Also, here's the instructions I gave my students. Hope they work!!

Here's what to do:

1. Go to Rethinking Race calendar website: <https://www.uakron.edu/race/calendar/>
2. Follow directions to sign up for the event you want to attend
3. You will receive a notice indicating that you've registered
4. The day before the event, you will receive an email with the event link (if virtual); if you do not, contact the person listed as the contact on the calendar
5. Five to 10 minutes before the event starts, click on the event link (if virtual) to join. (Early is best in case you have technical issues)
6. Remember to come up with proof of attendance; maybe a selfie?
7. Write a one-page reflective paper. The assignment (which you should read before you attend) with the questions to answer is posted in Assignments. Due date: March 7 at 11:59 pm (Again, don't procrastinate; write the paper as quickly as possible after the event. You'll do a better job!)
8. You can attend an extra event (and write an abbreviated paper) for 10 points extra credit. There's a folder for EC Rethinking Race.
