# The University of Akron 2018-19 University Council Satisfaction Survey Report September 2, 2019

#### **Summary:**

The University Council Satisfaction Survey was distributed to University Council, Standing Committee and Ad Hoc Committee members on August 16, 2019. Survey responses were anonymous.

There were 99 University Council, Standing Committee and Ad Hoc Committee members at the time the survey was distributed. The University Council Executive Committee received 44 responses for a response rate of 44%.

Thirty-four respondents were Standing Committee members, thirteen respondents were University Council members (25-member group) and ten respondents were Ad Hoc Committee members. Of those respondents, five served on University Council and a Standing Committee; three served on University Council, a Standing Committee and an Ad Hoc Committee; two served on a Standing Committee and an Ad Hoc Committee; and one served on University Council and an Ad Hoc Committee.

For the question, "Standing Committees that I have <u>not</u> served on have been focused on their goals during the 2017-18 University Council year (Sept. 1, 2018 – Aug. 30, 2019)," 24 respondents said they didn't know, 12 said standing committees have been very focused on their goals, 6 said they have been somewhat focused, and 2 said they have not at all been focused (page 2).

For the question, "Standing Committees that I have served on have been focused on their goals during the 2018-19 University Council year (Sept. 1, 2018 – Aug. 30, 2019)," 32 respondents said their standing committee has been very focused, 4 said it has been somewhat focused, 0 said it has not at all been focused, and 8 respondents did not serve on a standing committee (page 3).


For the question, "The Awards, Human Development and Textbook ad hoc committees have been productive during the 2018-19 University Council year (Sept. 1, 2018 – Aug. 30, 2019)," 20 respondents said they didn't know, 12 respondents said very productive, 10 said somewhat productive, and 1 said not at all productive (page 5).

For the question, "University Council has been productive during the 2018-19 University Council year (25 member group, led by Phil Allen)," 16 respondents said UC has been somewhat productive, 13 said it has been very productive, 10 said they didn't know, and 5 said it has not at all been productive (page 6).


For open-ended questions, responses were organized into the following categories: attendance, goals/priorities, meeting structure, membership, operations, and other (pages 3-9).


#### I am a member of: (please mark all that apply)





Also related to budgets - we have to get this information at least a day in advance of the vote. I don't think we should be voting for or against endorsing something so important without having had time to digest it and bring questions to the meeting.
