BRIEF HISTORY OF UA

- Founded as Buchtel College in 1870 by Ohio Universalist Convention, including industrialist John R. Buchtel
- Buchtel College trustees transferred the institution and its assets to the city of Akron in 1913, name changed to The University of Akron in 1926
- World's first courses in rubber chemistry offered beginning in 1909. The Rubber Technical Institute is established in 1942
- In 1967 transitioned from municipal to state university
- · A campus enhancement program in the 2000s resulted in 22 new buildings and 34 acres of new green space added to the now 218acre campus
- Celebrated 150th anniversary in 2020
