




The Economics of Healthcare in Ohio: Smarter Choices for a Stronger Future



KEYNOTE SPEAKER & PANELIST

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Dr. Jason Abaluck is a Professor of Economics at the Yale School of Management and a Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research. He has been on the Yale faculty since 2012. He received his Ph.D. in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 2011, after earning a bachelor's degree in economics from Harvard University in 2006.

Professor Abaluck's research studies how consumers and firms make decisions in complex environments with imperfect information, and how policy can be designed to improve those decisions. Much of his work focuses on health care, including how individuals choose health insurance plans, prescription drugs, and foods, and how providers make testing and treatment decisions. His research quantifies the welfare impacts of policies such as information provision, quality incentives, and improved defaults, and includes large-scale field experiments on topics ranging from masking to health insurance decision support.

His work has been published in leading academic journals, including *Science*, the *American Economic Review*, and the *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, as well as in outlets such as *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post*. His research has received numerous honors, including the National Institute for Health Care Management Award for Best Paper in Health Economics and a Top 10 Clinical Research Award from the National Clinical Research Forum.



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
