If a student enters with relevant graduate coursework from an accredited college or university, some of these credits may be transferred to fulfill CPP requirements. Such transfers typically involve substantial numbers of credit hours for students entering with a master’s degree (up to 30 credits from a single master’s program) and are rarer for other students. Approval for requests that such coursework be used to fulfill program requirements rests with the student’s advisor and, for required counseling psychology coursework, the instructor of the equivalent course at The University of Akron. Program costs & financial aid

University support for CPP students is generally very strong and typically all CPP graduate students receive full tuition waivers as part of a graduate assistantship package. These tuition waivers cover tuition for up to 15 credit hours, and other fees are the responsibility of the student and may vary each semester.

In 2023-2024, 100% of the CPP students who were enrolled in program-related courses (i.e., not students enrolled only in a single dissertation credit) on campus received an assistantship and a full tuition waiver. The value of the assistantship package ranged from \$12,600 to \$14,000 plus the tuition waiver for a nine-month appointment. These assistantships typically involve teaching or teaching related activities. They usually require 20 hours of work per week. Students who complete their coursework and internship but who have not yet completed the dissertation are required by the Graduate School to enroll for 1 credit hour each Fall and Spring semester until graduation and the cost for these credits is out of pocket.

2024-2025 tuition and fee rates for graduate students are calculated on a per credit hour basis. The table below details these estimated costs.

Note: There is a \$236 parking/transportation fee per semester. The \$100 per credit hour fee includes fees for general service, facilities, transportation, the library, career advantage (e.g., internships), and administrative.

Admission & attrition rates

Typically, 4-5 new doctoral students are admitted each year from a pool of 60 to 70 applications.

The attrition data for the last ten student cohorts is presented in the table below. On average, we have approximately 6% of students who leave the program without completing their Ph.D. degree. Quite often, these are students who enter with a bachelor's degree and who leave after completing their Master's degree due to a change in career plans. Other students leave for familial responsibilities/pressures. During the past ten years, one student left the program for academic reasons.
