 20 years ago, then MIT president Chuck Vest spoke of "seismic rumbles of change" confronting higher education. And I think he was prescient in predicting them, although I think we are more or less on a common timeline with that.

Whether it's a tsunami, or macro-economic changes or seismic rumbles, the metaphor isn't important – what is vital is our recognition of the scale of these challenges before us. Eva Bogarty, the author of the Moody report, stated it best when she wrote that "The U.S. higher education sector...hit a critical juncture in the evolution of its business model." I would say models because there isn't a singular one.

It is indeed our feeling that our business models are changing, must change, and we must adapt if we are to prosper appropriately in this new environment.

Successful adaptation to this new normal will require a commitment of collaboration from all members of our campus community. President Daniels said that when he arrived at Purdue last year, he found that "a newcomer quickly notices that we are less a 'university' than a federation."

He went on to say "I hope to find, and perhaps here and there to foster, a somewhat stronger sense of common purpose as we work through the decisions presented to us by a changed environment...many choices will necessitate a communitarian outlook that consciously places the interests of the overall university first."

So it is with The University of Akron. I have called upon every member of our campus community to engage with us in the coming discussions and actions needed to adapt to this new era for higher education. It must become abundantly clear that raising revenue, reducing costs and leveraging technology is now part of everyone's job description. You may look forward to some form of public discussion on this topic, either through forums or perhaps as part of University Council, as the provost and I spend time engaging the university community in this matter.

In closing, as most of you are aware in just seven years, this University will celebrate its 150th anniversary. I am confident that through collaboration, innovation and determined action, we can ensure that this institution arrives at that milestone stronger, more vibrant and more productive than at any other time in its history.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. That concludes my remarks.

SUBJECT: Financial Report for January 2013

REPORT SUMMARY

The FY 2013 budget trailed estimates by \$7.5 million year-to-date as of January 31, excluding transfers. This variance is the result of total revenues falling short of the budget estimate by \$9.9 million (2.9%); and total year-to-date expenditures below the budget estimate by \$2.4 million (1.1%). In addition, there was a favorable net variance in transfers of \$5.4 million.

The year-to-date shortfall in tuition and fees is \$9.2 million (3.4%) relative to original budget. Other sources are \$0.7 million below estimate (1.0%).

Overall, total expenditures are very close to budget projections. To date, total compensation expenditures are \$0.2 million (or 0.1%) above budget and 0.7% greater than last year. Scholarships, including graduate assistant fee remissions, are \$2.9 million (8.3%) above budget. Supplies and Services spending continues to lag budget projection by a significant amount - \$6.4 million (19.8%). At this point it appears that total expenditures will remain below budget even though various specific items may be above or below estimate for the year.

With the inclusion of transfers-in and transfers-out, the net change in the current fund balance is \$2.2 million less than the year-to-date budget projection. In order to manage the FY 2013 budget in light of the projected revenue shortfall, efforts continue to monitor spending in targeted areas for the remainder of the year.

Year-to-date combined Auxiliary revenues were \$59.2 million; combined expenditures were \$60.7 million. The actual negative variance of \$1.5 million differs from the projected negative variance of \$2.0 million.

Guide to Terminology Used in Personnel Reports

Term Definition/Explanation

Adjunct Appointment Appointment to a full-time or part-time position, normally without pay.

Individuals in this category are affiliated with the University for a specific purpose usually involving academic research/teaching.

Appointment provides the individual with access to University systems/services as determined by the department/college.

Appointment New hire of an individual to an approved Faculty, Contract Professional

or Staff position. The appointment can be full-time or part-time,

temporary or regular.

Department/School Chair Faculty member appointed to provide leadership to an academic

department or school within a college. Department/School Chair appointments normally cover the entire academic year (12-month appointment). A Faculty member's salary will be converted from 9-month to 12-month status using an approved formula to reflect the additional time worked. A stipend (currently calculated as 1/11th of the converted salary) is awarded for assuming the additional responsibilities of a Department/School Chair. 1/10th of the stipend is converted to base each year that the individual serves as a Department/School Chair.

Discharge Involuntary termination of appointment.

Trustees for approval.

Job Audit/Reclassification Under University Rule 3359-25-10 the University may initiate audits and

reviews of positions and classifications within the approved University Classified (3359-25-06) and Unclassified (3359-25-07) classification plans. In addition, employees may submit a request to determine if their current position is appropriately classified. The employee submits a Position Description Audit Questionnaire (PDAQ) to their immediate supervisor to initiate the job audit process. The immediate supervisor and second level supervisor are required to review and approve the information submitted on the PDAQ. Once the PDAQ is approved, it is submitted to the Classification Unit in Talent Development & Human Resources. The Classification Unit will review the PDAQ and determine if the position is appropriately classified or not. If the Classification Unit determines that the position is not classified correctly, it will provide a recommendation to change the classification. The recommendation will be reviewed and approved by the employee's management up to and including the appropriate Vice President. The approved recommendation will then be submitted to the University's Board of

Leave Without Compensation

If an employee is unable to work due to a documented medical condition or for other approved reasons and they have exhausted all accrued sick leave, vacation leave and compensatory time that they are entitled to use, the employee may continue their approved absence from work without pay and will retain status as a University employee.

Market Increase

The Classification unit in Talent Development & Human Resources will, upon request from a dean or vice president, conduct a market evaluation of a position or positions to determine if the University is providing an appropriate level of compensation. If it is determined that the current level of compensation is below the established market, a recommendation will be made to adjust the current level of compensation.

Merit Increase

Increase in pay granted for meeting established performance criteria.

Non-Renewal

Separation of employment of a Contract Professional employee without cause in accordance with the requirements established in University Rule 3359-22-01. The University is required to provide notice in writing to the affected Contract Professional employee. If the individual has two years or less service with the University, they will receive three months notice. If the individual has more than two years of service, six months' notice is required.

Offline Salary Adjustment

Increase in salary that occurs outside of annual salary review process. Recommendations for offline salary adjustments are submitted by the appropriate Vice President to Talent Development & Human Resources for review and approval. Offline salary adjustments are normally recommended when specific market (internal or external) or equity (internal) issues exist with an individual's salary. Offline increases may also be recommended as a result of a reorganization involving a change in responsibilities.

Probationary Removal

Classified civil service employees are required to serve and successfully complete a probationary period following any initial appointment into a classified civil service position. If an employee's service is found to be unsatisfactory, the employee may be removed from the position at any time during the probationary period. The length of the probationary period is 120 days for classified civil service employees/CWA bargaining unit employees and one year for Police Officers in the FOP bargaining unit. A probationary classified civil service employee duly removed for unsatisfactory service does not have the right to appeal the removal to the State Personnel Board of Review. A probationary bargaining unit employee is not permitted to appeal the removal decision under the terms of the collective bargaining agreements.

Promotion The movement of an employee from one position to another budgeted

position at a higher classification and pay range; or a higher salary where a pay range does not exist. The former position becomes vacant.

Resignation A voluntary termination of employment.

Salary Basis Change A change in appointment status for an employee, 12-month to 9-month

or vice-versa.

Status Change A change in pay group, job family or job function.

Stipend Contract Professional and non-bargaining unit staff employees may

receive a temporary stipend for substantial increases in responsibility for activities outside of the normal scope of the employee's assigned classification (University Rule 3359-11-12.1). Full-time Faculty may receive a stipend for primarily administrative functions requiring substantial increases in responsibility and for activities not included in the ordinary load of teaching, research, and professional service for full-

time faculty (University Rule 3359-11-12).

Supplemental Additional compensation provided for completion of assigned job

responsibilities.

Temporary Appointment An appointment for a limited period of time with a specific beginning

and ending date.

Tenure Change A change to the date for tenure eligibility for a full-time faculty member

in a tenure-track position.

Title Change An employee remains in their budgeted position, but the title changes

and there may be an increase in salary. No vacancy is created by the

move.

Transfer Lateral move of an employee from one department to another

department, where the employee stays in the same classification.

Training/Apprenticeship The Collective Bargaining Agreement between the University and the

that authorizes the Office of Talent Development & Human Resources to develop and administer a Job Enrichment and Apprenticeship Program for CWA bargaining-unit employees. Employees selected to participate in the program are given an opportunity to expand their knowledge and skills. In return, these employees are provided with an











Monthly Totals- November, December FY 2012-2013





FY2008-2009; FY2009-2010, FY2010-2011, FY 2011-2012, FY 2012-2013



THE UNIVERSITY OF AKRON Bequests Campaign Report


Monthly Totals
November-December-January FY 2012-2013







January 31, 2013, 2012, FYTD





The University of Akron Soccer Stadium Campaign - \$3.2 M Goal January 31, 2013, FYTD













FY 2012-13 Priority Budget Issues January 2013

CURRENT

GENERAL FUND

• Revenues:

- O Total revenue (excluding transfers-in) as of the end of January falls short of budget estimate by \$9.9 million (2.9%) primarily due to lower-than-expected enrollment.
- o Spring data indicates year-to-date enrollment is 3.9% less than anticipated and through January, tuition and fees are \$9.2 million (3.4%) short of budget.
- o Revenues from departmental sales operations are below estimates by \$1.1 million (11.7%).

• Expenses:

- o Total expenses as of the end of January were less than budget estimate by \$2.4 million (1.0%).
- o To date, total compensation expenditures are slightly (\$0.2 million, or 0.1%) greater than budget and 0.7% greater than last year. Full time faculty, contract professional and staff expenses are all greater than last year at this point. However, the growth in these categories is nearly offset by the reduction from last year's spending on part time faculty, summer faculty, and fringe benefits.
- Scholarships, including graduate assistant fee remissions, are \$2.9 million (8.3%) above budget as the focus to attract more college-ready students has increased the number of scholarship recipients, and fewer scholarship students are dropping off after the first year. Also, in an effort to enhance current year enrollment, a few new, unfunded initiatives were launched.
- While utility expenses through January are less than budget, they are 4.7% (or \$215,000) greater than last year, mostly because this summer and winter were not as mild as last year.

WAYNE CAMPUS

Year-to-date total revenues fell short of the budget estimate by \$0.5 million, (4.2%). However, year-to-date expenditures are also below estimate by \$1.8 million, (20.6%). The variances are attributed to enrollment being below the budget estimate.

AUXILIARIES

Year-to-date combined Auxiliary revenues were \$59.2 million; combined expenditures were \$60.7 million. The actual negative variance of \$1.5 million differs from the projected negative variance of \$2.0 million. There was a significant negative variance in Residence Life and Housing.

On behalf of the School of Law, I am pleased to recommend that an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree be bestowed upon Law Commencement Speaker Chief Justice Maureen O'Connor of the Supreme Court of Ohio. The faculty of the School of Law unanimously voted to recommend an honorary degree at its regular faculty meeting on February 21, 2013.

Chief Justice O'Connor received her undergraduate degree from Seton Hill College in 1973 before going on to earn her law degree from Cleveland-Marshall College of Law in 1980. Chief Justice O'Connor is the 10th Chief Justice in the history of the Supreme Court of Ohio and the first woman to lead the Ohio Judicial Branch.

Before joining the court in 2002, she began her law career as a practicing attorney in the early 1980s. She was appointed magistrate in Summit County in 1985 and served in that capacity until becoming a common pleas court judge in 1993. She resigned from the bench to become the Summit County prosecuting attorney in 1995, where she aggressively prosecuted repeat offenders, violent criminals and public officials who committed ethical violations or improprieties.

In 1998, she was elected lieutenant governor – the second-highest official in the state. She became the governor's chief advisor on criminal justice issues, serving as director of the Ohio Department of Public Safety, and as chair of Ohio's Security Task Force and the State Building Security Review Committee. Following the September 11 attacks, she led the state in its response to the war on terrorism and worked closely with law enforcement, Ohio EMA and The Department of Homeland Security which garnered her praise of the federal homeland security officials

Chief Justice O'Connor's honors and awards are many. She received Alumnus of the Year and the Distinguished Alumnae Award for Civic Achievement from Cleveland-Marshall College of Law. She has received the Founders Award from the Ohio Women's Bar Association and the Pioneer Award from the Akron Bar Association. She received accolades from victims' rights groups and educational institutions for her tireless work lobbying for tougher laws on rape and gang-related offences. She has also earned awards from Mothers Against Drunk Driving and Cleveland State University.

University of Akron Division of Student Affairs Report to the Board of Trustees March 20, 2013

Department of Student Recreation and Wellness Services (SRWS) and Department of Student Health Services (SHS)

Executive Summary

This report provides an overview of the Department of Student Recreation and Wellness Services and the Department of Student Health Services and their efforts to establish and maintain a campus culture that engages and supports the overall well-being and academic success of students. The student affairs professionals in these departments partner with numerous campus departments and community entities to ensure campus availability of programs and services that support, strengthen and enhance health and wellness while empowering students to achieve, learn and be engaged.

SRWS collected data on the number of times an undergraduate student swiped his/her University Zip Card to gain entry to the recreational facilities and compared the results to data related to undergraduate grade point average obtained from the Office of Institutional Research. The data suggests that students who frequently use the facilities also earn a higher overall GPA than their peers who do not use the facilities.

SHS continues serving our campus population for a wide range of health-care related concerns. During fall 2012 students and staff made 3,557 visits to SHS: one-third of those visits were for immunizations, laboratory tests, uncomplicated urgent wound and injury care, tuberculin testing, allergy injections, and miscellaneous consultations. Treatment for influenza-like symptoms accounted for three percent of fall semester visits.

In addition to health-care services, SHS professionals partner with academic areas providing hands-on clinical experience for nursing and athletic training students as well as medical residents

Both SRWS and SHS engage students in programs and activities to develop a knowledge base to promote fitness and healthier lifestyles.

Office of Academic Affairs 2012-2013 Leadership Agenda Update March 2013

Summary of Innovative Offerings

One focus of the 2012-2013 Leadership Agenda is providing more programs and courses in innovative ways to increase retention of current students and grow enrollment in new markets. Recognizing the need to provide flexible completion opportunities, especially to adult students and veterans, deans have committed this academic year to add specific numbers of new programs, certificates, and courses in disciplines with enrollment demand. These offerings will be in a variety of forms including evening/weekend, online, distance learning, or a hybrid of these delivery models. As the adult population in Ohio is predicted to grow through 2016, student support services also must be flexible to meet student needs, from web portals to evening hours for financial aid and academic advising. Highlights from this academic year include:

- 20 current "day" programs now will be offered during evenings/weekends, including 7 bachelor's degrees and 13 master's degrees (completion spring 2013)
- 40 new online courses including 26 completed in fall 2012 and 14 scheduled to be completed spring 2013
- 6 new online programs including an RN/BSN (complete), BS Finance for nonbusiness majors, and master's degrees in Global Education, Sport Management, Taxation, and Pathology
- 3 hybrid degrees including a master's degree in Social Work, bachelor's degree in Organizational Supervision, and a doctorate of Nursing Practice
- In November 2012, a survey of online program offerings (aligned with employment growth projections) of select Ohio institutions and the University of Pittsburgh shows The University of Akron in 2nd place out of nine institutions for the number of online bachelor's and master's degrees (program completions spring 2013)

Evening/Weekend Programs

The deans of the colleges have focused on programs during this academic year with enrollment demand that need just a few more courses scheduled at these convenient times to be offered 100% during evenings/weekends.

Part of providing complete programs in this flexible delivery model is ensuring that the number of class sections available meet the demand for courses. Comparing fall 2011 to fall 2012, student credit hours in the evening and weekend range from 72,000 to 76,000. For fall 2012, the total evening/weekend credit hours include 6% delivery on weekends and 94% delivery during evenings.

Online Courses and Programs

Online programs are a critical component of reaching a new market of students and ensuring the ability of our current students to complete degree requirements in a timely fashion. Along with expanding student markets, online offerings can support retention efforts to provide increased flexibility for students. Similar to evening/weekend offerings, the deans of the colleges have focused on growing courses and programs during this academic year that can be made available fully online.

College and Faculty Engagement

The Leadership Agenda for this academic year directed colleges to identify and broaden engagement with innovative models of course delivery. After conversations with faculty, deans reported to the Provost the progress within their colleges on this agenda. The colleges are developing an additional four master's degrees, two bachelor's degrees, three associate degrees and one certificate. In addition, the two colleges that offer general education courses have targeted key courses that need to move to an online format in order to offer fully online bachelors and associate degrees, as opposed to just degree completion opportunities.

Models for faculty engagement in expanding online offerings for current students, as well as future new markets, include the Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences establishment of a \$200,000 fund, where faculty can access through a competitive RFP to implement innovative course delivery models.

Faculty Senate has appointed an Online Curriculum Review Committee to "provide academic oversight of the UA Online process... this committee is intended to assist faculty and departments aspiring to expand their online presence to do so efficiently and effectively."

Instructional Design

The Office of Design and Development (D & D) has reviewed the college goals for online offerings and are working with faculty to move their courses into an online format. Vendors who specialize in instructional design have been identified to expand the capacity of D & D instructional designers so courses can move rapidly into an online format, expanding the learning opportunities for current students and future new markets. A scope of work and

timeline has been developed for new online courses. Faculty sessions in the colleges are being conducted to help faculty understand the services and available tools for converting their courses to an online format.

Web Portal for Online Student Services

Web based online student support design specifications were developed by a team of faculty, students and administrators, which will provide for optimal online student services to support current students and future students who may never have a physical presence on our campus.

These design specifications which include recruitment, admissions, orientation, advising, library, transfer student and financial aid services, were included in an RFP to identify a vendor that will work with our information technology team, as well as the broader community in building the necessary support services. Completion of these online support services is targeted for June 2013.

Online Support Desk for Students and Faculty

The services of the technology support desk are being reviewed to ensure consistent quality support for the expanding online offerings and student engagement. Benchmarking of IT support desk services are being compared to universities with mature online programs, while focus groups of faculty and students are being organized to discuss existing services and recommendations for future services. Budget modeling is taking place to assess the cost differentiation and services between internal expansion of services compared to contracting with a vendor to expand our support desk services for students and faculty.

Market Research and Marketing

A review of all of current online degrees, certificates and courses has been conducted and a "to market" plan has been developed which outlines new offerings and projections on when new offerings will be ready to market internally or externally. The Office of Institutional Marketing is developing an electronic survey with assistance from the IT team to verify and explore adult market opportunities. A scan of national articles and publications regarding degree interests of the adult student has also been conducted.

PROPOSED HONORARY DOCTORATE OF LAWS DEGREE FOR HONORABLE CHIEF JUSTICE MAUREEN O'CONNOR



THE SUPREME COURT of OHIO

Maureen O'Connor Chief Justice

Chief Justice **Maureen O'Connor** is the 10th Chief Justice in Ohio history and the first woman to lead the Ohio judicial branch.

She first joined the Supreme Court of Ohio as an associate Justice in January 2003. She was re-elected in November 2008 in a landslide victory in which she carried each of Ohio's 88 counties and took approximately 68 percent of the vote. She was elected Chief Justice in 2010, by a 2 to 1 margin over her challenger and again carrying every county.



January 1, 2011 - Maureen O'Connor became the first female Chief Justice and just the tenth Chief in the history of the Supreme Court of Ohio. She joined the Court in 2002, as the state's 148th Justice, which, at the time, gave the Supreme Court its first-ever female majority.

Her first statewide judicial election in 2002, in which she took more than 57 percent of the vote, made her the 148th Justice to the Court, the sixth woman to join the Court and gave the Court its first-ever female majority.

Born in the nation's capital, but raised in Strongsville and Parma, Chief Justice O'Connor's career in public service and the law spans three decades and includes service as a private lawyer, magistrate, common pleas court judge, prosecutor, and Supreme Court Justice.

She earned her bachelor of arts at Seton Hill College in 1973 before going on to earn her law degree from Cleveland-Marshall College of Law in 1980.

While gaining experience in practice as an attorney during the early 1980s, Chief Justice O'Connor created a home for her family and her legal career in Northeast Ohio. Appointed a magistrate in Summit County in 1985, she served in that capacity until becoming a common pleas court judge in 1993. As a busy trial judge, Chief Justice O'Connor was selected by her peers to serve as the administrative judge — a testament to her ability to build coalitions and maintain collegiality while administering to the business of the courts.

She resigned from the bench to become the Summit County prosecuting attorney in 1995. There, she aggressively prosecuted repeat offenders, violent criminals, and public officials who committed ethical violations or improprieties, and lobbied for tougher laws on rape and gang-related offences. Her untiring work received accolades from victims' rights groups and educational institutions, and earned awards from Mothers Against Drunk Driving and Cleveland State University. As prosecutor, Chief Justice O'Connor also lobbied the General Assembly on important criminal justice reforms.

In 1998, she was elected lieutenant governor — the second-highest official in the state. She became the governor's chief advisor on criminal justice issues, serving as director of the Ohio Department of Public Safety, and as chair of Ohio's Security Task Force and the State Building Security Review Committee.

In the wake of the Sept. 11 attacks, she led the state in its response to new threats of terrorism by working with law enforcement, Ohio EMA and The Department of Homeland Security, efforts that garnered the praise of federal homeland security officials.

Chief Justice O'Connor also has raised two adult sons, Alex and Ed Kipp, who both married lovely intelligent women, much to her surprise and delight.

Since being sworn in as Chief Justice in January 2011, Chief Justice O'Connor has pursued an extensive agenda for strengthening the third branch of Ohio government in a number of key areas:

- **BUDGET:** Chief Justice O'Connor appointed a task force on the judicial budget to identify the method and manner by which Ohio courts are funded, determine the long-term efficacy of the current funding models, and review possible alternatives that might provide sustained and consistent funding for Ohio courts.
- **DIVERSITY:** Chief Justice O'Connor continued strong support for the Law and Leadership program that prepares the next generation of urban students to consider a career in the law, announced support for developing a diversity curriculum for judges, and has made enhancing the diversity of the bench and bar a top priority.
- **DEATH PENALTY:** In a cooperative effort between the Supreme Court of Ohio and the Ohio State Bar Association, Chief Justice O'Connor led the establishment of the Joint Task Force to Review the Administration of Ohio's Death Penalty, a group of 21 judges, prosecuting and defense attorneys, and lawmakers that is examining ways to ensure that the administration of capital punishment is fair and judicious. The group is expected to issue a report sometime in late 2012.
- IMPARTIAL COURTS: Recognizing the critical importance of supporting public trust in the courts, Chief Justice O'Connor has proposed a number of reforms to combat even the perception that courts are subject to political influence. Her ideas include the consideration of a nonpartisan judicial primary, support for local judicial candidate screening processes, a constitutional amendment to require the advice and consent of the Senate for gubernatorial appointments to fill Supreme Court vacancies, and other proposals.
- **COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:** Chief Justice O'Connor is active in encouraging members of the judiciary to be active members of their communities, volunteering and engaging to support worthwhile causes while dispelling the common misconception that judges are separate and apart from the communities they serve.
- **INTERNAL EFFICIENCIES:** Chief Justice O'Connor and her colleagues on the bench initiated a comprehensive project to use information technology to streamline the process for circulating case documents, and editing and processing opinions for release.
- CLE: Working with judges and the organized bar associations, Chief Justice O'Connor is spearheading an effort to reform and improve the system of continuing legal education for judges and lawyers, including expanded use of technology and distance learning.
- COMMERCIAL DOCKETS: Chief Justice O'Connor has been supportive of a recommendation that certain qualified courts be allowed to create separate dockets to resolve business-to-business disputes fairly and efficiently. A Supreme Court Task Force recently issued a report recommending this and other actions for supporting commercial dockets.







 - o Resident Assistants (RA)
 - Student Ambassadors
- Presentations to Faculty, Council of Deans and Vice Presidents
- A promotional video produced by Z-TV for use across campus
- Stories in the Buchtelite promoting the application and the launch party
- Tables in the Union to promote the application and the launch party

Further promotion will continue through Spring Break and in the Spring New Student Orientation sessions. There will also be planning for a fall re-launch to coincide with move-in weekend in September.

Akron Experience



The primary thrust of Phase II development this semester is in the areas of career development. The changes include:

- The addition of single sign on capabilities to RooLink, a subscription service providing
 - o Review of employer profiles
 - Search and apply for jobs
 - o Connect with over 4,000 employers
 - o Access Career Center event information
- The development of planning tools for incoming freshmen to introduce them to Career Planning Concepts
 - o Forms for New Student Orientation advising
 - Checklists in MyAkron to provide students an ongoing roadmap

The first semester run of Culture Quest, the module to track attendance at university-sponsored events, was completed and participation was tracked via ZipCard swipes.

- We had five official events with 1849 unique participants.
- Session two of Culture Quest is officially underway and promotion of and participation in the events is on the rise.

GLOBAL RELEVANCE

Online Learning (eLearning)

Develop Dynamic and Globally Relevant Programs

Our original strategy was to engage one firm (i.e., Pearson) to provide all the wrap-around services required to support online students. When we concluded Pearson would not be affordable, we decided to bring some of the services in house (i.e., help desk, technology) and unbundle the other services so they can be acquired from multiple suppliers. RFPs have or will be developed for online student services, marketing, student recruiting and instructional design.

We have completed a gap analysis to identify the General Education courses that would be needed in order for students to obtain a complete undergraduate degree online. This analysis takes into account the Dean's report, the Curriculum Proposals in progress and the courses that have been approved for online delivery. For an associate degree, five Gen Ed courses are needed. To complete a Bachelor of Arts, seven additional courses are needed. Efforts are underway to develop a sharable repository of sample online courses and a four-hour technology tools workshop.

 Shared Service: Supporting PeopleSoft at LCCC





UA continues its support of PeopleSoft for LCCC (Lorain County Community College) application environments of Campus Solutions, Financials, Human Capital Management, and application development tools.

Technical Support: UA provided planning assistance and created test instances of the PeopleSoft applications for LCCC to test Campus Solutions and HCM update bundles.

Budget Planning: UA is working with LCCC to provide a budget plan to support administrative systems technology over the next two years. The plan projects a replacement for aging PeopleSoft servers and storage, a time and labor application, possible shared service initiatives for IT Service Desk and a network operating center, and adjustment for existing software maintenance contracts.

 Northeast Ohio Collaboration & Innovation Study Committee The higher education CFOs from Northeast Ohio meet regularly to discuss Centers of Excellence (COE) that might be used to collaborate between schools.

The Service Desk Subcommittee initially limited the scope of their investigation to finding a common technology platform. Since some of the schools were Banner and others were PeopleSoft, limiting the scope to platform did not provide a business case for supporting schools operating on the different ERPs. The scope has been increased to form a single business unit that would service all ERPs that would exist in an independent agency. This will eliminate the undue influence from operating out of any single campus. The service would be owned and controlled by each of the participating organizations having a single seat on a governance committee that oversees the service. As a result of the expanded model, Cleveland State and Kent State have reengaged in talks.

The Networking Subcommittee concluded that all public sector entities should be monitoring and managing their respective IT infrastructures on a proactive basis. Individually this service can be outsourced but the committee is trying to determine if it is more economical to share the ownership and control through shared services. The model attempts to create an independent service owned by participants that will implement in three phases: network monitoring and change control, problem resolution and intelligence, and proactive capacity management. The target for having a draft plan together for the committee is March 31.

eProcurement Shared Services



The Director of Purchasing proposed ESM Solutions as a way to significantly increase the discounting UA receives for purchases through an online catalog and ordering solution. This solution will be implemented in such a way as to allow others in the local geographic region such as governmental units to participate and benefit from this shared service.

DISTINCTION

Facilitate Faculty Development and Success by Expanding Clusters of Interdisciplinary Teaching and Research

 Desktop Synchronous Learning/Video Conferencing



IT is working with faculty to select and standardize a synchronous distance learning platform for the University. This platform will enable faculty members to deliver instruction from any PC to any other PCs in a real-time, synchronous mode. All that is required is that all PCs participating be equipped with microphones and cameras.

Integrator Assessor

As a follow up to the November Urban Serving University (USU) meeting, UA has developed and distributed a survey to university presidents through the USU association to gather information about innovation in delivery and business models. Results are in the process of being collected and analyzed. From this information, collaboration teams across USU will be formed to move forward components that will support IAM.

In a novel arrangement, The University of Akron is venturing into the world of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) and offering a "flipped" or "blended learning" course in partnership with a renowned Princeton University scholar in sociology.

Beginning next month, students in an Honor's Colloquium entitled The Sociological Imagination, will have access to video lectures by Dr. Mitchell Duneier of Princeton through a contractual arrangement with Coursera, a pioneer in on-line learning. The Integrator team had a retreat to map out a schematic of the Integrator approach from the student's perspective. The team discussed and evaluated assessment-focused projects. In a follow up meeting, a mockup of the Integrator Assessor website will be developed.

ENGAGEMENT **Build and Sustain Vital Relationships and Partnerships** We have engaged several departments on disaster recovery Disaster Recovery requirements and will continue this effort with other areas. In addition, IT will be working with Dell disaster recovery specialists and other vendors to validate our disaster recovery strategy. IT Status and Projects Information Technology Services is developing a status page that will keep the university informed about technology system status. The page will use a green-yellow-red indicator for different INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY Search systems like Telecommunications, Servers, Web Access, PeopleSoft, etc. If systems are out or scheduled to be out for Information Technology System Status Reports service, the page will indicate the planned maintenance or Welcome to the Information Technology System Status Report page. This page will be updated with the latest Information on outages, updates or known issues to the University's IT Systems. All Open Items will be displayed on the main page. outage. A redirect will be used when the outage involves the web To see closed items, click here sites or internet access. More details regarding an outage will be All Open Status Reports provided on linked pages. SPAM / Phishing Attacks on the October 25, 2009 - 7:14pm - October 28, 2011 A similar effort is to create web pages for all IT projects. Any person on campus will be able to go to a web page and see the Email Network following for any IT project underway (i.e. project objectives, timeline, team members, budget, status, FAQs, etc.). **COMMUNITY Promote Vibrant and Engaging Environments and Facilities** We are installing an EMR system that will enable the University to Electronic Medical Records (EMR) bill insurance companies and Medicaid/Medicare for services provided. Student Health Services, Speech Language Pathology and Audiology (SLP&A), The Center for Nursing Services, and Nutrition and Dietetics are providing these billable services today; SLP&A is the only unit that is billing. The EMR system will also be used in the Health Professions' Curriculum as well as in Sports Science and Wellness Education. The University of Akron Police Department and the City of Akron Police Dispatch – 911 Merger Police Department are partnering to share the City's Computer-Aided Dispatch and Records Management System to track and document public safety incidents. Testing within the dispatcher's office at the University continues and is being expanded to include police officers. Additionally, a new shared services arrangement is being pursued for the University to provide PC support for the city. The go-live date for use of the system is still scheduled for June 2013.

 Constituent Relationship Management (CRM)



We are working with a cross-functional team to select and implement a CRM system that will automate the student lifecycle (i.e. recruiting, admissions, advising, registration, Akron Experience, graduation, alumni and donor management). This CRM system will track all student contact and activities so service providers along the lifecycle will be informed of all prior contacts with the student, which will improve service quality.

In late December, a draft of the Request for Proposal was sent to Gartner (a technology research and advising company; www.gartner.com) for review and advice.

A conference call with Gartner in January 2013 provided a series of revisions and rewrites. A revised version was produced. As of mid-February, a final review of the RFP was being done by IT senior leadership and the interdisciplinary committee that includes representatives from the main campus and Wayne.

At present, the plan is to post the RFP by late February or early March. Once the RFP is released, it will be posted for comment for approximately one month. Responses to the RFP will be reviewed by our interdisciplinary CRM Committee.

As part of the RFP review, some respondents may be invited to campus to present their offering.

The CRM Committee will make a recommendation to the oversight committee (i.e., Sherman, Tressel, Cummins and Sage) based on the responses.

Voice Update/Strategy – AT&T contract



IT is continually looking for ways to take cost out of the services we provide. By leveraging new technology called SIP that interconnects AT&T and the University, we are going to be able to reduce our long distance costs from approximately \$300K annually to under \$100K. Telecom will be working with AT&T to implement this change over the next few months.

INTEGRATED PLANNING	Achieve Measurable Success
Campus-wide Scheduling: Series 25	The Office of University Scheduling completed processing the Summer 2013 Schedule of Classes in February with Fall 2013 Schedule of Classes to be processed in late March. Plans continue for training all space schedulers on campus to utilize 25Live to support the institution's goal of reaching 70% space utilization.
Time & Labor Absence Management	The University is working with Workforce Software to automate the processing of time collection for hours worked as well as managing the requests for planned absences. The implementation of this will eliminate the current manual, paper processes that are in place now for both non-exempt and exempt employees. The project formally kicked off in February with the definition of the requirements for the new system and is expected to continue through the summer with campus-wide use scheduled by the fall semester of this year.
Grants Management Post-Award	The Grants Post-award project tracks awards, facilities, and administration processing. It also automates billing to sponsors enabling the University to achieve the Vision 2020 goal of \$200 million in research.
	Development on reporting milestones is complete and ready to move to production. Work continues on updating the accounting chartfields to include the project chartfield required by the new grants management system. This part of the project entails alterations to our budgetary control system which will significantly decrease budget maintenance time and a realignment of restricted funds between sponsored programs and other externally funded activities which will ease the identification of all research dollars and allow for automated billing in all areas of sponsored programs.

• Enterprise Architecture

Information Technology Services (ITS) is reexamining the University's technology architecture strategy to ensure it can support and adapt rapidly to technology changes needed by the institution in order to enable Vision 2020.

A workshop was facilitated by Deloitte Consulting with technology leaders from ITS to determine requirements for creating an ITS architecture strategy. The information gathered will create the foundation for conducting interviews of ITS customers across campus that will help formulate a plan for the next three years. The outcome is expected to take advantage of the latest opportunities while balancing competing expectations for ITS services.

University of Akron Division of Student Affairs Report to the Board of Trustees March 20, 2013

Department of Student Recreation and Wellness Services (SRWS) and Department of Student Health Services (SHS)

Executive Summary

This report provides an overview of the Department of Student Recreation and Wellness Services and the Department of Student Health Services and their efforts to establish and maintain a campus culture that engages and supports the overall well-being and academic success of students. The student affairs professionals in these departments partner with numerous campus departments and community entities to ensure campus availability of programs and services that support, strengthen and enhance health and wellness while empowering students to achieve, learn and be engaged.

SRWS collected data on the number of times an undergraduate student swiped his/her University Zip Card to gain entry to the recreational facilities and compared the results to data related to undergraduate grade point average obtained from the Office of Institutional Research. The data suggests that students who frequently use the facilities also earn a higher overall GPA than their peers who do not use the facilities.

SHS continues serving our campus population for a wide range of health-care related concerns. During fall 2012 students and staff made 3,557 visits to SHS: one-third of those visits were for immunizations, laboratory tests, uncomplicated urgent wound and injury care, tuberculin testing, allergy injections, and miscellaneous consultations. Treatment for influenza-like symptoms accounted for three percent of fall semester visits.

In addition to health-care services, SHS professionals partner with academic areas providing hands-on clinical experience for nursing and athletic training students as well as medical residents.


Both SRWS and SHS engage students in programs and activities to develop a knowledge base to promote fitness and healthier lifestyles.


Student Recreation and Wellness Center (Rec Center)


The Rec Center is a state of the art facility that is dedicated to providing recreation and wellness opportunities and services for students. The 160,000+ square feet includes: five multi-purpose gymnasiums; 15,000 square feet of cardio and strength equipment; a one-tenth mile jogging track; a 54 feet tall climbing wall; a 13 feet high bouldering rock; a 96,000 gallon leisure pool; a 29 person spa/hot tub; an Outdoor Adventure Center with a variety of equipment for rent; and a Wellness Suite for nutrition, weight management and healthy lifestyle advice.


Prior to building the Rec Center students used the Ocasek Natatorium (ONAT), a 60,000 square feet facility, which includes a 50 meter by 25 yard competition swimming and diving pool, five racquetball and four racquet/wallyball courts, and about 7,000 square feet of cardio and exercise equipment. Both the Rec Center and the ONAT serve as the primary facilities offering recreation and wellness opportunities for students and other members of the University community.


To gain entry to the Rec Center and the ONAT, an internal CSI management system is used to scan and track Zip Cards. During the fall 2012 semester, in collaboration with the Office of Institutional Research, the department collected data on student usage of these two facilities to attempt to analyze the number of times an undergraduate student swiped his/her university ID to gain entry to the facilities and compare with data related to his/her academic performance, in particular their undergraduate GPA. The preliminary data results imply that students who use the facilities more frequently also earn a higher overall GPA than their peers who do not use the facilities. Figures 1 – 5 showcase data of each academic class of students who frequent the Rec Center related to their grade point average.











Department of Student Health Services (SHS)

Student Health Services provides ambulatory care for a wide variety of health-related concerns. The department's mission is to assist students in meeting their academic and personal goals by addressing their health concerns and providing quality, cost-effective, culturally competent and compassionate health care and health education.

Fall 2012 Usage




Figure 1 - Student Health Fall 2012 Visits by Diagnostic Category

During fall 2012 students and staff made 3,557 visits to SHS for health-care related concerns. Figure 1 diagnostically categorizes health concerns for which patients visited the department.

Fall 2012/Spring 2013 Influenza Update

Despite widespread media reports about the severity of the current influenza season, the number of patients presenting to SHS with influenza-like-illness has been low. Our utilization related to influenza reflects Summit County Health Department's flu surveillance data which indicates that flu cases peaked throughout the county the week of January 6. Illnesses diagnosed as influenza totaled seven in December 2012 and six in January 2013.

Fall 2013 Academic Partnerships

Striving to build an intentional culture of inclusive excellence, SHS partners with campus and community entities to assist students not only to learn about practices that support personal wellbeing and healthy lifestyles, but also to assist by providing them with the opportunity to gain hands-on clinical experiences required by their curricula.

- Staff served as community experts at the request of seven students who are enrolled in UA's BSMD program and needed background information for their scholarly paper titled: Access to Reproductive Health Care and Family Planning Services for Young Adults.
- The department provided curricula required clinical practicum experience for the following health science students:
 - Seven undergraduate nursing students
 - One graduate nurse practitioner student
 - Three athletic training students
 - Three medical residents
- Staff participated in two WZIP interviews conducted by students in the School of Communication on two health topics: 1) Risk related to smoking and 2) Prevention of respiratory viral illnesses.

Spring 2012 Learning Outcomes

In addition to obtaining diagnoses and treatment for their presenting illnesses, students gain knowledge regarding the nature of their illnesses, as well as advice to help prevent future illnesses. During the spring semester of each year, as part of the Annual Satisfaction Survey, a three item check off tool to assess the following is included:

- Knowledge gained about their health condition and associated treatment prescribed.
- Information learned about how to develop healthier lifestyle practices.
- The likelihood of student adoption of a positive lifestyle change as a result of their visit.

Spring 2012 survey results showed that respondents (N=457):

- 74 percent learned something new about their health condition and its treatment.
- 45 percent learned about a healthier lifestyle practice.
- 60 percent indicated they are likely to make a positive lifestyle change as a result of their visit.

Summary

It is commonly accepted among Student Affairs recreation and wellness professions and campus student health care providers that there is a correlation between students' health and wellness and their academic achievement and progress toward degree completion. The departments of Student Recreation and Wellness and Student Health Services continue to pursue their goal of establishing and maintaining an integrated healthy campus culture and community that ensures that health and wellness opportunities, programs and services are optimally organized to support, strengthen and enhance each student's academic success and personal development.
