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Course Selection and Planning Worksheet

You need to take 24 credits of IP Courses selected from the courses listed below and earn a 2.3 or higher cumulative GPA in those courses.

Twelve of those credits “count double” toward your JD and LLM, meaning that you need only take 12 additional credits, as follows:

1. General IP Education:

You should learn about as many fields of IP law as you can. Therefore, we require you to take **either** Fundamentals of IP Law (a survey course covering all major forms of IP law) **OR** at least 2 of the 4 core IP courses:
