School of Social Work

S.W.I.F.T. AT WAYNE CAMPUS

The student social work organization, S.W.I.F.T., held two separate fundraisers in the fall semester to support their efforts in completing community projects and earned just over \$700. A portion of the proceeds went to support the SSWL organizations efforts to assist a struggling family at Christmas and towards the Sock Drive.

The students have two upcoming events in March. On March 25th, S.W.I.F.T. will hold its second annual Backpack Dash, a 5k run/walk to benefit Orrville city schools. Proceeds will be used to purchase school supplies for area students in need.

MSW PROGRAM AT WAYNE CAMPUS

The University of Akron MSW Program at the Wayne Campus began last year with a cohort of ten students that will be graduating this May! We prepare students for advanced practice social work through a convenient evening program with full-time, part-time, and advanced standing options in both micro and macro practice. We offer smaller class sizes in a comfortable learning environment along with access to state-of-the-art technology and library resources. Students have expressed their satisfaction with the MSW program in Orrville, Ohio, as they do not have to travel to Akron for any of their classes. This has allowed the University to reach students in the more remote areas of Ohio and to provide them a user-friendly way to advance their education. The MSW program is a CSWE-accredited program and applications are coming in now for the next cohort. We are anticipating great things in social work education here at the Wayne Campus!

BA/BASW PROGRAM AT LAKEWOOD CAMPUS

The opportunity to earn a BA or BASW is available at the UA Lakewood campus. We are a small, intimate campus located in the heart of Lakewood at 14725 Detroit Avenue. The majority of our students transfer from Tri-C or LCCC to complete their four-year degree and a major in social work. We offer all the coursework required to major in social work on our campus. Classes are in the evenings from 4 pm – 9:50 pm. We are only in the second year of offering an undergraduate option in social work at this location. We have grown from 10 students in the first cohort to 20 students in the current cohort. We hope to add options in the future for flexibility in start dates and class times. We are particularly proud of having a diverse group of students who bring enthusiasm and passion to the program!

UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

Ohio's Child Welfare University Partnership Program (UPP) was established in 2002 as a collaboration among the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS), the Institute for Human Services (IHS), the Public Children Services Association of Ohio (PCSAO), and the schools of social work at the participating universities. The program is funded by Title IV E training dollars. Ohio's program follows the design put in place in several states to address the following types of challenges for public child welfare retention: the need to professionalize the workforce, difficulties recruiting and retention, the need to reduce turnover, to minimize expenditures in time and dollars for training new workers. Each year, a minimum of 7 and a maximum of 11 (majority BSW and 2 MSW) may apply for admission to the program. Among the requirements, students must take two child welfare elective courses and complete a year field placement in a public child welfare agency. After successfully graduating from the program, students must obtain employment within 180 days after graduation and commit to work for 1 year in a public child welfare agency. Once hired, students receive up to a \$5,000 work incentive.

CBT INITIATIVE

Following a semester of learning the basics of Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT), graduate students interested in clinical social work began a second semester of study in an advanced CBT course that focuses on transdiagnostic mechanisms and interventions as well as third-wave CBTs, with an emphasis on mindfulness. The School of Social Work field liaisons ensure that students have an opportunity to apply what they are learning in class through collaboration with the field instructors at the clinical sites who have expertise in these evidence-based treatments. Due to the school's presence on three campuses (Akron, Lakewood, and Wayne), students have an opportunity to choose from placements in a five-county area. This CBT Initiative is in part sponsored through a grant with NEOMED.

CUYAHOGA COUNTY CONFERENCE

The MSW Social Welfare Policy II students will be attending the Cuyahoga County Conference on Social Welfare on May 16, 2017.

- Ensure students can develop a well-rounded and scholarly background in how to identify, advocate for, and treat persons with substance use issues.
- Ensure students graduate with the kind of marketable skills that are much needed across our communities.

Undergrad options offer students the opportunity to augment their degree with a Basic Addictions Services Certificate, an Advanced Addictions Services Certificate, or even a Minor in Addictions Studies. Our graduate program has recently received accreditation by the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board. Only three Ohio Institutions have this distinction. For more

Patient Centered Care at the School of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology

Interprofessional Practice: In an effort to improve patient outcomes and the quality of services, a team of professionals in The School of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology created an interprofessional clinic designed to serve individuals with complex communication needs. The patients are diagnosed with an array of neurogenic and/or developmental disabilities, e.g., Down syndrome, autism, cerebral palsy, aphasia, and apraxia, and these disabilities negatively affect their ability to communicate independently. The clinic enables a team of professionals to work together to address patients' communication, fine motor skills, and audiological needs, and then develop an individualized plan of care.

Interprofessional Education: Graduate students in speech-language pathology and audiology participate in this clinic, learning from each other about communication disorders and hearing loss. They also learn from the occupational therapist about fine motor difficulties and how these difficulties affect the patients. Over time, graduate students see firsthand how a team of professionals work together to provide high-quality care to an underserved population.

Outcomes: Through this clinic, we have been able to diagnosis previously unknown hearing loss and procure state of the art speech-generating devices for patients. Graduate students learn assessment techniques from the speech-language pathologist, audiologist, and occupational therapist. Students learn to function as a team, develop leadership skills, and collaborate with professionals to ensure goal-driven and effective patient outcomes.

We encourage professionals from other disciplines to offer support if their area(s) of expertise may provide additional benefit for this patient population.
