- iii) What about contract professionals who are currently teaching and have been teaching credit courses during the day and have been receiving extra compensation for this teaching.... will they need to forfeit doing this?
- iv) What if a contract professional is asked to teach a credit course and they do not feel qualified or feel that their workload is already too heavy to add a teaching load to it..... can they decline the request or are they mandated to teach it if asked to by the office of academic affairs or their supervisor?
- v) What about contract professionals who have bachelor degrees versus those who have masters or doctorates. Can all be asked to teach? Several contract professionals have said that they can't be asked to teach since they only have bachelor degrees and all faculty must have masters degrees to teach at UA Wayne College.
- vi) What about teaching in the evening after 5:00 p.m. or on the weekend? Is the contract professional able to be paid an adjunct teaching rate if the course time falls outside their regular work hours?
