

## Middle Level Education (Grades 4-9) Language Arts & Science Dual Licensure with Intervention Specialist 520310BS

The following information is intended only as a supplemental guide. Official degree requirements are established at the time of transfer and admission to the degree-granting college. Students should refer to the **Degree Progress Report** (**DPR**) which is definitive for graduation requirements. Completion of this degree within the identified time frame below is contingent upon many factors, including but not limited to: class availability, total number of required credits, work schedule, finances, family, course drops/withdrawals, successfully passing courses, prerequisites, among others.

\*Preadmission Courses – Completion of these courses (\*) is required for admission into the School of Education. A minimum 2.5 GPA is required in the preadmission coursework and a cumulative GPA of 2.5, including transfer work, is required for admission. Students must be admitted into the BCAS LBJFF School of Education in order to take many of the Professional Education, Literacy Core, and Content Specific courses.

## NOTES:

- a. English Comp I (ENGL 111) and English Comp II (ENGL 112) are the recommended classes to the meet the General Education Writing requirement. English (2020:121) can be used to fulfill the English Composition I requirement and Technical Report Writing (ENGL 222) can be used to fulfill the English Composition II requirement. C or higher grade required for admission to the School.
- b. Natural Science Requirement: Seven credits of Natural Science are required for general education and preadmission. One course <u>must</u> include a lab section. A variety of science courses are offered; see Gen Ed Guide and/or Degree Progress Report (DPR) for course options.

- **c. Social Science Requirement:** 6 credits of Social Science are required for General Education and preadmission. see Gen Ed Guide and/or Degree Progress Report (DPR) for course options.
- **d.** Placement for a Math/Stats/Logic course is determined through academic advisor. Eligibility for math courses is determined via placement test score, ACT and/or SAT-R scores, AP scores, or prior college level courses.
- e. The Student Teaching experience is considered full time teaching and is to be taken in the last semester of the program. Due to the nature of this experience students are not permitted to take other courses other than what is recommended in the last semester as listed above. - **f. FBI/BCI:** Certain education courses require BCI and FBI background checks which are used by area schools for placement made during the day. The Ohio Department of Education maintains a list of criminal convictions that disgualify applicants for a state educator license.

g. 42 credits of Teaching Field Content courses required. A 2.5 gpa is required in teaching content coursework. A variety of courses count for content requirements; see DPR for options. Please note that some courses require prerequisites and some courses will also double dip with General Education requirements.

<u>NOTE:</u> This 4-year plan assumes students will take additional credits during summers to fulfill the requirements, unless credits can be used from High School (AP credit, CCP, etc).

NOTE: ALL Education and Literacy courses REQUIRE a C or better grade in order to student teach and graduate.

Ohio Assessments for Educators and edTPA: For state of Ohio Teacher Licensure, candidates must pass all required state examinations.
