What is the Hower House Museum?

ower House, a stately 28-room Victorian mansion, was built in 1871 by Akron industrialist John Henry Hower and his wife, Susan Youngker Hower.

They brought their family to
Akron on the heels of the Civil
War with a dream to expand
their fortunes and lead the
fledgling town into the
bourgeoning industrial age,
regionally, nationally, and ultimately
internationally. John Henry Hower would
become known as the "father of Akron
industry" because of his vision.

The Hower family, always engaged and generous to their community, lived in the home

for three generations, filling it with treasures collected during their extensive world travels. Their legacy is a wealth of elegant and eclectic furnishings, along with detailed accounts of



their travels, family, business and social life.

The Hower House Museum has become an educational resource in the areas of Victorian culture, decorative arts, textile conservation, architectural history, and museum practices for students of all ages.


The Hower family deeded the House to The University of Akron in 1970. The structure, significant architecturally and historically, was opened to the public as an house museum in the mid-1980s.

I t continues to be a treasure for the Akron community and the Northeast Ohio region providing a tangible link to its storied past.
