REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Mr. Pogue called the meeting to order at 8:03 a.m., and the Board adjourned into executive session on an 8-0 vote for the stated purposes of— considering employment and compensation of public employees pursuant to 121.22(G)(1), meeting with legal counsel concerning litigation involving the University pursuant to 121.22(G)(3) and reviewing for collective bargaining sessions, pursuant to 121.22(G)(4). The meeting returned to public session at 10:43 a.m. on an 8-0 vote.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR

Mr. Pogue said that, with this being his last meeting as Board chair and at least one of his last as a member of this Board, he would forgo the temptation to give a recap of his 11 years on the Board. Instead, he would mention a few relevant highlights from the past 12 months.

Mr. Pogue referred to last year's presidential search process and the selection of Dr. Scarborough as the University's president. He cited Dr. Scarborough's ability to manage complex financial matters as vital and commended his innovative, strategic abilities. Mr. Pogue recalled that,

within a month of Dr. Scarborough taking office, Moody's and Fitch affirmed The University of Akron's current bond rating and described its financial outlook as stable, referring to President Scarborough's background as a plus.

Mr. Pogue said that Dr. Scarborough has delivered on high expectations, noting that the Board would consider his proposed budget with the full knowledge that some tough decisions must be made to create a platform for economic sustainability and growth. Still, this budget allows the University to invest in high-priority, strategic and mission-critical areas of the University in the years ahead by streamlining its resources and aligning expenditures to support student academic success and the University's vision for growth, he said.

Mr. Pogue said that one of the most impressive and important aspects of this budget is that it resulted from a year of effort that involved the deans and faculty of nearly every degree-granting college. They created college strategic plans that helped to form the basis for the budget. In addition, the University Council was involved, and Dr. Scarborough included faculty leaders from the AAUP union, Faculty Senate and the Chairs in his research and analysis with the University's CFO and the Budget Director.

Mr. Pogue said that the budget also reflects the implementation of new and exciting initiatives launched this spring, including:

- the Center for Experiential Learning, Entrepreneurship and Civic Engagement headed by Priceline co-founder Jeff Hoffman;
- the Center for Data Science and I.T. headed by retired Microsoft executive Dr. Mario Garzia; and
- the National Center for Choreography, a joint effort with DanceCleveland funded by a \$5million Knight Foundation grant.

Mr. Pogue added that there are some ongoing efforts that will come to fruition in the months ahead.

In conclusion, Mr. Pogue praised what Dr. Scarborough and his team have accomplished in his first year and affirmed that he has earned the Board's full support going forward.

Before giving his report, Dr. Scarborough invited Dr. Sherman to introduce two award-winning faculty members: 2015 Outstanding Teacher Dr. Robert Veillette, associate professor, Electrical and Computer Engineering, and 2015 Excellence in Community Engagement Award recipient Janice Troutman, professor, Myers School of Art. Each commented about the meaningfulness of their respective recognition.

REPORT OF THE STUDENT TRUSTEES

Mr. Hull congratulated and thanked Mr. Pogue for his years of service to the University and the students. He reported that the University's top candidates for the open Student Trustee position had begun interviewing with the governor's office.

Mr. Hull introduced student Tatiana Granger (see Appendix D), who offered remarks to the Board regarding her Akron experience. She received a commemorative clock from Trustees.

Mr. Pogue said that the Board uses a consent agenda for its proceedings and would hear a listing of each agenda item by the various committee chairs and then hold one vote on the items listed on the consent agenda. The Board would vote on any items that were not on the consent agenda right after the matters were presented.

• Quarterly Financial Report for July 2014 through March 2015 (Tab 2)

UNRESTRICTED CURRENT FUND AKRON CAMPUS

Tuition and Fees of \$250 million from both fall and spring semesters resulted in a positive budget variance of \$2.6 million. This positive variance was a result of actual enrollment for fall and spring exceeding a projected 4 percent decline, but it reflects a decrease in real dollars of approximately \$2.3 million, or 1 percent, from the prior year.

State Appropriations of \$71.2 million tracked slightly ahead of budget, a trend which was expected to continue through the remainder of the fiscal year.

Other Sources of \$14.9 million lagged projections by \$0.8 million, reflecting both positive and negative variations within this revenue category. The principal fluctuations occurred within *Departmental Sales & Services* and *Earnings on Investments*, which varied from budget by approximately -\$1.7 million and \$1.1 million, respectively.

Distributions from Endowment of \$187,000 exceeded budget by \$22,000.

Overall total revenues exceeded budget projections by nearly \$1.8 million.

Wages and Benefits of \$165.8 million reflected a budget overage of \$5.5 million. The budget overage is \$1.7 million less than that reported for this category as of February 28, 2015.

Non-Personnel expenditures of \$94.9 million exceeded the annualized budget by nearly \$1 million, reflecting both positive and negative variations within the functions. Significant fluctuations occurred within *Supplies & Services*, \$6.4 million; *Utilities*, -\$1.8 million; and *Indirect Costs and Overhead*, \$2.1 million. The *Reductions to be Determined* remained and were annualized at \$4.4 million.

Utility costs of \$8.2 million trended higher than expected by \$1.8 million through the first nine months of the fiscal year, which included extreme winter weather. The University had negotiated a new electricity contract in late fall, essentially "locking in" much better rates that would be realized over the remainder of the fiscal year.

The *Indirect Costs and Overhead* category reflected an overage of approximately \$2.1 million. The primary source of this "credit" against expenses was overhead assessed to the University's various auxiliary enterprises and Wayne College for centrally incurred costs.

Other Financing Sources: The combination of *Transfers (in)* from prior-year balances and *Transfers (out)* primarily made in support of Intercollegiate Athletics, E.J. Thomas Hall, and debt payments were represented in this category.

The General Fund's actual revenues exceeded budget by \$1.8 million, while actual expenses exceeded budget by \$6.5 million. Net transfer in/out activity was \$2.5 million less than projected through nine months.

UNRESTRICTED CURRENT FUND WAYNE COLLEGE

Tuition and Fees of \$7.7 million reflected both fall and spring collections. This amount was less than budget by \$0.84 million. The Wayne budget was based on a projected enrollment decline of 4 percent, while actual enrollment declined approximately 10 percent. The tuition and fees decline as compared to prior year approximated \$1.2 million.

State Appropriations of \$2.9 million tracked with projections, a trend which was expected to continue through the remainder of the fiscal year.

Wages and Benefits of \$5.7 million reflected a positive budget variance of \$1.6 million.

Non-Personnel expenditures of \$1.6 million were less than budget by nearly \$0.8 million.

Wayne College's actual revenues were short of budget by \$0.8 million, while actual expenses were also short of budget by \$2.4 million. Net transfer in/out activity was minimal at \$83,000 for various purchase orders initiated in 2014 but scheduled for payment in 2015.

AUXILIARY ENTERPRISES

Areas of concern at the March close continued to be Intercollegiate Athletics, InfoCision Stadium, and Residence Life and Housing. These three auxiliary operations posted a combined budget deficit of \$3.8 million. Accumulated positive balances at the end of March 2015 totaled \$3.6 million, compared to a balance of \$8.1 million on March 31, 2014.

RESTRICTED CURRENT FUND ACTIVITY

All funds received by the University for various restricted purposes (i.e., donors/external agencies), funds transferred from The University of Akron Foundation, and federal financial aid for qualifying students totaled \$70.2 million.

PLANT FUND ACTIVITY

The balance of funding sources dedicated to maintaining the University plant (i.e., capital) totaled \$14.1 million, nearly all of which had been committed for an assortment of projects (see Capital Planning and Facilities Management Report for project details).

• Quarterly Investment Report for July 2014 through March 2015 (Tab 3)

The Operating Funds posted an overall nine-month rate of return (ROR) of 0.88 percent. Investments yielded income (dividends) resulting in \$3.3 million for the nine months ended March 31, 2015.

PFM manages the Short- and Intermediate-Term Fixed Income Investments as well as a Cash and Equivalents portfolio. PFM's ROR, net of fees, aggregated 1.11 percent, or \$1.6 million [\$132.9 million average quarterly balance].

The Long-Term Investments managed by Legacy achieved a ROR of 0.88 percent. Investments yielded income (dividends) resulting in \$1.7 million [\$47.8 million average quarterly balance].

The \$3.5 million in realized income exceeded year-to-date budget of \$2.4 million by \$1.1 million.

The Endowments posted a blended ROR of -6.2 percent, or -\$3 million, for the nine months ended March 31, 2015.

The Pooled Endowments managed by Cambridge achieved an overall ROR of -3.3 percent, or -\$3.1 million [\$59.6 million average quarterly balance], while the blended return of the Separately Invested Endowments posted an overall ROR of -4.5 percent, or \$0.1 million [\$6.9 million average quarterly balance].

Of Cambridge's portfolio, iShares S&P500 ETF achieved the highest nine-month ROR at 7.1 percent [\$3.9 million balance at March 31], while the Van Eck Gold Fund achieved the lowest ROR at -34.4 percent [\$1 million balance at March 31].

The Separately Invested Endowments were invested in accord with donor stipulations. The highest ROR for the nine months ended March 31 was the Oelschlager Leadership Award portfolio, invested at Key Bank, at 5 percent on market value of \$2.2 million at March 31. The lowest ROR for the nine months ended March 31 was the ORSP endowment, invested at PNC, at -0.59 percent on market value of \$2.6 million at March 31.

• Cumulative Gift and Grant Income Report (Tab 5)

The University of Akron recorded total giving of \$41,848,392 for July 2014-April 2015. That total compares to \$40,795,496 for July 2013-April 2014 (an increase of 3 percent) and a year-to-date average of \$38,317,745 for the previous five years (an increase of 9 percent). During July 2014-April 2015, 19,842 gifts were received, as compared with 19,460 for the same period in the last fiscal year (an increase of 2 percent).

• Auburn Science and Engineering Center Exterior Façade Restoration and Lower Roofs Replacement (Tab 6)

This state-funded project at the Auburn Science and Engineering Center will consist of restoration of the worst areas of the deteriorating masonry façade and include new structural backup for the brick, tuck pointing, cleaning, and damp proofing. In addition, many of the original windows adjacent to the masonry work will be replaced to help stop water penetration into the building, and the 25- to 30-year-old roofs on the lower portions of the building will be replaced. Add Undergraduate Certificate:

Certificate in Conflict Transformation and Social Entrepreneurship offered by the Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Political Science, proposal #14-12038

In coordination with the intellectual property and entrepreneurship Achieving Distinction initiative, this new undergraduate certificate consists of 16 credit hours to be offered by the Center for Conflict Management.

Upon approval of this new certificate, the Center for Conflict Management plans to eliminate the existing certificates and minor at the undergraduate level, listed below, to focus resources on student success through one new certificate.

Delete Undergraduate Certificates:

Beginning in fall 2015, suspend admission to, with the intention to eventually eliminate, six undergraduate-level certificates offered by the Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences, proposal #14-11094:

Beginning in fall 2015, suspend admission to, with the intention to eventually eliminate, the Minor in Conflict Management offered by the Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences, proposal #14-11094.

Mr. Pogue said that he had one final bit of business to conduct in his capacity as Chairman of the Board, to name Dr. Scott Scarborough and Mr. Larry Burns as The University of Akron's representatives on the board of the National Center for Choreography, the University's new, cooperative venture with DanceCleveland that is being funded by Knight Foundation.

Mr. Pogue asked whether there were any other announcements by Trustees for the good of the order. Mr. Pogue said the next regular meeting of the Board would occur on August 12, 2015 in the Student Union, with an executive session to begin at 7:30 or 8 a.m. Committee meetings would be held on August 3.

<u>RESOLUTION 6-20-15</u>: Expression of Appreciation to Chairman of the Board Richard Welch Pogue

WHEREAS, Richard Welch Pogue was appointed to the Board of Trustees of The University of Akron by former Governor Bob Taft in 2004 for a limited term, then reappointed in 2006 for a nine-year term ending on July 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, he has served the Board with distinction in a variety of roles, including—Chair of the Board, 2012-15; Vice Chair of the Board, 2009-12; Committee Chair of Audit & Compliance (2005-12), Nominating (2009-11), Rules (2006-10), and Strategic Issues (2010-12); and representative to the boards of the University's philanthropic and research foundations during his 11-year tenure; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pogue's beneficence to the University includes generous philanthropic support to multiple University initiatives, most recently his significant gift for the Luis Proenza Endowed Chair in Higher Education and the Economy, and his broad commitment to higher education is reflected by his service as chair the Ohio Governor's Commission on Higher Education & the Economy in 2003-04 and being a founding trustee of the Ohio Business Alliance on Higher Education and the Economy; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pogue, a native of Cambridge, Massachusetts, received a bachelor of arts degree from Cornell University and a law degree from the University of Michigan, and served as a first lieutenant in the U.S. Army's Patents Division of the Judge Advocate General's Pentagon office; and

WHEREAS, his remarkable professional career encompasses a half-century of service with the law firm of Jones Day and its predecessors where he rose from positions as Associate through Partner, Managing Partner, Senior Partner and Senior Advisor, as well as a decade of leadership with Dix & Eaton as Senior Advisor and Director; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pogue's renown as a visionary leader for Northeast Ohio is singular, as evinced by his involvement on many corporate and civic boards, his service to charitable, arts and educational foundations and funds, and by prestigious accolades and honors granted to him, all far too numerous to equitably enumerate; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED That the Board of Trustees of The University of Akron expresses its deep appreciation to Richard Welch Pogue for the leadership and devotion he has shown in fulfilling his duties to the Board and its constituents, and wishes him and his family well for the future; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the title of Chair Emeritus be awarded to him in recognition of his invaluable leadership, selfless dedication and service, and exemplary achievements.

I would like to begin by saying that it has been an honor to serve as president under Mr. Richard Pogue's leadership as Chair of the Board. A good friend of mine once said that I would be very lucky to have Mr. Pogue as Chair, and he certainly was correct. I appreciate having had the opportunity to serve with him.

Recent Recognitions and Events

Adding to the earlier wonderful examples of our faculty, let me mention that, on the research side, Dr. Matthew Becker was recently recognized for the 2015 Young Investigator of the Year Award. It is an international award from the American Chemical Society Journal with a \$3,000 prize to a researcher 40 years of age or younger who has made a major impact on polymer science. One innovation that is attributable to Matt is the polymer tube that acts like scaffolding for the body to re-grow bones. Dr. Becker has presented to the Board in the past. He, again, is just another outstanding example of our faculty and the tripartite mission of the University: teaching, research and service.

Another reason to celebrate is The University of Akron School of Law, which was ranked in the top 50 by the online law publication, Above the Law. Akron was the only Northeast Ohio university, public or private, to make the list. The only other Ohio institution was that little school in Columbus. What makes this ranking interesting and particularly applicable to a lot of what we have talked about recently is that this is the only ranking that incorporates the American Bar Association's employment data to show how a school delivers on a promise of gainful employment, that polytechnic connection to industry. Though it is nice to see the law school recognized, we also have an early indication that law school applications are up, which is also nice. We have new leadership there and a great, great faculty that has rallied behind new leadership, so we are very pleased about what is happening in the law school.

Three faculty members in the Myers School of Art have been recognized. Matthew Kolodziej, Sherry Simms and Dave Szalay each received an Ohio Arts Council Individual Excellence Award with a \$5,000 prize.

The University received a \$736,000 National Science Foundation small business innovation research grant to commercialize adhesive research. Dr. Shing-Chung "Josh" Wong and Barry Rosenbaum of the University of Akron Research Foundation co-founded Akron Ascent Innovations, the company that created a new adhesive that is strong but easy to peel off and does not leave marks. A grant will allow production-scale testing of this new technology.

Biomedical Engineering graduate students Kathleen Stitzlein and Mariam Crow won the \$10,000 Launchtown Entrepreneurship Award for developing a device called the "Cannibuster." They competed against other teams of student entrepreneurs from Kent State and Case Western Reserve. The Cannibuster (named as a play on the scientific word for marijuana, cannabis) will enable police to do quick, accurate roadside tests for marijuana use by drivers. The story has been picked up by national media and late-night TV hosts.

Since we last met, we conferred 3,000 degrees on candidates from 32 states and 28 countries at spring commencement ceremonies. History was made on Saturday, May 9, when the first graduates of the Corrosion Engineering program received that baccalaureate degree.

Also in May, the 2015 Alumni Day dinner was a wonderful, cozy evening. We honored alumni Mary Taylor, Vernon Sykes and Laura Thompson (from Goodyear) and presented Honorary Alumni Awards to Alberto Ibargüen (of Knight Foundation) and Tim Stover (of Akron General Health System). Outgoing Board Chairman Pogue was also recognized at that event, which of course made it very special. All the honorees were sincerely grateful.

Lastly, as a reminder in terms of announcements and good news, there is certainly a lot of focus on Akron hero LeBron James and his Cleveland Cavaliers teammates in the NBA finals. But I also would like to share a little of that hometown support with some other Akron athletes. Today through Friday, a school-record 11 men and women student athletes are in Eugene, Oregon to compete in the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. Shawn Barber, our recordbreaking pole vaulter, is probably the most well known and will compete this evening at 7 p.m. For those of you who can stay up that late after last night's NBA game, that is west coast time. Shawn truly is a remarkable athlete; we are sending him and his teammates best wishes all the way to Eugene, Oregon.

Work Over the Last Year

So that is the good news. I want to put in context what the last year, leading up to today's action items, has really been like. We are only 20 days away from the end of this fiscal year. The first three months were spent getting to know the region, the University's finances and the higher education landscape of Northeast Ohio. The second three months were dedicated to working with all of our colleges, and we completed new strategic plans for nine of our eleven colleges; the last two will be done this summer. Beginning in earnest in January, we began working on this operating budget that you hold in your hands today. Just a note on the process itself, over the last really six months going back to before the beginning of the year, literally hundreds of people have touched this document by participating in the process that led to its completion. While I cannot recognize everyone, I would be remiss not to recognize a few people who I want to thank especially, beginning with a person who you probably don't see very often. Amy Gilliland is our very quiet and behind-the-scenes budget director. Congratulations, Amy, and thank you. She literally coordinated all of the numbers and all of the processes ongoing.

Nathan Mortimer, our new CFO, has been instrumental in bringing a fresh, and in some cases independent, set of eyes to new issues.

I want to thank the members of the University Council Budget and Finance Committee. They made a lot of progress last year. I think they would say that it was a good process but not a perfect process this year because we spent so much time working on it that it pushed the timeline to the very end of the academic year, which was not ideal. Because we were literally rebuilding the budget from scratch, it took longer than we anticipated. But, in an institution like this that is

based in a culture of shared governance, their input, their feedback, their thoughts, their comments were critical to getting the kind of support necessary to move forward in a productive and an effective way. That is our official, shared governance process, which is followed by the Committee's recommendation to the University Council.

I also would like to recognize some people who were part of the informal process, and to me, this was probably the part that I touched most directly, because as I was learning the budget from start to finish, I invited three other individuals to join me on that journey. For six months, every week, for typically around three hours a week, not only did I meet with Amy Gilliland to learn the budget, but I also invited Bill Rich, president of Faculty Senate, Steve Weeks, president of the AAUP, and Matt Lee, the department chair representing all other department chairs on the University Budget and Finance Committee, to sit with Amy and me in my office to go through every single budget at the institution. We tried to build the budget and understand the budget in a way that enabled us to link strategic priorities to resource allocation. I'll let those individuals speak for themselves; I'm certainly not going to try to quote them, but I'll express my opinion that this process will lay a foundation that will serve this University well going into the future.

Not only do I understand the budget now, but I think those three leaders understand the budget better than they ever have in the past, and there was no issue that was off base. Whatever data I wanted to see or they wanted to see, we saw. Everyone was asked for thoughts and opinions about how to deal with a very challenging public higher education environment. Many times they would take my ideas or they would improve them with their thoughts. Other times we would ask for their ideas and incorporate them into the budget. I would never say that they are responsible for anything in the budget—that is my responsibility to then recommend to the Board—but, I will say that the experience and the relationship in practicing the spirit of shared governance is probably more important to me personally than the letter of shared governance. So to Bill Rich, Steve Weeks and Matt Lee, I offer my thanks.

To the vice presidents and deans who have gone through the budget hearings and the very difficult conversations on setting priorities, they will be key as we move forward, because it is one thing to plan (but) the real work begins now that the planning document is about to be approved. The real work is in the implementing, the additional due diligence, the taking of parameters and then finding solutions within those parameters, not just thinking through the issue in a theoretical sense but in a personal sense because all these issues touch real human beings. And so it is those vice presidents and deans working with their faculty and staff throughout this fiscal year who will ultimately really make the difference. To all of them, for what they have done and what they will do, I offer my thanks.

2015-16 Budget

There are some important things to say about the budget. It does balance, in that it is cash-flow positive by a single dollar. There is a one-dollar bottom line. It is not the ideal budget; it is a major improvement on the way to something that we hope will be ideal, and I think if we get a little help from friends and legislators, we can get to that ideal, sustainable model. But the one thing that we feel really good about I think is that it is a very positive step forward.

The 2015-16 budget includes a \$10.4 million pool for new strategic initiatives. This is the pool of money that we have appropriated in the budget to fund the new college strategic plans and to fund some of the initiatives that we have already announced within our strategy to become Ohio's Polytechnic University. One is the new GenEd Core courses that we are beginning to offer this fall. Also included are the New Center for Data Science and IT and the new Center for Experiential Learning, Entrepreneurship and Civic Engagement.

Announcement of Major New Program

That strategic initiative pool will also fund a new initiative that we have been working on for a while, and which I am pleased to announce today, a Success Coach for every new student. This new program builds on success-coaching pilot programs at the University going all the way back to 2009 and will expand to every new student, and ultimately to every student, at The University of Akron. The program will provide mentoring and advising to students in very proactive ways. It will target students who are under prepared or who are at risk because of other demographics. It will ensure that there is a success coach for every entering freshman in the fall of 2015. The coaches will work closely with academic advisors and others to stay connected to the students from the moment they enter the University all the way to graduation, so even if a student changes majors and possibly academic advisors, the student's success coach will remain the same throughout. The success coach will help the student with time management, exam preparation, financial planning, early career planning and connection to important University services that have always been available but are sometimes not accessed at the right time, such as tutoring and counseling services,. The success coach will monitor the student based on data analytics and personal contact and connect that student on a timely basis to those services that will help to improve retention.

We are not reinventing the wheel. We are building this program based not only on past pilots here but also on successful programs at other universities. One longstanding example is Central Michigan University's success coach program. We have learned from their experience and looked at their data, which suggest this really does make a difference. We are confident that this is the right investment for some of our strategic initiative budget pool to ultimately help students persist and succeed.

We will have more information available to those who are interested in this major new program. As Mr. Pogue said, there will be "more to come," because again, we spent nine months planning at the college and University levels. We will systematically, as we do the appropriate due diligence, implement these new initiatives at the appropriate time to build this great University for the future.

No Increase in Undergraduate Tuition

The 2015-16 budget includes no increase in undergraduate tuition, housing and meal costs for our undergraduates. Again, the new budget assumes no increase in the sticker price of undergraduate tuition, no increase in student housing and meal plan rates. It also includes a provision that will extend what is called the plateau, so students will not be charged tuition for taking additional credit hours beyond 13 credit hours per semester all the way up to 18 credit

hours per semester. So if a student enrolls in from 13 to 18 credit hours, those are free, no additional tuition. In the past, the plateau was up to 16; this expands it from 16 to 18 as another way to lower cost. This is again, a way of lowering cost to encourage degree completion. It is part of, and also consistent with, the new funding formula that rewards outcomes—graduation and course completion.

Ongoing Initiatives

This budget also includes the assumption of the new GenEd courses at \$50 per semester credit hour. Enrollment has begun for the first six of those courses being offered at about one-half the cost of the comparable community college rate. Courses offered for this fall include English Composition I, Earth Science, Introduction to Sociology, Basic Statistics, Principles of Microeconomics, and Exploring Music: Bach to Rock (a very popular course, I am told). Again, at \$50 per semester credit hour, this initiative promotes access and makes those very economically affordable courses available at a time when students are most academically at risk, at the beginning of their college careers. That is the one objective we are trying to accomplish, and this budget does that.

As I stated earlier, this budget funds the college strategic plans and new centers, which were previously announced as the beginning of a substantive rollout of new initiatives within the polytechnic strategy that would build on and increase the University's historical strengths. Today, we formally recommend the following appointments, which will also increase the diversity of our leadership team.

- Dr. Mario R. Garzia, a University of Akron alumnus and Hispanic, as executive director of the Center for Data Sciences and Information
- Mr. Jeff Hoffman, as executive in residence and founding director of the Center for Experiential Learning, Entrepreneurship and Civic Engagement
- Dr. Lakeesha K. Ransom, an African-American female with a great track record and leadership skills, as dean of the Honors College

The Honors College is one of the initiatives that we are continuing to develop, and once the new dean is here and we complete the Honors College strategic plan, we will roll that out as further proof of our moving forward to become a great public university for Northeast Ohio.

Lastly, I would say that, while the undergraduate cost for tuition and meal plan and board are not being raised, the budget does include graduate tuition increases in some programs. In some cases graduate tuition will remain flat, most notably in professional programs, business law and health professions. In other graduate programs, for example in sciences and engineering, the tuition will increase, but these programs have a higher instructional cost associated with them. Despite our best attempts to try to hold the pricing of those, we believe we need to recoup some of those instructional costs to maintain the academic quality in those programs. But, these are the same programs that afford graduates some of the highest job placement rates, so the return on

investment for students who finish these degree programs is quite high. We believe that by continuing to offer these programs at the rate that we need to maintain quality, students will realize a positive return on their investment with the great job offers that come through these programs. And most of these programs have internships and co-op experiences that help to secure a very high job placement rate.

So those are the highlights, the initiatives that will be funded by the \$10.4 million strategic initiative pool. The principle that we have employed in putting together this budget is that we are fully funding our high-strategic priorities and our mission-critical areas, and then we are funding other areas up to available funds.

Conclusion

There is much more work to do. We will continue working during Fiscal Year 2016 as we implement the budget to roll it out. I would conclude in saying it was a late night for many of us last night, but what was so wonderful about that is it was just a reminder of what extraordinary people with an extraordinary vision can do with extraordinary work ethic and what a team can ultimately accomplish. I think we are all thankful to the Cavs no matter what happens just for reminding us of what is important if you can employ those principles in whatever you do. I think that is what we strive to do at The University of Akron.

APPENDIX D: INTRODUCTIONS - FEATURED STUDENT

TATIANA GRANGER

A recent MBA graduate of The University of Akron, Tatiana Granger is a native of Kursk, Russia. She first came to the United States in 2007 on a one-year scholarship to the University of Mount Union, where she met her future husband, Doug.

After a year at Mount Union, Tatiana returned to Russia to complete her B.A. degree in Linguistics and Foreign Languages. She graduated Summa Cum Laude and promptly was hired as a teacher of English and French.

Tatiana's time in Russia was brief, however. Having won a Fulbright Scholarship to teach at the University of Evansville, Tatiana returned to America once again, but this time as an educator herself. It was during her year as a Fulbright at UE that Tatiana took her first business class, Fundamentals of Entrepreneurship, which led her to pursue an MBA.

Coming from a family of teachers, Tatiana always had been a good student. However, having come from a humanities background, Tatiana found the math-intensive GMAT business entrance exam radically different than anything she had faced before. Therefore, she was accepted to our College of Business Administration as a "provisional student." When she called the Graduate School to ask what "provisional" meant, an advisor said a provisional student was ineligible for graduate assistantships and had to maintain a 3.0 grade point average for two semesters before becoming a fully-admitted student.

Tatiana says that, at that moment, she realized she would have to work to her fullest potential to prove that her new career in business was the right choice.

Exhibit 1

3359-11-15 Reemployment procedures for retirees other than retirees who elected to retire under a university of Akron early retirement incentive program for all employees other than bargaining unit faculty.

This rule shall apply to all employees other than members of a bargaining unit in which an agreement governs the reemployment of retirees.

- (A) Am. Sub. Senate Bill 144, effective September 14, 2000, and other relevant sections of the Revised Code facilitate the reemployment of qualified STRS Ohio benefit recipients by removing past restrictions on this process. These changes to Ohio law permit qualified retirees from the university of Akron the opportunity to retire and begin receiving their personal annuity benefits and be reemployed full-time with the university of Akron at no additional cost to the university of Akron.
- (B) Full-time university of Akron employees other than members of a bargaining unit who are eligible to retire from an Ohio pension system affected by the enactment of Am. Sub. Senate Bill 144 may seek an agreement with the university of Akron, in advance of retirement, to be reemployed full- or part-time with the university of Akron as permitted by law in the same or similar position following retirement, without the necessity of a formal search process under the university's affirmative action plan. All such agreements shall be reduced to writing and shall be subject to prior approval by the board of trustees. This rule shall not be deemed to obligate the board to approve any such agreement or to create any right to such reemployment or expectancy of reemployment or expectancy of any right to reemployment for any employee or retiree of the university of Akron.
- (C) Such reemployment agreements, in the case of tenured or tenure-track faculty, shall expressly provide that tenure and any right or expectancy to obtain tenure shall terminate upon the employee's retirement; and any such reemployment with the university of Akron thereafter shall not include any grant of tenure or any expectancy or other entitlement whatsoever to obtain tenure as a result of reemployment or otherwise. Any period of reemployment shall not count or in any way be used to count toward the obtainment of tenure at the university of Akron. The reemployed retiree shall be entitled to retain the appropriate academic rank achieved upon retirement.
- (D) Unless otherwise approved by the board of trustees, such reemployment agreements shall include the following in addition to any other specific provisions that may be included in any agreement:
 - The term of any reemployment agreement. A non-renewable term of one year, except that the board of trustees, on the recommendation of the president and

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provost, may renew for successive one year terms reemployment agreements for faculty whose peer-reviewed research and scholarship is recognized nationally and internally to be preeminent, has a history of service to the university, and from whose presence on the faculty the university derives an immeasurable benefit.

- (2) The employee shall be eligible to enroll in the university's group health insurance and other benefits programs in the same manner as all other similarly situated university of Akron employees.
- (3) Reemployment agreements entered into after January 1, 2012, shall provide that eighty percent (80%) of the greater of (a) the retiree's annual base salary at retirement or (b) the retiree's annual base salary at June 30, 2015 shall be the maximum amount of retiree's base salary upon reemployment, prorated for any reemployment period. If the retiree is reemployed on a part-time basis, the retiree's maximum salary will be eighty percent (80%) of the greater of (a) the retiree's prorated annual base salary at retirement or (b) the retiree's prorated annual base salary at June 30, 2015. Retirees who have been reemployed prior to January 1, 2012, shall not be eligible for any increase in annual base salary after January 1, 2012.
- (4) Nothing in this rule shall preclude the president of the university from recommending a reemployed retiree receive:
 - (a) A stipend for additional duties or responsibilities;
 - (b) A bonus, or other such award for merit; or
 - (c) Any other amount based on employee performance.

However, such additional amounts, if approved by the board of trustees, shall not be considered or made a part of the reemployed retiree's base salary.

- (E) These procedures shall not be available to employees or former employees of the university of Akron who elected to retire from the university of Akron through participation in an early retirement incentive program (ERIP).
 - (1) Definitions.
 - (a) "Superannuate" means a former teacher receiving a service retirement allowance under section 3307.58 or 3307.59 of the Revised Code from the state teachers retirement system (STRS) or a combined service retirement benefit paid in accordance with section 3307.57 of the Revised Code, regardless of which retirement system is paying the benefit.

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- (b) "Other system retirant" means a member or former member of the public employees retirement system (PERS), police and firemen's disability and pension fund, school employees retirement system (SERS), state highway patrol system, or Cincinnati retirement system who is receiving age and service or commuted age and service retirement, or a disability benefit from a system of which he is a member or former member.
- (2) State teachers retirement system (STRS).
 - (a) The university of Akron may employ a superannuate or other system retirant as a teacher. (R.C. 3307.35(B)).
 - (b) Any superannuate or other system retirant employed as a teacher at the university of Akron shall contribute to the state teachers retirement system. (R.C. 3307.35(C)).

Any superannuate or other system retirant who has received retirant benefits for less than two months shall forfeit the allowance or benefit for any month the superannuate or retirant is employed prior to the expiration of such period. (R.C. 3307.35(F)).

- (3) School employees retirement system (SERS).
 - (a) A public employer may employ a SERS retirant or other system retirant and, if so employed, the retirant must contribute to SERS. (R.C. 3309.341(B)(1)).
 - (b) A SERS retirant or other system retirant who has received his or her retirement allowance or disability benefit for less than two months when reemployment begins will forfeit his or her retirement allowance or disability benefit for the period that begins on the date the employment commences and ends on the date that is two months after the date on which the retirement allowance or disability commenced, (R.C. 3309.341(C)).
- (4) Public employees retirement system (PERS).
 - (a) A PERS retirant who has received a retirement allowance for less than two months when employment begins will forfeit the allowance for the period that begins on the date the employment begins and ends on the date that is two months after that date on which the retirement allowance began. (R.C. 145.38(B)(4)).
 - (b) A PERS retirant who enters into a contract to provide services as an independent contractor to the employer by which the retirant was employed at the time of retirement or, less than two months after the

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retirement allowance commences, begins providing services as an independent contractor pursuant to a contract with another public employer, will forfeit the pension portion of the retirement benefit for the period beginning the first day of the month following the month in which the service begin and ending on the first day of the month following the month in which the services end R.C. 145.38(B)(6).

Guide to Terminology Used in Personnel Reports

Term	Definition/Explanation
Adjunct Appointment	Appointment to a full-time or part-time position, normally without pay. Individuals in this category are affiliated with the University for a specific purpose usually involving academic research/teaching. Appointment provides the individual with access to University systems/services as determined by the department/college.
Appointment	New hire of an individual to an approved Faculty, Contract Professional or Staff position. The appointment can be full-time or part-time, temporary or regular.
Department/School Chair	Faculty member appointed to provide leadership to an academic department or school within a college. Department/School Chair appointments normally cover the entire academic year (12-month appointment). A Faculty member's salary will be converted from 9-month to 12-month status using an approved formula to reflect the additional time worked. A stipend (currently calculated as 1/11 th of the converted salary) is awarded for assuming the additional responsibilities of a Department/School Chair. 1/10 th of the stipend is converted to base each year that the individual serves as a Department/School Chair.
Discharge	Involuntary termination of appointment.
Job Audit/Reclassification	Under University Rule 3359-25-10 the University may initiate audits and reviews of positions and classifications within the approved University Classified (3359-25-06) and Unclassified (3359-25-07) classification plans. In addition, employees may submit a request to determine if their current position is appropriately classified. The employee submits a Position Description Audit Questionnaire (PDAQ) to their immediate supervisor to initiate the job audit process. The immediate supervisor and second level supervisor are required to review and approve the information submitted on the PDAQ. Once the PDAQ is approved, it is submitted to the Classification Unit in Talent Development & Human Resources. The Classification Unit will review the PDAQ and determine if the position is appropriately classified or not. If the Classification Unit determines that the position is not classification. The recommendation will be reviewed and approved by the employee's management up to and including the appropriate Vice President. The approved recommendation will then be submitted to the University's Board of Trustees for approval.

Leave Without Compensation	If an employee is unable to work due to a documented medical condition or for other approved reasons and they have exhausted all accrued sick leave, vacation leave and compensatory time that they are entitled to use, the employee may continue their approved absence from work without pay and will retain status as a University employee.
Market Increase	The Classification unit in Talent Development & Human Resources will, upon request from a dean or vice president, conduct a market evaluation of a position or positions to determine if the University is providing an appropriate level of compensation. If it is determined that the current level of compensation is below the established market, a recommendation will be made to adjust the current level of compensation.
Merit Increase	Increase in pay granted for meeting established performance criteria.
Non-Renewal	Separation of employment of a Contract Professional employee without cause in accordance with the requirements established in University Rule 3359-22-01. The University is required to provide notice in writing to the affected Contract Professional employee. If the individual has two years or less service with the University, they will receive three months' notice. If the individual has more than two years of service, six months' notice is required.
Offline Salary Adjustment	Increase in salary that occurs outside of annual salary review process. Recommendations for offline salary adjustments are submitted by the appropriate Vice President to Talent Development & Human Resources for review and approval. Offline salary adjustments are normally recommended when specific market (internal or external) or equity (internal) issues exist with an individual's salary. Offline increases may also be recommended as a result of a reorganization involving a change in responsibilities.
Probationary Removal	Classified civil service employees are required to serve and successfully complete a probationary period following any initial appointment into a classified civil service position. If an employee's service is found to be unsatisfactory, the employee may be removed from the position at any time during the probationary period. The length of the probationary period is 120 days for classified civil service employees/CWA bargaining- unit employees and one year for Police Officers in the FOP bargaining unit. A probationary classified civil service employee duly removed for unsatisfactory service does not have the right to appeal the removal to the State Personnel Board of Review. A probationary bargaining unit employee is not permitted to appeal the removal decision under the terms of the collective bargaining agreements.

Promotion	The movement of an employee from one position to another budgeted position at a higher classification and pay range; or a higher salary where a pay range does not exist. The former position becomes vacant.
Resignation	A voluntary termination of employment.
Salary Basis Change	A change in appointment status for an employee, 12-month to 9-month or vice-versa.
Status Change	A change in pay group, job family or job function.
Stipend	Contract Professional and non-bargaining unit staff employees may receive a temporary stipend for substantial increases in responsibility for activities outside of the normal scope of the employee's assigned classification (University Rule 3359-11-12.1). Full-time Faculty may receive a stipend for primarily administrative functions requiring substantial increases in responsibility and for activities not included in the ordinary load of teaching, research, and professional service for full- time faculty (University Rule 3359-11-12).
Supplemental	Additional compensation provided for completion of assigned job responsibilities.
Temporary Appointment	An appointment for a limited period of time with a specific beginning and ending date.
Tenure Change	A change to the date for tenure eligibility for a full-time faculty member in a tenure-track position.
Title Change	An employee remains in their budgeted position, but the title changes and there may be an increase in salary. No vacancy is created by the move.
Transfer	Lateral move of an employee from one department to another department, where the employee stays in the same classification.
Training/Apprenticeship	The Collective Bargaining Agreement between the University and the Communication Workers of America contains language in Addendum A that authorizes the Office of Talent Development & Human Resources to develop and administer a Job Enrichment and Apprenticeship Program for CWA bargaining-unit employees. Employees selected to participate in the program are given an opportunity to expand their knowledge and skills. In return, these employees are provided with an increase in pay to reflect the expanded knowledge/skill set that they have developed. All increases in pay are awarded in accordance with approved Wage Progression Schedule.

SUMMARY

Operating Funds

The Operating Funds posted an overall twelve-month rate of return (ROR) of 1.0 percent. Investments yielded income (e.g. dividends, unrealized activity) resulting in \$3.4 million for the twelve months ended June 30, 2015.

PFM manages the Short- and Intermediate-Term Fixed Income Investments as well as a Cash & Equivalents portfolio. PFM's ROR, net of fees, aggregated 0.9 percent; the investments yielded income (e.g. dividends, unrealized activity) resulting in \$1.6 million [\$127.1 million average quarterly balance].

The Long-Term investments managed by Legacy achieved a ROR of 1.8 percent; the investments yielded income (e.g. dividends, unrealized activity) resulting in \$1.8 million [\$47.8 million average quarterly balance].

The \$4.5 million in realized income exceeded year-to-date budget of \$3.2 million by \$1.3 million.

Endowments

The Endowments posted a blended ROR of (6.6) percent, or (\$3.4) million, for the twelve months ended June 30, 2015.

The Pooled Endowments managed by Cambridge achieved an overall ROR of (3.5) percent, or (\$3.0) million [\$58.2 million average quarterly balance], while the blended return of the Separately Invested Endowments posted an overall ROR of (6.3) percent, or (\$0.4) million [\$6.8 million average quarterly balance].

Of Cambridge's portfolio, iShares S&P500 ETF achieved the highest twelve month ROR at 7.3 percent [\$3.9 million balance at June 30], while the Van Eck Gold Fund achieved the lowest ROR at (33.9) percent [\$1 million balance at June 30].

The Separately Invested Endowments were invested in accord with donor stipulations. The highest ROR for the twelve months ended June 30 was the Oelschlager Leadership Award portfolio, invested at Key Bank, at 6.8 percent on market value of \$2.0 million at June 30. The lowest ROR for the twelve months ended June 30 was the Constitutional Law endowment, invested at Key Bank, at (6.3) percent on market value of \$1.1 million at June 30.





Gifts & Transfers, Net

Most Gifts & Transfers to the University have been given in support of existing University endowments.

Endowment Distributions

Distributions made from the endowments based on spending policy, which is 5% of a 3-year moving average.

Administrative Fee

A 1% fee is assessed by the University to all pooled endowments. The proceeds of this fee help to fund the Scholarship for Excellence.

Investment Fees

Represents known advisor, manager, and custodial fees. The fees do not represent all investment costs as some fees are imbedded within investments, net of returns, and are not readily determinable.




We are engaged in significant changes to improve Graduate Admissions and Financial Aid:

- Eliminated backlog of admission offers to master's candidates from -221 in April to +51 in July.
- Conversion process now in place to migrate from ineffective application lacking reports to new online program, which includes a CRM.
- Initiated the process to update 20-year-old admission criteria.
- Conducted a preliminary review by outside consultants to improve graduate admission and financial aid.
- Submitted an RFP to engage in restructure of admissions and financial aid.
- Creating new viewbook, print materials and social media, and we are updating the website.

- Initiated admitted student outreach by requesting college outreach to invite them to receive advising and register for fall.
- Compiled "Programs of Distinction" documents for each program to be used in marketing/messaging.
- Created new admission and program reports, now available to campus colleagues via

SharePoint.

- Meetings with colleges to discuss new centralized approach for master's and select doctoral programs (audiology and doctor of nursing practice)
- Increased fall enrollment, as follows:




MASTER'S AND Ph.D. HEADCOUNT


Undergraduate enrollment for fall

We have achieved the following:

- Expanded undergraduate recruitment outreach inside and outside Ohio resulting in record-breaking 21,000 applications (up from 18,700 in fall 2014; up from 13,500 in fall 2013).
- Increased fall 2015 entering honors enrollment, which stands at 609 as of July 22, 2015, compared to 581 as of July 23, 2014. This is following a record-breaking fall 2014 entering class that exceed the prior year by more than 200 additional honors students.
- Increased daily information sessions visits 25% compared to last year.
- Maintained average ACT/GPA.
- Increased entering freshman class enrollment compared to last year (see tables below).



Total Undergraduate Headcount







COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS WILL BE ALUMNI For the first time in more than 15 years, alumni will speak at commencement. On August 15, Ohio Lt. Governor Mary Taylor, who earned a bachelor's degree in accounting in 1990 and a master's degree in taxation in 1998, will address the morning graduates; and Ohio State Representative Nick Celebrezze, who serves as the assistant house democratic leader and graduated with a BA in political science in 2000, will serve as the afternoon speaker.

THE ROCK, UNCOVERED

We posted a story on Facebook about one of UA's most well-known traditions, The Rock, going "au naturel," and it reached an audience of nearly 79,000!

A campus landmark for nearly 80 years, The Rock got its first coat of paint around 1960. Now, 55 years and 3,500 cans of spray paint later, four inches of paint were removed by the Geosciences Club, exposing an engraved "1880." Interested alumni – and others – are receiving a piece of the layered paint, along with a short history of The Rock. The Facebook post spurred the sharing of numerous memories and pictures by alumni who had taken part in a rock painting over the years. In all, the FB post received more than 2,000 likes, 500 comments, and 521 shares.

Finally, the rock was set on campus on May 1880. The rock, which was boldly engraved stood firm for eight decades until it stood i way of progress. While the foundation of Z was being dug in September 1961, a const crew had to use a structural steel crane to the 1880 rock about 30 yards to a spot jus of Knight Hall, later renamed Crouse Hall.

The rock stood for nearly 80 years before it was first painted (around 1960 55 years and 3,500 cans of spray paint later, 4 inches of paint were remov the rock was restored back to its original state exposing the engraved "18 May 20, 2015.







INTRODUCTION

On May 7, 2015, The University of Akron School of Law faculty unanimously approved a proposal to institute a graduate level Master of Studies in Law (MSL) degree. This new degree program is designed as non-professional degree intended to educate individuals who are not interested in an three-year professional *juris doctor* (JD) degree about the law, legal methods, and legal institutions. It resembles programs already in place at various law schools around the state, region, and country including The Ohio State University, Cleveland State University, The University of Dayton, and the University of Pittsburgh.

The law impacts every facet of society. In fact, many regularly apply laws and regulations in their workplace or commonly interact with legal professionals. It is anticipated that the MSP will appeal to patent agents, engineers, and scientists desiring to acquire knowledge about intellectual property law. Public servants (government officials, court employees, law enforcement officers, etc.), paralegals, bank employees, human resource specialists, health care professionals, entrepreneurs, and others could benefit from studying the law. These individuals would have the opportunity to pursue legal studies in specialty areas such as health law, business law, human resources, estate planning, real estate, alternative dispute resolution, and international business. The flexibility of the MSP would also enable students to craft a degree with courses of their choice.

OUTLINE OF THE DEGREE PROGRAM

The fundamental requirements and curriculum of the MSL degree program will be as follows:

Admissions Criteria: The law school will evaluate applications for the MSL program based on an applicant's ability to perform graduate level work and to participate in law school classes in a manner that will not interfere with the ability of the law school to operate in compliance with the ABA Standards. The goal underlying the admissions criteria is enhancement of the classroom and our program of legal education. More specifically, in evaluating an application for admission, the Admissions Committee will consider undergraduate work, extracurricular activities, employment experience, and other achievements. The LSAT will not be required. MSL degree candidates will be required to submit the following materials to apply for the program:

- (1) Transcripts for all undergraduate and graduate work (must show completion of Bachelor's Degree (*i.e.*, BA, BS, or foreign equivalent)
- (2) Resume
- (3) Personal Statement describing interest in the program and aptitude to succeed at a graduate level
- (4) Two letters of recommendation
- (5) If not a native English speaker, satisfactory demonstration of English fluency

Matriculation Date: Fall semester or spring semester.

<u>Credit hours</u>: 26 credit hours. These can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis.

<u>Required courses</u>: MSL students will be integrated in with JD students in all courses except for the online Introduction to the American Legal System course.

- (1) *Introduction to the American Legal System* (2 credits). This would be a new course focused on introducing non-lawyers to the basic features and operation of the American legal system. Although this course has not been offered to date, it has been designed for delivery in an online format. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Dean or his/her designee depending on the background of the student.
- (2) At least one course from the following list of *core law courses* (the student must fulfill this requirement during his/her first semester of studies):
 - Torts Contracts Property Criminal Law Civil Procedure I or II Introduction to Intellectual Property Law (traditional or executive format)
- (3) *Elective Courses*: The remaining credit hours will be composed of electives chosen by the student based on an established "track" of courses in a particular subject area, or an individualized course of study created in consultation with the student's advisor. Subject areas of potential study included administrative and regulatory law, alternative dispute resolution, business law, constitutional law, criminal law, employment and human resources law, entrepreneurship, estate planning, family law, finance law, health law, intellectual property law, international law, local government law, tax, and others. MSL students may enroll in all first-year and upper-division courses at the law school to satisfy the elective requirement.
- (4) *Optional Thesis*: Students would be permitted, but not required, to pursue an independent study course with a faculty as part of the electives.

- (5) *Non-Law Electives*: Students would be permitted to take up to 9 of their elective credit hours in graduate-level coursework in other departments of the University outside of the law school so long as theses relate to their study of law.
- <u>**Grading</u>**: Students in the MSL degree will adhere to the same examination, research paper, or other course requirements as other students. However, their performance in the course will be judged based on the "graduate student" grading norms applicable at the University generally (i.e., they will NOT be graded on the normal law school grading curve).</u>

Graduation requirements: 3.0 cumulative GPA for graduation.

- <u>Cost</u>: The tuition rate for this program will be set by the Board of Trustees. To attract students, we suggest that a modified tuition rate be utilized. Possibly, we could use the graduate school tuition rate as opposed to the law school professional tuition rates.
- <u>Subsequent Legal Studies</u>: No coursework completed in the MSL program may be counted toward a future JD degree based on restrictions imposed by the American Bar Association. Completion of the MSL degree will not qualify students to sit for any state bar examination.
- **Transferring from JD to MSL Degree Program**: Candidates for a *juris doctor* degree at The University of Akron School of Law who decide not to complete their JD degree, may apply up to 12 credits of coursework from the JD degree into the MSL program. Such students would be excused from taking the Introduction to the Law course and therefore could transfer in 12 credits of prior work and complete their MSL degree with only 14 credit hours of additional coursework. Similarly, non-JD students who are pursuing the Certificate in Intellectual Property Law for Non-Lawyers (we are concurrently submitting a petition for approval of such certificate) would be able to transfer in up to 12 credits of work toward that Certificate to the MSL degree (*e.g.*, a patent agent who starts in the non-JD IP Certificate program in January 2016 could transfer all those credits to MSL degree program once the program receives final approval from the Board of Regents.

ADVANTAGES OF THE PROGRAM

The creation of an MSL degree gives the law school flexibility in providing legal education to students who are not necessarily interested in pursuing a full 3-year *juris doctor* degree, but who are interested in learning more about the law. It will further expand the reach of the legal education arm of the University and contribute to the financial strength of the law school. Because the MSL program folds MSL students into our existing curriculum, there will be minimal additional costs. Every tuition dollar increases the net revenue of the University. Further, our competitor schools already have similar programs in place. This program will help us become even more competitive in the marketplace and meet several aspects of our strategic plan.

Because the MSL students will be integrated into existing courses, we do not anticipate the need to hire any additional full-time faculty. Professor Huhn has developed an Introduction to American Law course for purposes of this degree. Although he retired this semester, we could either rehire him for this purpose or have one of our existing faculty members teaching this course. The current law school faculty will teach all other courses. From an administrative standpoint, the current administration together with existing faculty committees will be able to monitor the progress of the program and address any issues. The administration and faculty members in each specialty area will help advise students about course selection.

In approving this proposal, the law faculty looked at concerns that adding nonlawyers into the classroom dynamic could adversely affect the quality of the classroom discussion or result in a decrease in the amount of substantive material covered. A related concern was that adding non-lawyers to the classroom might exacerbate the pedagogical challenge of having to teach to multiple levels of ability in a course. While these concerns were appreciated, the faculty is confident that the potential pedagogical benefits of having a more diverse classroom outweigh any concerns. MSL students will most likely be mid-career professionals who will bring a depth of real world experience to the classroom. This will enrich classroom discussions and also serve as a counterbalance to any unfamiliarity with the law that such students might have. By requiring MSL students to take the new Introduction to the American Legal System course and one core law school course in their first semester, these students should be able to perform well in courses primarily aimed at training JD candidates.

Finally, the MSL program will facilitate the legal training of a greater segment of society. Because the law touches all segments of society, the MSL degree will increase access to legal education.

REQUESTED ACTION

The Master of Studies in Law degree will assist the law school and University in terms of revenue, reputation, and quality. Accordingly, it is requested that the Office of Academic Affairs approve this proposal for a Master of Studies in Law degree and forward it along to the Board of Trustees for additional approval.

PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF CERTIFICATES IN INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY (for Non-Lawyers and Law Graduates)

INTRODUCTION

Currently, the law school offers a certificate program for our *juris doctor* (JD) students. This program requires the completion of our Fundamentals of Intellectual Property Course, one of three core IP courses (Patent Law, Copyright Law, or Trademark Law), nine (9) additional credit hours designated as part of our IP law curriculum, and a substantive paper on an intellectual property related topic.

On March 12, 2015, The University of Akron School of Law faculty unanimously approved a proposal to extend Certificates in Intellectual Property Law to two additional groups. The law school would like to offer a Certificate in Intellectual Property Law for (i) non-lawyers, and (ii) graduates of Akron Law and any other American Bar Association (ABA) approved law school (Post-JD IP Certificate). The law school is governed by ABA standards that require that programs and offerings outside of our core *juris doctor* degree program will not interfere with our ability to operate in compliance with the ABA standards or inhibit us from carrying out our program of legal education. We believe that these certificate programs will not contravene these requirements. As such, we seek approval from the Office of Academic Affairs to extend our current Certificate in Intellectual Property to the above two groups. Because these are certificate programs composed of existing courses, we believe that approval from the Board of Trustees and Board of Regents is unnecessary.

CERTIFICATE IN INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY FOR NON-LAWYERS

The law school faculty have developed and recently approved a Master of Studies in Law (MSL) degree geared towards non-lawyers interested in taking 26 credits of law courses. The law school will seek approval for this new degree in short order. For nonlawyers with an interest in intellectual property law (e.g. engineers, patent agents, etc.), the MSL should provide an avenue to enriched knowledge and enhanced qualification. However, some non-lawyers may prefer to pursue a certificate focused in intellectual property courses composed of 12 credits. Others may commence an MSL degree, but find that life circumstances prevent them from completing the entire MSL degree. The existence of a certificate will provide prospective students with the assurance that they can at least obtain a certification, even if they cannot complete the entire MSL degree. The law school would like to commence offering the certificate as early as the fall 2015 semester. The basics of the IP law certificate program for non-lawyers will be as follows:

<u>Admissions Criteria</u>: The law school will evaluate applications for the certificate program based on an applicant's ability to perform graduate level work and evaluation that the inclusion of such applicant will not interfere with the ability of the law school to operate in compliance with the ABA Standards. The goal underlying the admissions criteria is enhancement of the classroom and our program of legal education. More specifically, in evaluating an application for admission, the Admissions Committee will consider undergraduate work, extracurricular activities, employment experience, and other achievements. The LSAT will not be required. Non-JD IP certificate candidates will be required to submit the following materials to apply for the program:

- (1) Transcripts for all undergraduate and graduate work (must show completion of Bachelor's Degree (*i.e.*, BA, BS, or foreign equivalent)
- (2) Resume
- (3) Personal Statement describing interest in the certificate program and aptitude to succeed at a graduate level
- (4) Two letters of recommendation
- (5) If not a native English speaker, satisfactory demonstration of English fluency

<u>Courses</u>: Any intellectual property course offered by the law school may count towards completion of the credit hour requirements for the degree. These courses may be geared towards JD students, JD/LLM students, or Executive LLM students.

Matriculation Date: Fall semester or spring semester

<u>**Credit hours</u>**: 12 credit hours (Unless waived by the IP Center Director, the certificate student will need to take the 3 credit hour Fundamentals of Intellectual Property Law course, either in a traditional or executive format, as part of the 12 credit requirement.)</u>

<u>**Grading</u>**: Students in the non-JD IP Certificate will adhere to the same examination, research paper, or other course requirements as other students. However, their performance in the course will be judged based on the "graduate student" grading norms applicable at the University generally (i.e., they will NOT be graded on the normal law school grading curve).</u>

<u>Relation with Master Courses:</u> Courses taken toward this non-JD Certificate would fully transfer toward any future MSL degree program. Conversely, courses taken towards the MSL degree program could be credited toward a non-JD IP Certificate.

CERTIFICATE IN INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY FOR LAWYERS

In February 2013, the law school approved the creation of post-JD certificate programs in Intellectual Property, Health Law, and Litigation. However, the faculty conditioned its approval by providing that such certificate programs could only

commence after the faculty approved the implementation details. On March 12, 2015, details of the Post-JD IP Certificate were presented to the faculty and the Certificate was unanimously approved.

To the extent that a student with a *juris doctor* degree desires to take additional courses in the field of intellectual property, it is much more likely that such student will pursue our 24-credit LL.M. degree in Intellectual Property Law. Not only can said students acquire a master degree, but the student will be eligible for federal financial aid. In limited instances though, a lawyer may wish to take only select specialized courses in the field of intellectual property based on work requirements or personalized interests. Making a 12 credit Post-JD IP Certificate available could be attractive to legal practitioners. Additionally, if a student were to enroll in our 24-credit LL.M. degree program, but subsequently finds herself unable to complete the full program, we could award an IP certificate upon the completion of 12 credits of study.

The post-JD IP Certificate would operate as follows. It would not follow the same criteria and requirements of the current JD-level Certificate in IP.

<u>Admissions Criteria</u>: Any student with a law degree from The University of Akron or any other ABA-accredited institution is eligible for admission into this program. This certificate program would have the same admission standards as our LL.M. in IP Law Program.

<u>Courses</u>: Any intellectual property course offered by the law school may count towards completion of the credit hour requirements for the degree. These courses may be geared towards JD students, JD/LLM students, or Executive LLM students.

Matriculation Date: Fall semester or spring semester.

<u>**Credit Hours**</u>: Once any post-JD Certificate student has completed 12 credit hours of post-JD course work in either traditional or executive format LL.M. courses with an aggregate cumulative GPA of 3.0, the student can request acknowledgement of her completion of the Certificate in IP Law. Akron Law graduates who did not receive a JD Certificate in IP would be able to count up to 6 credit hours of IP coursework taken as a JD toward a Post-JD Certificate in IP Law.

<u>Grading</u>: Students in the post-JD IP Certificate program will adhere to the same examination, research paper, or other course requirements as other students.

<u>Relation with Master Courses:</u> It is anticipated that post-JD IP Certificate students will request a certificate only at a point in their studies where they have determined it is unlikely that they will complete the full LL.M degree requirements. Nevertheless, a student requesting a certificate would still be allowed to subsequently complete the requirements for, and be awarded, an LL.M degree, provided they are able to complete these requirements within the relevant time limitations.

BENEFITS TO AKRON LAW

Akron Law will benefit from extending its Certificate in Intellectual Property Law to non-lawyers and lawyers. Among others, these benefits include the following:

- (i) Enabling students to develop an expertise in an increasingly important area, develop new connections, and experience the world of intellectual property law;
- (ii) Provide non-lawyers who are not interested in a 3-year *juris doctor* degree access to important and relevant information about intellectual property law.
- (iii) Attract additional tuition dollars from non-lawyers and graduates from Akron Law and other ABA-accredited law schools;
- (iv) Become even more competitive in the marketplace and meet several aspects of our strategic plan;
- (v) Increase student numbers and diversity of background/experience in the classroom.
- (vi) Help further our reputation as a center of intellectual property expertise.

REQUESTED ACTION

Akron Law is simultaneously faced with enormous tasks and potential in the current legal education environment. President Scarborough has challenged us to find new opportunities for the law school in terms of revenue, reputation, and quality. It is requested that the Office of Academic Affairs approve this proposal for extension of our Certificate of Intellectual Property Law to these two additional groups.

Information Technology Services Report for the Board of Trustees August 2015 (Report prepared July 20, 2015)

RFP for PeopleSoft Managed Services: PeopleSoft managed services will help UA by providing a number of cost-savings/avoidance and operational benefits. For example, managed services will provide better responsiveness to patches to the infrastructure, provide better business continuity safeguards with no service disruption at peak times, and alleviate costs associated with staff training, to name just a few. Responses to the RFP are due on July 31, 2015.

The University of Akron PeopleSoft HCM 9.2 Upgrade: This upgrade to Human Resources and Payroll continues with a projected date of mid-August for completion. Formal user acceptance testing has begun and is scheduled to continue until August 2015. The result of this testing will determine whether the upgrade is completed in August or is delayed until October.

Lorain County Community College PeopleSoft Upgrade: UA provides database and system support for Lorain's PeopleSoft environment. Work continues on an upgrade of Lorain's PeopleSoft Portal to the V9.1 R3 version. The go-live for this is scheduled for late summer. Lorain is also beginning an upgrade of its PeopleSoft HCM system to the 9.2 release. A go-live date for this is not yet scheduled, but the upgrade will be completed before calendar year end.

Student Degree Audit Replacement: During fall 2015, the Registrar's office plans to run the new PeopleSoft Academic Advising functionality in parallel with the current software for degree verification. This project, which migrates existing functionality into the core PeopleSoft software, continues on track for a planned go-live in January 2016.

Distributed Antenna System: Designed to improve cellular coverage on campus, the project is on schedule to be operational in September 2015. Implementation of cables and hardware will be completed August 2015. The system will be operational on a building-by-building schedule during the month of August.

Online Marketing and Fund Raising: Blackbaud's Luminate hosted product is in the final stages of setup and testing. Go-live for the system is planned for August 2015.

Significant Highlights and Accomplishments

Executive Summary

This report provides an overview of significant highlights and accomplishments of the 17 departments in the Division of Student Success that took place in the 2014-15 academic year.

Each of the division's departments work diligently throughout the year to support students' Akron Experience and provide educational and academic support services and activities to meet the developmental needs of students. Division staff assist with retention efforts throughout the year and strive to assist students' persistence toward graduation. The division focuses on providing positive interactions through the many student-centered activities; state-of-the art facilities; leading-edge technology; assessment- and data-driven programs and services; and extensive collaborative efforts with colleagues across campus.

This report highlights the Academic Gateway units and the Student and Campus Life units of the division.

Significant Highlights and Accomplishments

ACADEMIC GATEWAY HIGHLIGHTS

- Counseling and Testing Center (CTC)
 - CTC is the only university counseling center in Northeast Ohio to have all of its services and major function areas assessed and accredited by the International Association of Counseling Services, the National College Testing Association, and the American Psychological Association. Additionally, the University has maintained its Jed Campus status, which indicates successful mental health services, for the second and final year of the current program.
- Office of Student Academic Success Tutoring UA continues to be one of the leaders of the Ohio eTutoring Collaborative (online tutoring), providing synchronous tutors in mathematics, biology, chemistry, and writing. In fall 2014 the Office of Student Academic Success served 1,194 students in 5,670 contact hours.
- Office of Accessibility(OA)

The Office of Accessibility saw a 15.8 percent increase in active students. OA has revamped and developed new ways to keep in touch with students related to programs, including Disabilities Awareness Week, resulting in the creation of an office Twitter page, @AccessibilityUA. Its Peer Assistance for Support and Success (PASS) program was also revamped.

- *Emergent Advising* Emergent Advising saw a 10 percent increase in first-time, full-time, fall-to-fall retention.
- Choose Ohio First (COF) The COF program saw a 90 percent retention rate, with an 81 percent six-year graduation rate.
- College-Ready Advising A total of 87 percent of the freshman class was seen for the freshman transition advising appointment by the end of the end of October (start of freshman spring registration).
- Student Services Center (SSC) The SSC saw a 27.36 percent increase in student contacts from July 2014 – May 2015.

• Help A Zip (HAZ)

Referrals to HAZ (academic, financial, personal intervention concerns) increased by 33 percent in 2014-2015. Additionally, 61 percent of students referred through HAZ were retained from fall 2014 to spring 2015.

- Parents and Family Association Over 200 family members were present for the "Soctoberfest" event, and over 230 family members were hosted during the Parent Winter Weekend.
- Learning Communities

For fall 2014, the University offered over 30 academic Learning communities with 615 student participants.

• Office of Multicultural Development (OMD)

The fall 2014 to fall 2015 retention rate of mentees was 2.8 percent higher than the overall fall 2014 to fall 2015 retention rate of University FTF (full-time freshman). The disaggregated (race/ethnicity and gender) data also illustrates that UA mentees are persisting at higher rates. Additionally, OMD hosted the University's inaugural Multicultural Convocation ceremony with 62 graduates participating and over 350 guests attending.

• Office of Multicultural Development- Peer Mentoring

Peer Mentoring served 44.4 percent of UA's Hispanic/Latino FTF population, 38.7 percent of UA's Black/African American FTF population, and 29.2 percent of UA's Two or More Races FTF population. Each mentee received 3.6 face-to-face meetings with a mentor during the academic year (not including email/phone outreach).

• Student Initiatives

Post-secondary Enrollment Options Program (PSEOP) Enrollment increased 11 percent in fall 2014 as compared to fall 2013; 13 additional students were enrolled full time through the Seniors to Sophomores Partnership with Akron Public Schools. PSEOP graduates totaled 462 in 2014, and 386 applied as new freshmen (83 percent).

The Akron Experience: University 101 course sections increased from 33 in fall 2013 to 76 in fall 2014 (130 percent increase). Effective fall 2014, the course became a mandatory requirement for all preparatory and emergent students, and is strongly encouraged for college-ready students. The percentage of A's awarded in the class was the highest in the past five years (57.6 percent in fall 2014 compared to 55.9 percent in fall 2013), and the percentage of Fs in the class were lowest in the past five years (12.3 percent in fall 2014 compared to 15.6 percent in fall 2013).

UA has administered the MAP-Works transition survey since 2010 as a means to identify potential risk indicators for first-year students. In fall 2014, UA achieved a 79.6 percent completion rate for the Fall Transition Survey, which was the highest rate since implementation of the program. This high completion rate can be attributed to the fact that most college-ready and emergent students in the Division of Student Success were enrolled in a section of The Akron Experience: University 101, and completion of the MAP-Works transition survey was connected to an assignment in the class.

STUDENT AND CAMPUS LIFE HIGHLIGHTS

• Dean of Students

Managed 105 referrals made to Deputy Title IX Coordinator for Students representing a more than 500 percent increase in referrals from the previous year. This resulted in a new online reporting form, revised sexual misconduct reporting protocols, and an increased presence and visibility of awareness and prevention programs on campus.

The Think About It online sexual abuse and substance training program was successfully launched in fall 2014 and disseminated to new students resulting in 3,667 students completing the course.

• Off-Campus Student Services (OCSS)

In collaboration with the UA Police and Block By Block, the Off-Campus Patrol provided approximately 8,700 escorts from August 2014 through May 2015, and provided 1,600 people with hospitality assistance.

The Community Policing Fusion group, a committee of the Safety Consortium chaired by OCSS and UAPD, provided coordination efforts to address the education of students in being good party hosts as well as presenting four on-campus "Party Safe" education events with 448 students, participating in multiple door-to-door campaigns and social media monitoring.

OCSS also collaborated with the Vice President Student Success Office to coordinate quarterly luncheons during the fall and spring semesters with major off-campus property owners near the University.

Residence Life and Housing (RLH) Co-curricular Programs and Activities provided 130 activities with a total attendance of 34,195 (6 percent increase compared to last year).

RLH was recognized nationally by three different organizations:

- 2015 Association for the Promotion of Campus Activities (APCA) National Organization of the Year Award presented to Sigma Lambda Honorary
- Two National of the Month Awards through the National Association of College and University Residence Hall (NACURH); and
- UA was one of five national nominees for the 2015 National Best Campus Program Award from Campus Activities Magazine. This nomination reflected the efforts of the Zips Programming Network and Residence Hall Programming Board/Residence Hall Council. The other nominees were the University of Central Florida, Colorado School of Mines, Stanford University, and Southern New Hampshire University. This is the second-consecutive year that Akron has been nominated. Previously, UA received this award in 2012, 2010, 2006, 2003, and 2000.
- Student Health Services (SHS)

SHS provided experiential learning opportunities in collaboration with the College of Health Professions in the facility to 37 students. In addition, SHS managed several multidisciplinary partnerships with both on- and off-campus constituents including International Programs, Counseling and Testing Center/Office of Accessibility/Portage Path Behavioral Health, UA's Emergency Operations Group, SART, Medina-Summit County Rape Crisis Center, UAPD, UA's University Council Health and Wellness Committee, Ohio College Health Association, Summit County Health District, Planned Parenthood, and the community AIDS Network for STD and HIV testing.

• Student Life (SL)

SL celebrated its ten-year anniversary.

SL offered a total of 382 programs with a total of 45,681 students participating. Areas of emphasis included: leadership, civic engagement, social, educational and arts/cultural. Programming highlights included: Springfest, LIFE Awards, Late Night in the Union series, Alcohol Awareness Week, movie series every weekend, Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week, Make a Difference Day, Homecoming, Alternative Spring Break trips, UA Pride Days, Diversity Week, Black History Month, Women's History Month, Super Service Saturdays, E.D.G. E. Leadership Conference and much, much more.

ZPN along with Residence Hall Programming Board was named as one of the top-five programming boards by Campus Activities Magazine.

Fraternity & Sorority Life programs received national recognition:

- In February 2015, the three governing councils for the fraternity and sorority community were recognized for excellence at the Association for Fraternity Leadership and Values (AFLV) Central Conference. The Council qualified as one of two Councils in the running for the overall excellence award; for which they were a very close runner-up. This is the second time the Panhellenic Council has been a runner-up since it began applying for the awards in 2011.
- In its second year of applying, the Interfraternity Council (IFC) applied to seven of the eight award categories, which was a significant increase from its previous application in 2012 to only the council management category.
- For the first time, the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) received Excellence in Council Management. In addition, the NPHC was awarded with the 2015 Craig Little Breakthrough Award, which includes a \$200 scholarship given to first-time applicants who have achieved high standards of excellence.
- UA's Panhellenic Council was recognized by the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) as one of 32 universities for high-performing council management and leadership in the areas of recruitment, organization structure, communication with NPC, self-governing through following judicial procedures, programming, academic success and Panhellenic impact and relations with the greater community. UA was recognized as one of 21 councils receiving the Achievement Award for meeting six of the seven criteria. There are over 660 college Panhellenic Councils nationwide.

• Student Recreation and Wellness Services (SRWS)

The SRWS was the recipient of the Gold NASPA Award in the category of Athletics, Recreation, Physical Fitness, Non-Varsity Sports for the Outdoor Adventure Adaptive Paddle sport program, with 450,056 in total attendance and 377,325 student access to SRWS facilities (a 1 percent increase in both categories).

The SRWS 17th in the Nation according to University Prime Time online. CollegeRanking.net ranked The University of Akron pools as 12th on their list of Top 30 Best College Pools.

The SRWS landing page received 18,759 visits (8 percent increase over FY13) and 440,892 page views overall for the SRWS site during the FY15 reporting period. The index page is rated 19th (up one place from FY14) for uakron.edu out of 90,000+ possible entrance pages on the uakron.edu domain.

The SRWS celebrated its ten-year anniversary.

• Student Conduct and Community Standards (SCCS)

SCCS received a total of 581 student referrals from our community, representing roughly a 4.3 percent increase over the last reporting year. Below is a breakdown of the type of referrals received this year:

- **Eighty-one students were referred for an informal resolution**, an increase of 14 referrals (21 percent increase) over last year.
- **Five hundred students were referred for formal resolution**, an increase of 10 referrals (2 percent increase) over last year.

SCCS conducted roughly 100 student, faculty, and staff presentations and/or trainings and interacted with roughly 4,396 students, faculty, and staff through educational programming. As compared to the last reporting year, four additional programs were offered this year but overall attendance remained roughly the same.

SCCS also partnered with OCCS and the UAPD to educate students, faculty, and staff about our respective roles and outcomes in situations involving students regarding alcohol consumption, responsible decision making, and drinking and driving.

RE: Summary of Rules Committee Agenda Items for the August 12, 2015 Meeting of the Board of Trustees

The Rules Committee will be asked to consider revisions to the following Rules at its meeting on August 3, 2015:

1. O.A.C. 3359-60-06.2 Graduate student standards

The Student Policy Committee of the Graduate Council recommend that requirements related to international students as outlined in the rule be revised for the following reasons:

- 1) English proficiency can be demonstrated in a number of ways beyond those listed in the current rule;
- 2) To bring the rule in line with current practices for measuring English language proficiency, which are supported by the academic departments/schools; and
- 3) To make the rule consistent with the Graduate Bulletin.

The Graduate Counsel has voted to approve the recommendation. Faculty Senate approved the recommended changes at its meeting on May 4, 2015.

2. O.A.C. 3359-1-02 Officers of the board and their duties

The proposed revisions to the rule authorize the Assistant Secretary, in addition to the Secretary, to perform functions necessary to support the operations of the Board. The proposed modification will add redundancy and flexibility to the performance of these duties and responsibilities.

3. <u>O.A.C. 3359-1-04.1 Open meetings</u>

The proposed revisions to the rule authorize the Assistant Secretary, in addition to the Secretary, to administer the duties and responsibilities prescribed by the rule to comply with Ohio's Open Meetings law.

4. O.A.C. 3359-7-01 Office of the vice president and general counsel

The proposed revisions to the rule pertaining to the duties of the vice president and general counsel authorize when the vice president and general counsel is also appointed as Assistant Secretary of the Board of Trustees, to administer those functions and duties prescribed for that officer outlined in the bylaws of the board.

5. <u>O.A.C. 3359-20-03.10</u> Guidelines for initial appointment, reappointment, tenure, and promotion of full-time faculty in the school of law

The proposed revisions to the rule authorize the Assistant Secretary, in addition to the Secretary, to sign a certificate or letter of appointment for tenured or tenure-track or non-tenure track law school faculty on behalf and in the name of the University and the Board by the Chairperson of the Board and/or the President of the University, and perform other duties related to the processing of certificates of appointment. The proposed modifications will add redundancy and flexibility to the performance of those duties and responsibilities.

6. O.A.C. 3359-22-01 Contract professional information

The proposed revisions to the rule authorize the Assistant Secretary, in addition to the Secretary, to sign certificates or letters of appointment for contract professionals. The proposed modifications will add redundancy and flexibility to the performance of this duty and responsibility.

3359-60-06.2 Graduate student standards.

(A) International students.

- (1) An international student is normally admitted only in the fall, and all credentials should be received by the graduate school by the first of April. Inasmuch as the university of Akron, as a state institution, has an obligation to the residents of Ohio, only the best-qualified international applicants can be admitted. An international student seeking admission should not plan to leave the home country until notice of admission has been received from the graduate school.
- (2) An international student should access the online graduate application through the graduate school website and submit the required application fee. An official transcript and degree from all institutions and universities attended must be submitted. Original records in languages other than English must be accompanied by exact English translations and certified by the school, U.S. consulate, or other legal certifying authority.
- (3) An international student should submit to the graduate school the declaration and certification of finances, an original statement from the bank showing availability of sufficient funds to cover the cost of the first year of study, and a copy of the passport. The graduate school will prepare the certificate of eligibility (I-20A/B or DS-2019) upon receipt of adequate financial support, copy of the passport, and admission to the university.
- (4) International applicants, United States citizens, and permanent residents whose native language is not English must submit evidence that they have a sufficient level of English to undertake graduate studies at the university of Akron. After submitting acceptable academic credentials and proof of English proficiency, applicants who are fully admitted may enroll in graduate course work and be eligible for university of Akron funded assistantships, fellowships, or scholarships. Prospective teaching assistants must achieve a passing score on the UADEPT (the "University of Akron Developed English Proficiency Test"), or a 23 or greater on the speaking component of the internet-based TOEFL (the "Test of English as a Foreign Language").
- (5) Applicants to graduate programs can demonstrate their English proficiency in one of the following ways:
 - (a) A minimum score of 550 on the paper-based TOEFL, 213 on the computer-based TOEFL, or 79 or higher on the internet-based TOEFL. (The following departments require a higher standard of proficiency: English and history require a TOEFL of 580/237/92; and biomedical engineering requires a TOEFL of 590/243/96.) Scores more than two years old will not be accepted; or
 - (b) <u>A minimum score of 6.5 on the IELTS (the "International English Language</u> <u>Testing System"</u>), which is managed by the British Council. Scores more than two years old will not be accepted; or

- (c) <u>Successful completion of a full course of study in the advanced level of ELI (the</u> <u>"English Language Institute") at the university of Akron. ELI is an intensive</u> (twenty hours a week) program in English for academic purposes. The advanced level course of study is offered every fall, spring, and summer according to the <u>university's academic calendar; or</u>
- (d) Successful completion of twenty-four credit hours of upper-level undergraduate or eighteen credit hours of graduate coursework at a United States university or college in which English is the primary language of instruction. Successful completion is defined as maintaining a 3.0 cumulative grade point average in full-time, continuous studies. Applicants must submit original transcripts of their coursework; or
- (e) Successful completion of an undergraduate or graduate program at a university outside the United States in which English is the language of administration and instruction. English must be used for all administrative functions and for all areas of instruction (with the exception of foreign language courses) including course lectures, materials, discussions, readings, and writing assignments. Applicants must submit an original official document from the undergraduate or graduate institution certifying that all of the administrative functions and instruction are conducted in English. The document must be signed by an officer of the institution and carry an official seal. The dean of the graduate school at the university of Akron will review the submitted documentation and inform the applicant if he or she has satisfied the English requirement. The decision will be final.
- (2) Applicants from countries other than the United States in which English is not the major language in daily life are required to demonstrate high-level competence in the use of the English language, including reading, writing, speaking and listening, prior to admission. This competence can best be established by achieving a score of at least five hundred fifty on the TOEFL (the "Test of English as a Foreign Language"). The TOEFL is administered by "Educational Testing Service, Box 899, Princeton, NJ 08540 USA." Applicants should make arrangements to take the test as soon as study at the university of Akron is anticipated and should request ETS to forward the official test score directly to the "Graduate School, The University of Akron, Akron, OH 44325." The official score should be received in the graduate school by the first of June for fall admission. Unofficial copies of the TOEFL cannot be accepted. If the TOEFL is not available, the applicant should contact the international student adviser at the university of Akron for other arrangements. Personal letters certifying English competence are not acceptable as substitutes for test scores.

- (3) The completion of an English placement test after admittance will also be required. Based on the results of this test, a student may be required to take an English language course for credit.
- (4) An international student, coming to the university of Akron in good standing from an accredited American college or university, may have the English proficiency requirement waived upon written request.
- (B) Non-accredited American school graduates. A student holding a baccalaureate degree from a non-accredited American college or university, if otherwise qualified, is required to complete at least ten semester credits of postbaccalaureate work at a 3.00 level before being considered for admission to the graduate school. The accreditation status of the school at the time of the student's graduation shall apply. A student should consult with the department head in the major field to develop a postbaccalaureate program.
- (C) Grades.
 - (1) A student admitted to graduate study under any status at the university of Akron is expected to maintain a minimum 3.00 average (4.00 = "A") at all times. A grade-point average of 3.00 or better is required for graduation. Any student whose average falls below 3.00 is no longer in good standing in the graduate school and considered on probation. No more than six semester credits of "C" grades may be counted toward the degree. In computing cumulative averages, "D" grades are treated as "F" grades. The dean of graduate studies and research, with the approval of the department head, may dismiss anyone who fails to make satisfactory progress toward declared goals or who accumulates six semester credits of "C+" or below. The accumulation of six semester credits of "F" will result in mandatory dismissal. A student dismissed from the graduate school for academic reasons may not be readmitted for one calendar year, and then only if evidence for expecting improved performance is submitted and found acceptable.

(2) Official academic records are maintained with a grade-point system as follows:

- (3) The following grades may also appear on the term grade reports or on the official academic record. There are no grade points associated with these grades.
 - (a) "I" Incomplete: Indicates that the student has done passing work in the course but that some part of the work is, for good and acceptable reason, not complete at the end of the term. Failure to make up the omitted work satisfactorily by the end of the following term, not including summer sessions, converts the "I" to an "F". When the work is satisfactorily completed within the allotted time, the "I" is converted to whatever grade the student has earned. (Note: If instructors wish to extend the "I" grade beyond the following term for which the student is registered, prior to the end of the term they must notify the office of the registrar in writing of the student to make arrangements to make up the incomplete work. The faculty member should submit the new grade to the office of the registrar in writing.)
 - (b) "IP" In progress: Indicates that the student has not completed the scheduled coursework during the term because the nature of the course does not permit completion within a single term, such as work toward a thesis.
 - (c) "PI" Permanent incomplete: Indicates that the student's instructor and the instructor's dean have for special reason authorized the change of an incomplete ("I") to a permanent incomplete ("PI").
 - (d) "W" Withdraw: Indicates that the student registered for the course but withdrew officially sometime after the second week of the term.

- (e) "NGR" No grade reported: Indicates that, at the time grades were processed for the present issue of the record, no grade had been reported by the instructor.
- (f) "INV" Invalid: Indicates the grade reported by the instructor for the course was improperly noted and thus unacceptable for proper processing.
- (4) Any student whose grade-point average falls below 3.00 is no longer in good standing in the graduate school and will be placed on probation. In consultation with the college or department, as appropriate, the dean of the graduate school will dismiss full-time students who do not return to good academic standing within two consecutive semesters (excluding summers) and part-time students who do not return to good academic standing within the attempting of fifteen additional credits.

For the purpose of administration of the full-time and part-time provisions of this policy, full-time and part-time status are determined by the semester in which the student goes on probation. Full-time enrollment constitutes nine or more graduate hours; part-time is less than nine graduate hours.

The dean of the graduate school, with the approval of the relevant department head may also dismiss anyone who fails to make satisfactory progress toward declared goals or who accumulates six semester credits of "C+" or below. The accumulation of six semester credits of "F" will result in mandatory dismissal.

A student dismissed from the graduate school for academic reasons may not be readmitted for one calendar year, and then only if evidence for expecting satisfactory performance is submitted and found acceptable.

- (D) Repeating courses. Any graduate course may be repeated once for credit. However, the degree requirements shall be increased by the credit hour value of each course repeated. The hours and grades of both the original and the repeated section shall be used in computing the grade-point average. Required courses in which a "D" or "F" was received must be repeated.
- (E) Transfer students. A graduate student matriculated in the graduate school of another college or university who wishes to transfer to the university of Akron to continue graduate education must be in good standing at the other school.
- (F) Course load. A full load of coursework at the graduate level is nine to fifteen semester credits including audit.
- (G) Registration. The responsibility for being properly registered lies with the student, who should consult with the assigned adviser in preparing a program of courses and/or research. A schedule of courses, hours, class location and registration procedures is obtainable from the registrar.
- (H) Entrance qualifying examinations. The use of examinations to determine admissibility to enter a graduate program or eligibility to continue in one is the prerogative of the

departments offering graduate programs. The department has the right to select the examination and minimum acceptable level of performance. Information and procedure may be obtained from the head of the appropriate department.

(I) Commencement. A student earning a graduate degree is expected to participate in the commencement exercise.

3359-1-02 Officers of the board and their duties.

(A) Officers.

The officers of the board shall be a chairperson and two vice chairpersons, who shall be members of the board, a secretary of the board, and an assistant secretary who need not be members of the board. The nominating committee shall meet annually in May, so that its report and recommendations may be voted upon at the board's regular meeting in June annually. The officers shall be elected at the board's regular meeting in June and shall take office at the first regular meeting of the board in each fiscal year beginning the first of July and shall serve until their successors are elected.

(B) Duties of officers.

The duties of the officers of the board shall be as follows:

- (1) Chairperson.
 - (a) The chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the board and shall decide all questions of order. It shall be the chairperson's duty to see that the bylaws of the board are complied with; that the duties of the executive officers of the university, as prescribed in the regulations of the board, are followed; and that the resolutions and documents of the board are properly executed. The chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the board.
 - (b) The chairperson shall, for and on behalf of the university and the board, sign instruments, contracts, minutes, resolutions, diplomas, and other documents authorized by the board, or authorize the president of the university or the secretary to so act in the chairperson's behalf.
 - (c) The chairperson shall perform such other duties as these bylaws shall hereinafter prescribe or as may be, from time to time, delegated to the chairperson by the board.
- (2) Vice chairpersons.

During the absence of the chairperson, a vice chairperson designated by the chairperson shall be invested with the powers and discharge the duties of the chairperson. Should the chairperson fail or be unable to make a designation, the vice chairperson with the most seniority as vice chairperson shall act as chairperson during the chairperson's absence or incapacitation. Should both vice chairpersons have equal seniority as vice chairpersons, the vice chairperson with the most seniority as a board member shall act as chairperson.

- (3) Secretary and Assistant Secretary.
 - (a) The secretary and assistant secretary, as an officer officers of the board, shall be the custodian custodians of the seal of the university of Akron, of all

records, books, deeds, contracts, documents and papers of the board. The secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> shall attest by signing all instruments, contracts, diplomas, certificates, and other documents executed on behalf and in the name of the university and the board by the chairperson of the board and/or the president of the university, and shall have contract authority with respect to the execution of contracts as authorized by the board of trustees or as provided in the rules of the board of trustees.

(b) The secretary <u>and assistant secretary</u> shall attend all meetings of the board and committees of the board and shall keep accurate and complete records of minutes of said meetings in a manner consistent with the requirements of Ohio law respecting the records of public meetings. In implementing this requirement with respect to regular or special meetings of the board, such meetings shall be mechanically recorded and thereafter reduced to writing with the aid and benefit of such recordings. The written minutes shall be submitted for formal approval by the board of trustees to ensure that such minutes are accurate and complete in memorializing the proceedings, decisions, and actions of the board in such meetings. Upon approval of the minutes by the board of trustees, the mechanical recordings shall no longer be required to be kept.

Minutes of the meetings of committees of the board shall also be mechanically recorded, but inasmuch as committees of the board are not authorized to act on behalf of the board of trustees, such mechanical recordings shall constitute the complete record of minutes of said meetings, without the necessity of being reduced to writing or otherwise require formal approval by the respective committee. However, in the event such committee meeting minutes are reduced to writing, then such minutes shall constitute the complete record of minutes of said committee meeting without the necessity of retention of the mechanical recording of such meeting. Such recordings shall be kept according to the applicable records retention schedule. The secretary or assistant secretary shall, prior to consideration by the board of approval of the record of any meeting, transmit by mail or deliver to each member a copy of the written record of the regular or special meeting and shall give notice to the members of the board and to the president of the university of all meetings of the board, both regular or special; and, when requested by the chairperson of any committee of the board, shall give notice of the meeting of such committee to the members thereof.

(c) When elected thereto by the board, the secretary and assistant secretary may, if

not a member of the board, occupy an administrative position in the university, in addition to being an officer of the board. Otherwise, the secretary and assistant secretary, when elected thereto by the board, shall be made an unclassified contract professional employee of the university and shall hold office and be employed thereafter at the sole discretion of the board, and pursuant to terms and conditions established by the board. The secretary and assistant secretary shall report directly to the board through the chairperson of the board, and shall work in close cooperation and coordination with the president. This reporting arrangement shall not preclude the right of trustees and the secretary and assistant secretary to communicate directly with the other at any time on all matters the board, individual trustees, or chairperson shall require.

- (d) The secretary and assistant secretary, with the assistance of the assistant secretary, shall provide for a system of filing university rules in compliance with Chapter 111. of the Revised Code. The secretary and assistant secretary shall only file those rules properly promulgated by the board of trustees and the faculty senate, in accordance with the bylaws and regulations of the board of trustees. The secretary and assistant secretary, at the direction of the vice president and general counsel, shall be authorized to make such changes to university rules as are necessary to comply with the requirements of law, rule filing requirements by the secretary of state or other legislative agency, provide for consistency in related rules, and avoid duplication and unintended consequences of grammatical or other stylistic provisions in the rules.
- (e) The secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> shall receive and respond to routine correspondence, inquiries, and requests to the board of trustees, with the copies thereof to the chairperson. The secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> shall receive all transmittals to the members of the board of trustees and shall be responsible for providing copies of same to individual board members. Proposals from faculty and staff, either as a group or as individuals, shall be referred to the president pursuant to paragraph (B) of rule 3359-1-05 of the Administrative Code, with a copy thereof to the chairperson. Requests to address the board or any committee of the board shall not normally be considered unless submitted in writing to the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> at least two weeks prior to any regularly scheduled meeting. Such requests shall include information requested by the secretary, including, but not limited to, the purpose of the request and a summary of the topic to be addressed. The chairperson of the board, in consultation with the chairperson of any committee of the board, as appropriate, shall, for and on behalf of the board

or committee, determine if and when the matter should be scheduled upon the agenda of the board or committee of the board. In the event the chairperson determines not to schedule the matter on the agenda of the board or committee of the board, the chairperson shall direct the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> to provide notice of such request to members of the board for their information.

- (f) The secretary or assistant secretary shall confer with each member of the board of trustees concerning the procedure each trustee prefers regarding receipt of anonymous transmittals. Individual trustees may direct the secretary or assistant secretary in writing to retain their copies of anonymous transmittals for reference in the board office. Otherwise, the secretary or assistant secretary shall forward such transmittals by regular mail or personal delivery. Such transmittals shall not be delivered by facsimile copy.
- (4) Assistant secretary.
 - (g a) When elected thereto by the board, the assistant secretary shall also be made an unclassified contract professional employee of the university and shall hold office and be employed thereafter at the sole discretion of the board, and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the board. The assistant secretary shall report to the chairperson of the board of trustees on those matters assigned by the chairperson or board of trustees, and to the secretary on those matters and duties prescribed within the responsibility of the secretary. The assistant secretary shall work in close cooperation and coordination with both the president and the secretary of the board. The assistant secretary shall assist the secretary in the execution of duties outlined in these rules for the secretary, and shall substitute in the secretary's absence. This reporting arrangement shall not preclude the right of trustees and the assistant secretary to communicate directly with the other at any time.
 - $(\underline{h} \cdot \underline{b})$ The responsibilities of the <u>secretary and</u> assistant secretary shall be assigned by the chairperson of the board and shall include, but not be limited to, the daily management of the board office and operations, direct oversight of board communications, coordination of trustee development and strategic planning initiatives as directed by the chairperson of the board or committee chairs, serve as board liaison in connection with major university initiatives and with campus, community, governmental, or other constituencies as directed by the chairperson of the board.
 - (<u>i</u> e) The assistant secretary shall attend all meetings of the board and committees of the board and shall assist members of the board as they may request in carrying out their fiduciary duties to the board.

3359-1-04.1 Open meetings.

- (A) The board of trustees shall comply with all provisions of the Ohio open meeting law set forth in section 121.22 of the Revised Code.
- (B) The chair of the board of trustees of the university of Akron shall, at a regular springtime meeting of the board, announce the time, date and place for the regularly scheduled meetings of the board of trustees for the succeeding fiscal year, commencing July first and lasting twelve months, and shall, at each scheduled meeting of the board, announce the time, date and place of the next scheduled meeting of the board.
- (C) The secretary or assistant secretary of the board of trustees shall place on file in the university library and post in the board office and on the board's website the schedule of regular meetings as announced by the chair of the board.
- (D) A representative of the media may request notification of regularly scheduled meetings for the year beginning July first and ending June thirtieth by submitting to the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board a sufficient number of self-addressed, stamped envelopes in which to mail such notices or by submitting an email address or fax machine phone number.
- (E) Any person desiring notification of regularly scheduled meetings of the board of trustees may receive same (for twelve months) by depositing with the secretary or <u>assistant secretary</u> of the board a sufficient number of self-addressed, stamped envelopes in which to mail such notification or by submitting an email address or fax machine phone number.
- (F) In the event of any change in the calendar of regularly scheduled meetings of the board of trustees during the year commencing July first and ending June thirtieth, the chair and the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board shall provide notice of such change no later than one week prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting.
- (G) The secretary or assistant secretary of the board of trustees shall, upon receipt of notice from chair of the board of trustees, members of the board of trustees or the president of the university, of the scheduling of a special meeting of the board of trustees or of a meeting of a committee where five or more members of the board are expected to attend, but in no event later than twenty-four hours prior to the commencement of the meeting, notify representatives of the media and all other persons who have so requested of the date, time, place and stated purpose of the meeting using self-addressed, stamped envelopes, email addresses or fax machine phone numbers provided by the aforementioned representatives or other persons. In

the event of an emergency situation where twenty-four hour notification is not possible, the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> shall verbally notify such media representatives by telephone call to the local telephone number specified by such media representatives and shall record the fact of such notice in the minutes of the meeting.

- (H) Persons desiring notice of any regular or special meeting of the board of trustees at which specific subject matters designated by the person desiring notice are included in the agenda of the meeting, may request such notice in writing to the secretary <u>or</u> <u>assistant secretary</u> of the board, including with the request a sufficient supply of selfaddressed, stamped envelopes for mailing the notice or an email address or fax machine phone number.
- (I) The secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board may rely on the assistance of any member of the university staff, and any such notice is complete if given by such staff member in the manner provided herein.

3359-7-01 Office of the vice president and general counsel.

- (A) Vice president and general counsel.
 - (1) Pursuant to sections 109.02 and 3345.15 of the Revised Code, the attorney general is the chief legal officer for the university of Akron and the legal representation of the university remains within the direction and control of the attorney general pursuant to agreement between the attorney general and the board of trustees of the university. The attorney general has ultimate responsibility for rendering legal services to the university and for the selection of counsel to provide representation for the university. The vice president and general counsel shall be appointed by the board of trustees subject to the prior approval of the attorney general.

The vice president and general counsel shall hold office at the discretion of both the attorney general and the university board of trustees. Either the attorney general or the board of trustees may request the person in this position to cease serving in this position, and the person shall thereupon cease to serve. The associate vice president and deputy general counsel, and other associates or assistants thereto shall be appointed by the board with the prior written approval of the attorney general upon recommendation of the vice president and general counsel, and shall hold office at the discretion of both the attorney general and the board of trustees. Either the attorney general or the board of trustees may request the persons in these positions to cease serving in such positions, and the persons shall thereupon cease to serve.

The vice president and general counsel shall report directly to the president and shall work in close cooperation and coordination with the president, president's cabinet, and other university officers and administrators. The vice president and general counsel and associate vice president and general counsel, and other associates and assistant general counsels shall be appointed as assistant attorneys general. It is specifically understood that the nature of legal services are of such a personal and fiduciary nature that the attorney general is the sole judge of the adequacy of the legal services rendered pursuant to all appointments of attorneys as assistant attorneys general. All rights and conditions of employment pertaining to unclassified contract professional university employees shall apply to attorneys appointed assistant attorneys general except as provided otherwise in this rule.

Notwithstanding the direct reporting relation between the vice president and general counsel to the president, it shall be the duty and responsibility of the vice president and general counsel to coordinate with and keep the senior vice president and provost informed in advance on all matters, initiatives, or decisions within their area of responsibility that involve academic matters, or that have a reasonable expectation of involving or affecting the academic programs, activities, or directions of the university.

- (2) The vice president and general counsel shall serve as the chief legal advisor to the president, board of trustees, and university officers and administrators; and, shall be responsible to the president and the board for the direction and supervision of all legal matters of the university, including the provision of legal counsel, advice, and services in all matters pertaining to the practice of law on behalf of the university of Akron. The vice president and general counsel shall be associates and assistants as approved by the board of trustees and the attorney general. All attorneys practicing law on behalf of the university shall report to the vice president and general counsel. No attorney employed by the university of Akron except those appointed assistant attorneys general and reporting to the general counsel.
- (3) Specific duties of the vice president and general counsel shall include responsibility for management of the office of general counsel and supervision of the legal staff, and directing and monitoring within the university, all legal matters on behalf of the university of Akron, including for example:
 - (a) Litigation matters, such as representing or overseeing the representation of the institution, and when appropriate, its officers, administration and employees in judicial and administrative proceedings, and in negotiations with other state or federal entities;
 - (b) Review, advise, and assist with legal documents, contracts, policies, procedures, practices, actions, or any matter having legal significance to the management and operation of the university of Akron, and including but not limited to providing legal counsel and guidance to institutional officers and upper management on all legal matters relevant to a large public institution, such as employment law, and polices, procedures, rules and regulations pertaining to students;
 - (c) Legal review of judicial decisions, legislative or governmental regulatory developments, and recommended compliance procedures or strategies;
 - (d) Review, advise, and assist with property acquisitions, leases, labor relations, and personnel matters, insurance matters, intellectual property issues, including patent, trademark, and copyright matters;
 - (e) Advise and assist with compliance reviews by governmental agencies, higher education regulatory agencies and internal compliance and management audits;
 - (f) Assist the president and other administrative officers to identify and implement programs and strategies that will provide comprehensive and preventative legal guidance to the university of Akron, including anticipation of legal

issues and development of legal strategies and solutions in situations involving political, public relations, or financial risk or significance to the institution, its governing authority or management;

- (g) Obtain authorization from the attorney general when required by law for the settlement of claims or lawsuits; and obtain authorization from the attorney general prior to the commencement of any legal action;
- (h) Maintains professional growth and development through professional affiliations, seminars and workshops to keep abreast of current developments in college and university law and related areas;
- (i) Provides training and education to the campus community on various legal issues through meetings, memorandums, and the general provision of legal advice and counsel.
- (4) The vice president and general counsel shall be responsible for the safekeeping of all deeds, leases, mortgages, contracts, and like papers or instruments of value except for those instruments required to be kept by another institutional officer. The vice president and general counsel shall, on behalf of the university, be authorized to execute all contracts and legal documents, including without limitation, settlement documents approved by the attorney general of Ohio, routine settlements and releases pertaining to litigation or threatened litigation, including worker's compensation and unemployment compensation matters, collection matters, labor contracts, intellectual property documents, bond documents and supporting opinions, etc.
- (5) The vice president and general counsel, associate vice president and deputy general counsel, and associates or assistants thereto shall maintain the professional qualifications for appointment as assistant attorneys general of the state of Ohio, including compliance with the Ohio supreme court rules for the government of the bar and the Ohio code of professional responsibility; and shall provide general legal counsel and advice in accord with the professional standards established by the Ohio attorney general, and American bar association to the extent such are not in conflict with the state of Ohio supreme court code of professional responsibility or rules for the government of the bar. Any attorneys employed by the university to practice law on behalf of the university must have their appointments approved in advance by the attorney general, and the attorney general shall appoint such attorneys as assistants attorneys general, with appropriate limitations or conditions of appointment as may be deemed necessary by either the attorney general or the vice president and general counsel.
- (6) The vice president and general counsel shall coordinate the provision of legal counsel, advice, and services for the university of Akron with the Ohio attorney general, special counsel appointed by the Ohio attorney general, and provide

appropriate liaison with the bench, bar, and law enforcement authorities. The vice president and general counsel shall work closely with the chief of the education section within the office of the Ohio attorney general and shall keep the chief of the section informed of all significant pending legal matters involving the university. The vice president and general counsel shall serve as liaison with the office of the Ohio inspector general. The vice president and general counsel shall serve as the liaison person regarding legal matters with affiliated organizations, such as the university of Akron foundation.

- (7) As legal counsel to the board of trustees, the vice president and general counsel shall report to the chairman of the board and shall provide reports to the board of trustees as required by the board, and shall:
 - (a) Attend and provide legal counsel at meetings of the board and its committees;
 - (b) Assist in preparation of agendas for board meetings, review documents presented to the board which may have legal implications, and review all minutes of board meetings prior to their submission for adoption;
 - (c) Provide litigation and transactional legal risk analysis to the board and its committees;
 - (d) Conduct inquiries and provide such other services as directed by the board, committees of the board, chairman or officers of the board;
 - (e) Work closely with the president to ensure good board and campus relations and flow of information;
 - (f) Maintain total confidentiality in regard to all board business and materials, as required by the code of professional responsibility;
 - (g) When appointed as secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board of trustees, administer those functions and duties prescribed for the secretary <u>or assistant</u> <u>secretary</u> of the board of trustees as outlined in the bylaws of the board.
- (B) Associate vice president and deputy general counsel.

With prior approval and at the direction of or during any absence by the vice president and general counsel, the associate vice president and deputy general counsel shall fulfill the duties of the vice president and general counsel.

(C) Assistant and associate general counsel.

The vice president and general counsel and the associate vice president and deputy general counsel shall be assisted by such assistant or associate general counsel as shall be appointed by the board, and each shall hold office at the discretion of the board,

and shall be under the supervision and direction of the vice president and general counsel.

(D) Amendments.

This rule shall not be altered, amended, repealed or otherwise modified without the concurrence of the then current Ohio attorney general.

3359-20-03.10 Guidelines for initial appointment, reappointment, tenure, and promotion of full-time faculty in the school of law.

(A) Categories of full-time faculty.

The full-time faculty of the university of Akron school of law comprises all school of law employees who have been appointed as full-time faculty by the board of trustees. The following constitute the categories of full-time faculty of the university of Akron school of law and the responsibilities of those within each category:

- (1) Tenured and tenure-track law school faculty.
 - (a) The tenured and tenure-track faculty of the law school is composed of all fulltime law school faculty who have been awarded indefinite tenure or are eligible to be awarded indefinite tenure. Such faculty hold the rank of professor, associate professor, or assistant professor or the title of distinguished professor.
 - (b) Members of the tenured or tenure-track law school faculty generally have a full range of responsibilities, including teaching, research, scholarship and other creative professional work, and service to the unit, the university and the public.
- (2) Non-tenure-track law school faculty (NTTLS faculty).
 - (a) The non-tenure-track law school faculty comprises all clinical professors of law and professors of legal writing. Such faculty hold the title of clinical professor of law, associate clinical professor of law, assistant clinical professor of law, professor of legal writing, associate professor of legal writing, or assistant professor of legal writing. The expectation for NTTLS faculty positions is that the positions will continue as long as the university identifies the need for them, and that if the university's needs or goals change, such positions may be modified or eliminated.
 - (b) Members of the non-tenure-track law school faculty generally have a full range of responsibilities, including teaching, research, scholarship and other creative professional work, and service to the unit, the university and the public, to the extent determined appropriate by the law school.
- (B) Nature of appointment of full-time school of law faculty.

Without limiting the authority of the board as conferred and defined by law to act in such matters upon its own motion, the following principles and rules shall govern the appointment and position status of school of law faculty:

(1) University school of law faculty shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president of the university. The appointment shall normally be for an initial period of one year, but the board may make the initial period longer than one year in appropriate circumstances, as determined by the board.

- (2) Unless the university has awarded tenure or a fixed-term contract, all appointments of full-time faculty are on an annual, temporary, or probationary basis, renewable each academic year at the discretion of the university.
- (3) Non-tenure-track law school faculty shall be subject to annual reappointment and shall receive annual notices of reappointment if their continued service is desired, except that the board may grant longer appointments for such faculty as set out in paragraphs (B)(4) and (B)(5) of this rule.
- (4) The board may grant fixed-term appointments longer than one year to NTTLS faculty. During the term of such appointments, these appointments may be terminated only for just cause related to the performance of the incumbent or for programmatic or economic reasons related to the characteristics of the position. Except as set out in paragraph (B)(5) below, these appointments create no expectation of reappointment, and the board may decline to reappoint an incumbent in its sole discretion.
- (5) The board may grant fixed-term appointments as set out in paragraph (B)(4) of this rule above with a presumption that the incumbent will be reappointed unless the incumbent's performance does not support reappointment or unless the position is terminated for programmatic or economic reasons. Such appointments do not constitute tenure and do not establish any of the rights or protections of tenure beyond the rights or protections described in these paragraphs (B)(4) and (B)(5) of this rule.
- (6) Upon appointment, every faculty member receives from the secretary <u>or assistant</u> <u>secretary</u> of the board of trustees a certificate or letter of appointment as tenured or tenure-track or non-tenure track law school faculty stating the rank or designation appropriate to the faculty member's status, annual salary or periodic salary if part-time, and length of appointment.
- (7) Academic year and vacations. The academic year begins on the first day of classes in the fall semester and continues through spring semester commencement. Fulltime law school faculty members on an academic year contract shall be expected to be on duty during fall and spring semesters, continuing through the date that grades are due, and shall be entitled to all academic vacations during that period, but shall not earn or accrue any other vacation credits. Full-time law school faculty and designated others with academic rank serving on a twelve-month contract shall have twenty-two days of vacation to be accrued and used in accordance with the vacation policy in rule 3359-11-03 of the Administrative Code.
- (C) Procedures for initial appointment of school of law faculty.
 - (1) The dean shall submit a request for a faculty position to the provost. This request shall include: a strategic rationale for the position; its relationship to the goals

and direction that the university is pursuing; a description of the duties and responsibilities of the position; and a suggested makeup of the search committee membership with a rationale that takes into account the areas of academic expertise of the suggested committee members with respect to the areas upon which the search is concentrated.

- (2) The provost (or designee) may seek further information or clarification from the dean. Approval of a position request may include modifications to the request, including the addition of committee members. If the provost gives his/her approval, the search committee shall be formed.
- (3) The search committee shall develop a search plan in conformity with legal requirements and university and school of law guidelines.
 - (a) The offices of the provost and human resources shall approve the plan or recommend changes as deemed appropriate. If changes to the search plan are recommended, representatives from these offices will communicate and discuss the changes with the search committee chair.
 - (b) The search committee shall execute the approved plan in conformity with legal requirements and university and school of law guidelines.
- (4) Approval of candidates.
 - (a) The process of initial appointment is defined as a deliberative process. Therefore, those eligible who do not participate in or attend the deliberations are not permitted to vote. The law school's guidelines may allow for absentee ballots in extenuating circumstances for persons who have been participants in the deliberations.
 - (b) After the completion of the interview process, the school of law faculty shall select by secret ballot candidates to recommend for appointment. A simple majority vote is required. The faculty should recommend more than one candidate in priority order.
 - (c) The search committee will generate a recommendation to the dean relaying the votes and ranking by the faculty as well as supporting evidence such as lists of perceived strengths and weaknesses of each candidate. In cases of appointment at advanced rank with or without tenure, the supporting evidence shall indicate how the candidates meet the rank/tenure criteria and reflect an additional positive vote by those in the school eligible to vote on said rank/tenure.
 - (d) The dean shall make a separate recommendation with regard to which candidates to recommend for appointment/rank/tenure, and both recommendations shall be forwarded to the provost by the dean.
 - (e) If the provost approves making offers to any of the candidates recommended for appointment, that information shall be transmitted to the dean.

Otherwise, the search will either be reopened, or declared failed, by the provost. If approval to make an offer to a candidate is granted, the candidate may be contacted by the dean and offered employment at the university pending approval of the board. The provost's approval of, and countersignature on, all letters of offer are required.

- (f) The appointment of faculty members is subject to the approval of the board. No officer, dean, committee, or other such entity shall have the authority to employ, set the compensation or other terms of employment except the board. All offers of employment shall be subject to this condition.
- (D) Reappointment and tenure.
 - (1) All full-time law school faculty are subject to annual reappointment following their initial appointment until any grant of tenure or long-term appointment, except that in their first year of service they shall not be reviewed for reappointment.
 - (2) Tenure-track faculty may receive indefinite tenure, according to the following provisions:
 - (a) Faculty on the tenure track may be granted indefinite tenure. That is, they may be appointed for an indefinite term without the necessity of reappointment each year. A faculty member on the tenure-track may be granted tenure not later than the end of the twelfth full semester of active service on the tenure track at the university subject to the conditions outlined in this rule.
 - (i) If tenure is granted, it shall be effective either at the beginning of the academic year of service after which the candidate was recommended for tenure, or as specified in the certificate of appointment issued by the board.
 - (ii) If at the end of six years (twelve semesters) in a tenure-track position, indefinite tenure has not been received, notice shall be given that employment terminates at the end of the seventh year of service.
 - (b) Full-time appointment for two semesters shall equal one year of active service. Summer sessions or leaves without compensation granted for onehalf or more of any semester may not be counted toward the probationary period for tenure. Leaves for professional development count toward the probationary period for tenure.
 - (c) A candidate's application for indefinite tenure shall normally be initiated during the tenth full semester of active service. For faculty starting at the beginning of the fall semester, the application will be made at the beginning of their eleventh semester.
 - (d) In cases where there are clearly extenuating circumstances, the probationary period may be extended by one year provided that the request is initiated by

the candidate, recommended by the dean, and approved by the provost.

- (e) Faculty must have U. S. citizenship or permanent residency to receive tenure. The university shall in good faith endeavor to petition for such status for those individuals who need it, and to extend the probationary period for those tenure candidates whose applications for permanent residency have not yet been approved.
- (f) Early tenure may be granted before the sixth year, contingent upon the candidate's successful completion of the following criteria:
 - (i) The candidate shall have completed at least two years of active service at the university before application for early tenure can be made.
 - (ii) The candidate must at least meet the minimum school of law criteria for tenure.
 - (iii) The school of law tenure committee shall vote to determine if the candidate may apply for early tenure. The decision of the tenure committee is final and cannot be appealed.
- (g) A candidate may apply for early tenure only once. Should early tenure be denied, the candidate shall be awarded reappointment for the next academic year, and shall complete the time remaining in the standard probationary period before making reapplication for tenure.
- (h) In exceptional circumstances, the board may grant indefinite tenure upon initial appointment to scholars who are nationally or internationally recognized and only upon the affirmative recommendation of the tenure committee and dean, the provost and the president.
- (i) Faculty who hold the rank of assistant professor may be awarded tenure only if they are granted promotion to associate professor at the same time.
- (j) Faculty who hold the rank of associate professor without tenure may seek and be awarded tenure without promotion.
- (3) Notification of appointment, reappointment, tenure, and promotion of faculty shall occur as follows:
 - (a) The board usually acts upon recommendations for appointment, reappointment, promotion, and the granting of indefinite tenure at its April meeting.
 - (b) Recommendations for appointment, reappointment, promotion, and the granting of indefinite tenure may be considered at other board meetings as appropriate.
 - (c) The appointment, reappointment, tenure, and promotion of faculty are subject to the approval of the board. No officer, dean, committee, or other such

entity shall have the authority to employ, set the compensation or other terms of employment except the board. All offers of employment shall be subject to this condition.

- (i) Following the board's approval, the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board shall send a certificate of appointment detailing the agreement reached between the faculty member and the university. It shall include an endorsement of acceptance that the faculty member shall sign and return to the secretary <u>or assistant secretary</u> of the board within the time period stipulated.
- (ii) In the event a faculty member adds or deletes terms to the certificate of appointment, or fails to sign or return the endorsement, the secretary <u>or</u> <u>assistant secretary</u> of the board shall submit the issue to the board at their next regular meeting for consideration of rescinding the certificate of appointment.
- (E) General considerations.
 - (1) The criteria to be considered for reappointment, tenure and promotion include but are not limited to:
 - (a) Quality of teaching.
 - (i) Effective instruction as evidenced by student and peer evaluations and by documented participation in assessment of learning outcomes. Quantitative data from university approved student evaluations of teaching are required.
 - (ii) Effective advising, as appropriate.
 - (iii) Appropriate curricular development.
 - (iv) Participation in activities related to accreditation.
 - (2) Quality of research and scholarly activity.
 - (a) Scholarship and/or creative activity as appropriate to the school of law including activities in the discipline and in the scholarship of teaching and learning.
 - (i) Publications.
 - (ii) Presentations, scholarly and creative.
 - (iii) Grant funding and/or development activity.
 - (b) Professional development.

- (c) Professional recognition.
- (3) Quality of service.
 - (a) To professional organizations, including leadership positions.
 - (b) To the university.
 - (c) To the college and/or department.
 - (d) Discipline related service to the community.
- (4) Professional conduct as defined in written standards including but not limited to the following:
 - (a) Sexual harassment policy of the university.
 - (b) Conflict of interest, conflict of commitment, scholarly misconduct, and ethical conduct policy of the university.
 - (c) Affirmative action policy of the university.
 - (d) Alcohol policy of the university.
 - (e) Drug-free workplace policy of the university.
 - (f) Adherence to the "Statement on Professional Ethics" as published by the American association of university professors.
 - (g) Other professional ethics policies as approved by the American association of university professors committee on professional ethics published by the American association of university professors.
 - (h) Disseminated codes of conduct and ethics as defined by relevant professional disciplines.
 - (i) Professional responsibilities as set out in university rules.
- (F) The law school shall develop individual criteria for reappointment, tenure, and promotion.
 - (1) The school of law guidelines shall be available in the office of the dean and the office of the provost.
 - (2) The guidelines shall comply with the applicable provisions of this rule.
 - (3) The guidelines shall enumerate the specific materials that are to be included in the candidate's reappointment, tenure, long-term appointment, and promotion file.
 - (4) The school of law guidelines shall enumerate clear and specific minimum criteria that a candidate must meet to be recommended for reappointment, tenure, long-

term appointment, or promotion. Such criteria may include both quantitative and/or qualitative criteria relevant to the school of law.

- (5) The school of law may permit promotion to associate professor before tenure. If so, the school of law guidelines shall enumerate clear and specific minimum criteria that a candidate must meet to be recommended for such a promotion. However, such a promotion to associate professor does not guarantee a subsequent recommendation for tenure.
- (6) The school of law guidelines shall enumerate clear and specific minimum criteria that clearly distinguish the requirements of the professor rank from those for obtaining tenure.
- (7) In case of conflict, the applicable provisions of this rule supersede school of law guidelines.
- (G) Approval of guidelines. Guidelines shall be approved before they can be applied to faculty members.
 - (1) The guidelines prepared by the school of law must be formally approved by at least two-thirds of its tenure track faculty.
 - (2) The school of law dean and the provost shall also formally approve the guidelines before they become effective.
 - (3) The guidelines shall include a process to review and, if necessary, revise them.
- (H) Candidate files shall include at least:
 - (1) A current vita;
 - (2) Narrative statement by the candidate addressing the meeting of university-wide and school of law criteria;
 - (3) A table of contents of materials included in the reappointment, tenure, and promotion (RTP) file, which shall be amended to reflect any additions or deletions to the RTP file;
 - (4) All previous reappointment, tenure, long-term appointment, and promotion recommendations;
 - (5) Quantitative evidence of work performance, including results of formal teaching evaluations, as well as additional materials required by school of law guidelines (such as peer evaluations of teaching or letters of support);

If required by school of law guidelines, qualitative evidence of work performance, which may include, for example, peer evaluation of teaching, written student evaluation comments (along with the rationale for the material included), letters of support for the candidate (along with provenance of such letters), etc., shall also be included;

- (6) Evidence of professional activity;
- (7) Evidence of service;
- (8) External review letters for tenure and promotion files.
- (I) RTP committees must have a quorum present in order to conduct business. For this purpose, a quorum is defined as two-thirds of the eligible members. In the case where there are fewer than six eligible members, a quorum is defined to be at least three members. The faculty of the school of law shall formulate procedures to add committee members from outside the school of law if there are fewer than three eligible faculty in the school of law to form the committee. These procedures shall be included in the RTP guidelines of the school of law.
- (J) The processes of RTP are deliberative. Eligible committee members who do not participate in or attend the deliberations shall not be permitted to vote.
 - (1) To be eligible to vote, a member shall review candidate-submitted materials and shall attend all committee meetings in which the candidate is discussed. Exceptions are as follows:
 - (a) The committee may, by a majority vote of members present, permit a member who has not attended all meetings, but who has otherwise substantially met the participation standards of the school of law, to vote on the candidate. The reason for the exception shall be included in the committee recommendation.
 - (b) The school of law guidelines may allow for absentee ballots in extenuating circumstances for persons who are otherwise eligible to vote. The committee may determine eligibility for an absentee ballot by a majority vote of members present and voting. Extenuating circumstances include death in the immediate family, serious illness, and inability to attend due to events beyond one's control. The nature of the extenuating circumstances and the vote shall be included in the committee recommendation.
 - (2) For the purposes of RTP for the faculty member, a simple majority vote in the affirmative, at the minimum, is necessary for adoption. School of law guidelines may specify additional requirements for a minimum affirmative vote beyond a simple majority. When there is a tie vote, the motion is rejected. While it is the duty of every member who has an opinion on a question to participate in these important deliberations, to arrive at an informed opinion, and to express it by his or her vote, he or she cannot be compelled to do so. He or she may prefer to abstain from voting, fully realizing that the effect is the same as if he or she voted on the prevailing side. Abstentions are not counted in the number of votes cast and are considered blank ballots. However, they are included in the report. For example, a vote of three positive, one negative and seven abstentions represents a seventy-five percent positive vote and would be reported: three positive, one negative, seven abstentions.

- (K) For purposes of any reappointment, tenure, long-term appointment, or promotion matter, all university employees shall comply with the university's conflict of interest policy and voluntarily remove themselves from any discussion, voting, or participation of any kind when the candidate is:
 - (1) A member of that faculty member's immediate family (e.g. spouse, son, daughter, or other family member residing in that family member's household).
 - (2) A member of that faculty member's extended family (e.g. siblings, parents, grandparents, cousins, uncles, aunts, or other next of kin).
 - (3) Any other person where there would exist the appearance of conflict of interest as defined by university rules.
- (L) "Robert's Rules of Order," in the most recent edition, shall be accepted as the authority on all questions of parliamentary procedure.

(M) Calendar of events.

- (2) In the event that the deadline for completion of a step cannot be met, a request for extension and supporting rationale shall be forwarded to the committee chair, school of law dean, or provost, as appropriate, prior to said deadline. The request and rationale shall be included in the candidate's file.
 - (a) The committee chair, dean, or provost shall accept or reject the request for extension within one week of its receipt. Rationale for the decision shall be included in the candidate's file.
 - (b) Extension of the deadline at any level does not automatically extend future deadlines.

(N) RTP procedures.

- (1) Candidates who are applying for reappointment, tenure, long-term appointment, or promotion to associate professor shall be evaluated under the school of law criteria in effect at the official date of appointment to the candidate's current position. If the criteria have been revised since the date of the initial appointment, the candidate shall have the option to choose the original or amended criteria under which he/she shall be reviewed. Once a choice is made, the candidate may not reverse his/her decision. However, the candidate may choose each time criteria are revised and are approved by the provost. It is the responsibility of the candidate to inform the committee in the letter of intent of the criteria set the candidate has elected to be used.
- (2) Candidates who are applying for promotion to professor shall be evaluated under the school of law criteria in effect either at the time of the candidate's last official promotion or the school of law criteria in effect five years prior to the candidate's application, whichever is more recent.
- (3) Composition of RTP committees: All tenured faculty of the school of law who have completed at least one year of service at the university, including those whose tenure has been approved by the board but whose tenure has not yet become effective, are eligible to serve on reappointment and tenure committees. Only those tenured and with rank above that of the candidate may serve on promotion committees. Distinguished professors are eligible to serve on all RTP committees.
- (4) A chairperson, or co-chairs if the committee chooses, shall be elected at the organizational meeting and shall serve for one year. If co-chairs are elected, the duties of the chair shall be divided between the co-chairs. In the remainder of this section, the term "committee chair" refers to the chair or co-chairs.
- (5) Committee members shall be responsible for the maintenance of minutes and the

documentation of the committee proceedings.

- (6) Persons within the college who are required to provide a separate recommendation for a specific candidate (e.g. school of law dean or his/her designees) cannot be a member of that candidate's committee, but may, at the committee's request, attend for informational purposes.
- (7) All committee members must review the file and participate in deliberations on each candidate in order to be eligible to vote.
- (O) Duties and responsibilities of the RTP committee.
 - (1) The RTP committees shall review the qualifications of any faculty member of the school of law who has requested reappointment, tenure and/or promotion and shall make recommendations to the school of law dean regarding the granting or denial of the request.
 - (2) The recommendations shall include documentation of the committee's procedures, a report of the vote, and an explanation of the application of the criteria as established in this rule and the school of law guidelines.
 - (3) The recommendation letter shall be reviewed and approved by the committee before dissemination. Minority reports are not permitted.
- (P) Duties and responsibilities of the dean.
 - (1) The dean shall evaluate all previous recommendations and materials from the candidate's RTP file to formulate his/her own recommendation.
 - (2) If the dean's recommendation differs from that of the RTP committee, the dean shall discuss his/her recommendation with the RTP committee.
 - (3) If procedural error or inadequate consideration is identified at any level, the dean shall act to correct the problem.
- (Q) Process for RTP of tenure track faculty members.
 - (1) The dean shall call an organizational meeting to elect appropriate committee chairs and send out notifications to candidates per the timelines above.
 - (2) Faculty in their first year of service shall not be reviewed for reappointment.
 - (3) Eligible candidates shall submit to the dean a letter of intent to apply for reappointment, tenure and/or promotion per the timelines above. Those applying for tenure and/or promotion shall also submit external review materials and a list of at least three potential reviewers with the letter of intent. These individuals shall have no perceived conflict of interest, as defined by university rules.
 - (4) The candidate may withdraw his/her application at any time by submitting a letter to the dean. The dean shall inform all committee members involved in the candidate's RTP review up to that point in time that the application has been

withdrawn, and shall retrieve the candidate's file and return it to him/her. External review letters shall be sealed and kept by the school of law dean, and may be used within two years as part of a subsequent application if the candidate and the RTP committee agree.

- (5) Each candidate eligible for reappointment, tenure and/or promotion shall submit his/her RTP file to the appropriate committee chair per the timelines above.
 - (a) The committee chair shall notify the candidate, all committee members, and the dean of the location and availability of the candidate's file.
 - (b) The committee chair shall notify the candidate, all committee members, and the dean of any additions to the RTP file. The table of contents shall be amended to reflect any additions.
 - (c) With the exception of the recommendation letters which are a result of the deliberative process, only the candidate can make additions and/or deletions to the file. Deletions shall be limited to materials submitted by the candidate. The candidate shall amend the table of contents to reflect any additions and/or deletions.
 - (d) To maintain a quality standard relative to comparable law programs, review of scholarly publications and/or creative activities, external to the university, is required for tenure and/or promotion.
 - (i) The school of law shall develop instructions for the external reviewer including the materials and bases by which the materials shall be assessed. These instructions will be included in the RTP guidelines of the school.
 - (ii) A pool of potential reviewers sufficient to guarantee three letters of external review shall be created. The candidate, the RTP committee, and/or the dean may provide names of potential reviewers. The candidate shall be apprised of the full list of names considered by the committee.
 - (*a*) It is expected that reviewers will ordinarily be from academic institutions and;
 - (*i*) Shall be at or above the requested rank of the candidate;
 - (*ii*) Shall be from institutions that are comparable in the discipline.
 - (*b*) Reviewers with expertise appropriate to address the candidate's meeting of the school of law criteria may be from other reputable external organizations relevant to the discipline, for example, from industry, business, or government.
 - (c) Reviewers shall not be current or former students of the candidate, shall not be a current or former employee of the university, and shall

not have any perceived conflict of interest, as defined by university rules.

- (iii) The committee, with the approval of the dean, shall select the initial set of reviewers to be solicited, at least one-third of which shall be from the candidate's list.
- (iv) If the initial set of reviewers does not yield a sufficient number of responses, the committee shall select subsequent sets of reviewers as needed. These sets may or may not include reviewers from the candidate's list. The committee may consult with the candidate to select these additional reviewers, if it so desires. The dean must approve each subsequent set before the committee may contact the potential reviewers.
- (v) Once a set of reviewers has been approved, the committee chair shall contact the reviewers to request review letters bearing the reviewer's affiliation and signature; this contact may include offers of honoraria. These reviews shall not be questionnaires or surveys, but in the form of letters.
- (vi) At least three reviews shall be required. The file shall not be considered complete and shall not go forward until three letters of external review have been included. If three reviews have not been received by Wednesday of week eleven of the fall semester, the dean may permit the file to go forward if compelling circumstances, documented by the committee chair, justify the absence of any of the external reviews.
- (vii) The committee shall include copies of the text of all requested and received external reviews in the candidate's file.
 - (a) The identity of the external reviewers and the review letters shall be deemed by the university and the candidate as confidential to the extent permitted by law. No letters of recommendation submitted by university personnel as part of the candidate's RTP process shall identify the names or affiliations of the external reviewers. In addition, any quotations from external review letters used in any university recommendation letter shall be carefully chosen or redacted so as to not identify the names or affiliations of the external reviewers.
 - (b) The reviewer shall be apprised that the review may be subject to disclosure under such circumstances including but not limited to subpoena, validly issued court order, or public records request.
- (e) The candidate shall provide all materials relevant to external review as determined by the school of law guidelines to the chair of the tenure and/or promotion committee per the timelines above.

- (6) The RTP committee chair shall convene all meetings, other than the organizational meeting referred to in the timelines above, and preside at these meetings.
- (7) The RTP committee chair shall invite the candidate to meet with the committee before the recommendation is made.
- (8) The RTP committee chair shall inform the candidate in writing of the committee's recommendation per the timelines above. Reappointment letters shall include a statement of how the candidate can enhance performance toward meeting the goal of tenure and promotion.
- (9) The RTP committee chair shall transmit copies of the committee's recommendations and the candidate's RTP file to the school of law dean per the timelines above.
- (10) The dean shall transmit his/her recommendation to the provost along with the candidate's RTP file per the timelines above with a copy to the candidate, and the relevant committee chair.
- (11) The provost shall transmit his/her recommendation to the candidate per the timelines above with a copy to the dean and chair of the committee involved in the candidate's review process. The RTP file shall then be returned to the dean, where external review letters shall be removed and stored as part of the candidate's permanent personnel record before the RTP file is returned to the candidate.
- (12) The provost shall transmit his/her positive recommendations to the president. If the president concurs, these recommendations are forwarded to the board for consideration, usually at the April board meeting.
- (R) In all cases, the candidate may appeal an adverse decision from the RTP committee, the dean, or the senior vice president and provost to the university faculty rights and responsibilities committee.
 - (1) During any appeal process, the candidate may appeal only once to the university faculty rights and responsibilities committee. For example, should the candidate appeal the decision of the dean to the university faculty rights and responsibilities committee, he/she cannot then appeal the decision of the senior vice president and provost.
 - (2) The university faculty rights and responsibilities committee shall follow its own procedures found in rule 3359-20-03.6 of the Administrative Code.
 - (3) Within two weeks of its final action, the university faculty rights and responsibilities committee shall forward any findings and recommendations to the administrative officer issuing the adverse recommendation under appeal with copies to the candidate.
 - (4) The president of the university is the candidate's last point of institutional appeal

and shall inform all parties of his/her decision within thirty days from receipt of any appeal.

- (5) In the case of a violation of the procedures, it is not intended that appointment, reappointment, promotion or tenure be awarded by default.
- (S) Distinguished professor.
 - (1) The title of distinguished professor shall be awarded only to one already at the rank of professor at the university for five or more years. The title of distinguished professor is an honor recognizing a career that demonstrates substantial professional accomplishments.
 - (a) The school of law shall develop criteria for distinguished professor including those expressed below in this section. Such criteria cannot be implemented without approval by both the dean and the provost.
 - (b) The nominee shall excel in teaching in the school of law at a level significantly beyond the current expectations for the rank of professor.
 - (c) The nominee shall excel in scholarly activity (pedagogical or discipline specific) in the school of law at a level significantly beyond the current expectations for the rank of professor.
 - (d) The nominee shall have made sufficient contributions to the discipline to be nationally recognized.
 - (2) Nominations for distinguished professor shall be made by tenured or tenure-track members in the school of law. The nomination shall be submitted to the tenured faculty of the school for review and recommendation.
 - (a) Upon receiving a nomination the dean call a meeting of the tenured members, excluding the nominee, to form the school of law distinguished professor review committee. The committee shall consist of all tenured professors. If there are not at least three tenured professors then tenure-track faculty shall be added to the committee in order of seniority (years of service at the school of law) until there are three committee members. If there are several tenure track faculty with equal seniority whose addition to the committee would raise the membership above three, then names shall be chosen by lot to add to the committee so that the total membership does not exceed three. The committee shall elect a chair from among its members.
 - (b) The committee shall review the nomination and submit its recommendation positive or negative to the dean, with a copy to the nominee. A simple majority of those voting is required for a positive recommendation.
 - (c) The nominee shall have the right to submit clarifications to the letters, to be included in the application. If the nominee wishes, his/her nomination can be withdrawn at this stage.

- (3) The nominee shall provide his/her file to this committee, which shall include:
 - (a) Current vita;
 - (b) Narrative statement of qualifications;
 - (c) Supporting documentation which may include letters of support solicited by the nominee;
 - (d) A proposed list of external reviewers, with at least six entries;
 - (e) School of law criteria for distinguished professor;
 - (f) Letters of recommendation by the dean shall include a summary of how the candidate meets the criteria for the title of distinguished professor;
 - (g) External letters of recommendation:

The committee shall request at least six external letters of recommendation from a list of external nationally recognized individuals in their discipline, including at least two from the nominee's list. The dean may add other references if they so wish.

- (i) The list shall include the credentials of the potential reviewers and his/her relationship to the candidate. The list will include all names provided by the nominee as well as any that the school of law tenured faculty and dean provide.
- (ii) Letters of request shall include:
 - (a) School of law criteria for the title of distinguished professor;
 - (b) Request that the reviewer address the context of the candidate's work as it relates to the discipline;
 - (c) Candidate's vita and narrative statement;
 - (*d*) Due date.
- (4) Procedures of the school of law distinguished professor recommendation committee shall be determined by the committee and shall include the following:
 - (a) The committee shall consider each candidate individually;
 - (b) Following discussion and deliberation of the individual candidate, the committee shall vote;
 - (c) If a two-thirds majority of the review committee votes favorably, it shall forward the recommendation to the provost. Otherwise, the file is returned to the nominee with a statement indicating the rationale for the rejection;
 - (d) The committee shall forward its positive recommendations to the provost by

April first.

- (5) Procedures of the school of law distinguished professor recommendation committee may include, but are not limited to the following:
 - (a) The committee may interview the dean;
 - (b) The committee may interview the candidate;
 - (c) The provost shall forward each recommendation, with his/her recommendation, to the president. If the president approves, the recommendation is forwarded to the board for consideration at the next board meeting. Once approved by the board, the title becomes effective at the beginning of the following fall semester;
 - (d) The successful candidate(s) shall be recognized by the university community at an appropriate public event.
- (6) A compensatory award shall be added to the successful nominee's base salary.

Revisions to University Rule 3359-20-03.10 Guidelines for initial appointment, reappointment, tenure, and promotion of full-time faculty in the school of law

BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendation presented by the Rules Committee on

August 12, 2015, to revise Rule 3359-20-03.10 authorizing the Assistant Secretary, in addition to the Secretary, to sign a certificate or letter of appointment for tenured or tenure-track or non-tenure track law school faculty on behalf and in the name of the University and the Board by the Chairperson of the Board and/or the President of the University, and perform other duties related to processing certificates of appointment, be approved.

3359-22-01 Contract professional information.

(A) Contract professionals. Contract professionals are full-time or part-time non-teaching professional personnel of the university to whom the board of trustees, on the recommendation of the administration, grants recognition and benefits. Contract professionals may be appointed as instructional professional staff if their responsibilities involve instructional or academic support functions or administrative professional staff if their responsibilities are business/administrative in nature. Any contract professional originally appointed to this category prior to July 1, 1986 shall be designated as a member of the general faculty as long as the person continues in such positions. Contract professionals do not hold regular faculty rank (e.g., instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, professor). The minimum requirement for this employment category is a baccalaureate degree.

(B) Appointments.

- (1) The president recommends to the board all contract professional appointments. Contract professionals are generally appointed under contracts which have a beginning date, but do not generally include a specific end date. Contract professionals are not eligible for indefinite tenure.
- (2) Upon appointment, each contract professional receives from the secretary <u>or assistant</u> <u>secretary</u> of the board a certificate or letter of appointment, stating the annual salary or periodic salary if part-time, and, only if applicable, the length or end date of appointment.
- (C) Separation from employment without cause. The procedure to be followed in the separation from employment of contract professionals without cause shall be as follows:
 - (1) If a contract professional, other than contract professionals in the department of athletics classified as "coach," is to be separated from employment without cause, the immediate supervisor shall notify said contract professional in writing not later than:
 - (a) Three months prior to the date of separation during the contract professional's initial two years of continuous employment with the university of Akron, or
 - (b) Six months prior to the date of separation in the event the contract professional has served more than two years of continuous employment with the university of Akron.
 - (c) If a contract professional in the department of athletics classified as "coach" is to be separated from employment without cause, the immediate supervisor shall notify said contract professional in writing not later than three months prior to the date of separation. For the purposes of this rule, "coach" will include those

contract professionals classified as a coach and contract professionals positions that are directly related to an athletic team as determined by the director of athletics. For coaches who are currently employed pursuant to a one-year contract, this rule will not apply until their current contract term expires.

- (d) Contract professionals, including coaches, who have individual employment agreements are not affected by these provisions.
- (2) If the contract professional believes that the separation from employment without cause constitutes a deprivation of a "liberty interest" or a "property interest" protected by the due process clause of the United States Constitution, the contract professional shall be afforded a hearing. In the event the contract professional believes the separation from employment without cause constitutes a deprivation of a "liberty interest," the contract professional shall be provided a name-clearing hearing before the board of trustees. In the event the contract professional believes the separation from employment without cause constitutes a deprivation of a "property interest," the contract professional shall be provided a hearing before the president of the university or the president's designee, provided the contract professional shall submit to the president a request for a hearing in writing within ten days after the contract professional shall be notified of the date, time, and procedures for the hearing. Any further action by the contract professional to initiate the name-clearing hearing must be in accordance with the contract professional grievance procedure.
- (D) Termination of appointment for cause. The appointment of a contract professional may be terminated for cause at any time upon the recommendation of the president and approval by the board of trustees.

Prior to the president's recommendation to the board of trustees, the contract professional shall be advised by the immediate supervisor or appropriate administrative officer in writing of the supervisor's (or administrative officer's) decision to recommend to the president the contract professional's dismissal for cause not less than thirty days prior to the effective date of such dismissal, except in case of conduct involving moral turpitude or public safety. The contract professional may have a hearing on the reason for termination before the president, provided the contract professional shall submit to the president a request for a hearing in writing within ten days after the contract professional's notification of termination. Upon the president's receipt of such request, the contract professional shall be notified of the date, time, and procedures for the hearing.

In the case of conduct involving moral turpitude or public safety, the contract professional shall be immediately placed on administrative leave with pay, pending the president's recommendation and action by the board of trustees.

Whether or not the president upholds or denies the recommendation of the immediate supervisor or appropriate administrative officer to recommend termination, the contract professional shall be afforded the right to a name-clearing hearing. Any action by the contract professional to initiate the name-clearing hearing shall be in accordance with the contract professional grievance procedure.

For purposes of this rule, "days" shall include only regular business days, Monday through Friday, during which the university is open for business, and shall not include holidays.

- (E) Resignation. A contract professional who proposes to resign from the university of Akron should give sufficient notice to obviate serious embarrassment and difficulty to the university in filling the position. The length of time may vary with the circumstances of the particular situation, but a contract professional should give at least four months' notice.
- (F) Vacation. Contract professionals on annual appointment are entitled to one hundred seventy-six hours of vacation at a time approved by the president or the president's designee (see rule 3359-11-03 of the Administrative Code).
- (G) Leave of absence. Leaves of absence without compensation may be granted by the board upon recommendation of the president. Leaves of absence without compensation for the purpose of career development will be considered on an individual basis, considering the value of the experience to the individual and to the institution and the capabilities of the individual's department to manage the individual's responsibilities during the absence.
- (H) Retirement.
 - (1) Contract professionals shall not be involuntarily retired from the university based on age except in the following cases:
 - (a) Those employees who qualify as executive or high policy-making employees, as defined by law, shall continue to be involuntarily retired at age sixty-five.
 - (b) Law enforcement officers and fire fighters shall be involuntarily retired not later than age sixty-five or at an earlier date, in the event an individual's physical and mental fitness contraindicates the ability and competency to perform the requirements of the job.
 - (2) Any contract professional who proposes to retire from the university of Akron should give notice early enough to avoid serious interruption to the university operation, the length of time necessarily varying from the circumstances of the contract professional's particular case, but the minimum time should be four months before termination of employment.
